A PROCLAMATION.

AMENDING THE PROVISIONS OF THE COINAGE ACT, 1870, AS APPLIED TO CERTAIN BRITISH POSSESSIONS.

GEORGE R.

Whereas an Order in Council was made on the 3rd day of February, 1898, approving a Proclamation (hereinafter called the Proclamation of 1898) which applied certain provisions of the Coinage Act, 1870, as amended, to the territories therein named:

And whereas under Section 11 of the said Act We have power, with the advice of Our Privy Council, to alter any Proclamation previously made:

We, therefore, in pursuance of the said Act and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, proclaim, direct and ordain as follows:—

1. Section 5 of the Coinage Act, 1870, as applied by the Proclamation of 1898, is amended by inserting after the words "except by the Mint" the words "or as authorised by the law of a British Possession".

2. Section 6 of the Coinage Act, 1870, as so applied, is amended by adding at the end thereof the words "or according to coins which are made current and legal tender by the legislature of that Possession".

3. This Proclamation shall come into force forthwith.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace this Thirteenth day of November, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and forty-seven, and in the Eleventh year of Our Reign.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 9th day of October, 1947, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the

ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the church and cure (hereinafter called 'the said benefice') of Chew Stoke in the diocese of Bath and Wells:

"Whereas we are satisfied that Lettice Mary Miller of Brently, Romsey in the county of Hants, Married Woman, and Algernon Montagu Wyatt of Cheltenham in the county of Gloucester, Solicitor, are the patrons or persons entitled to present or nominate to the said benefice in case the same were now vacant:

"And whereas the said Lettice Mary Miller and Algernon Montagu Wyatt desire to transfer the advowson of the said benefice to the Bishop of Bath and Wells, for the time being and are consenting to this Scheme (in testimony whereof they have executed the same):

"And whereas we are satisfied that the transfer will tend to make better provision for the cure of souls:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend William, Bishop of Bath and Wells (in testimony whereof he has executed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice shall be transferred to the said William, Bishop of Bath and Wells, and his successors in the same Bishopric and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the Bishop of Bath and Wells for the time being."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Bath and Wells.
