Vienna, May 24. Francfort, May 31. The Landgrave of Hesse Cassel took a Review two days ago near Frankenbourg of the Forces he is sending to the Assistance of the Allies on the Lower Rhine, which it is believed have by this time begun their march. Hamburgh, June 2. Three thousand Horse of the Forces of Lunenburgh are marched to the Lower Rhine, and about 10000 Men more of the Forces of that House are in a readiness to follow them. This day we received an Account, that a Fire had happened accidentally in the City of Bergen in Norway, which had almost reduced it to Ashes.

Dusseldsorp, June 2. The Elector Palatine went yesterday to a House called Brock, near Mulleum, on the Roer, about 6 Miles from hence, where he had an Interview with the King of Prussa, who is returned to Wesel, as the Elector is to this Place. They write from the Siege of Keyserswart, that the Besieged made a

The Allies before Keyferswaert have received a Reinforcement of 1000 Men from the Earl of Athlone's Army, which is still encamped near Clever, Paris, May 29. An Express arrived at Marie the 25th instant from the French Army in Italy, which brought the tollowing Account. That the Duke of Vendolme broke up from St. Grovenni in Creat the 12th Instant

He made 2 halt there, to expect the coming up of a Convoy of Provisions from Picighistome, sufficient to serve his Army 6 days. The 15th, the French Army continued their march, and the Duke of Vendosme advanced with the Vanguard to a very advantagious Post beyond the Mela, near Bossano, where he stay'd for the coming up of the rest of the Army.
