The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Supplementary Regulations are published with the approval of The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz.:—
SUPPLEMENTARY RECONSTRUCTION COMPETITION FOR APPOINTMENT OF MEDICAL OFFICERS IN GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENTS.

1. Both men and women may compete under these Regulations.

2. Every candidate must have attained the age of 28 by 1st January 1948. The Commissioners have not specified an upper age limit for this competition. In general, however, Government Departments require a reasonable period of service from persons newly appointed to the Civil Service; and accordingly the Commissioners reserve the right to give weight to this factor in considering candidates for these posts who are over 50 years of age.

3. Candidates must be British subjects. They must also satisfy one of the following conditions:—
(a) If natural-born British subjects, they must either:—

(i) have at least one parent who is, or was at death, a British subject; or

(ii) have resided in His Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(b) If naturalized British subjects, they must have resided in His Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(c) If not qualified under (a) or (b) of this paragraph, they must satisfy the Commissioners that they are so closely connected with His Majesty's dominions either by ancestry, upbringing or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in their favour.

Provided that a candidate will not be eligible for appointment to the Ministry of Supply, unless he or she is a natural born British subject and born within the United Kingdom or in one of the self-governing Dominions of parents also born within the United Kingdom or in one of the self-governing Dominions, except when the circumstances are such as to justify a departure from the general rule, in which case, provided the candidate satisfies the conditions prescribed by the preceding paragraphs, he or she may be admitted to appointment or competition by special permission of the Minister of Supply.

4. Every candidate must be a fully qualified and registered medical practitioner. Particular qualifications noted below are needed for posts in the main Departments in which the present vacancies occur, but all candidates should state in their applications the nature of any medical work in which they have special qualifications or experience.

Board of Control.—It is not regarded as essential that candidates should have had experience in the Institutional care and treatment of mental defectives, but they should after qualifying as medical practitioners, have had some experience in general medicine.

Ministry of Civil Aviation.—Candidates must be versed in and have experience of the methods of medical examination to determine fitness for duty as an operating member of the crew of an aircraft. Experience in the making of assessments of such fitness would be an advantage. They should have a good knowledge of general aviation medicine and have experience of its administrative aspects.

Ministry of Pensions.—Candidates should have held House appointments in general (preferably teaching) hospitals and possess wide clinical experience.
