WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 11th day of December, 1947, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, and with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cyril Archbishop of York (in witness whereof he has signed this Scheme), have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting the union of the benefice of Kilnwick Percy and the benefice of Pocklington both situate in the diocese of York

"SCHEME.

"1 *Union of Benefices and Parishes* The said benefice of Kilnwick Percy and the said benefice of Pocklington shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Pocklington with Yapham-cum-Meltonby and Owthorpe and Kilnwick Percy' and the parishes of the said benefices shall also be united into one parish for ecclesiastical purposes.

"2 *Taking effect of union* Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the Reverend Canon Frederick Richardson if he is then incumbent of both of the said benefices of Kilnwick Percy and Pocklington shall, with his consent (testified by his signature hereto), be the first incumbent of the united benefice and his admission thereto shall be without any form or fee of or for presentation or nomination and he shall not be required to pay any fees in respect of his collation, institution, licence or induction to the united benefice beyond such fees as he would have been liable to pay if his admission to the united benefice had been an admission solely to that one of the said two benefices for the holding of which in plurality with the other a dispensation was heretofore granted to him.

"3 *Parish Church* The parish church of the parish of Pocklington shall be the parish church of the united parish

"4 *Registers* The marriage registers in duplicate current at the church of Kilnwick Percy shall be sent by the incumbent of the united benefice to the Registrar General to be closed officially."

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, and the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 to 1930, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

"SCHEME

"1 *Union of Benefices and Parishes*

(1) The said benefice of Holland Fen and the said benefice of Chapel Hill shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Holland Fen with Chapel Hill'

(2) The parishes of the said benefices together with the contiguous extra-parochial areas known as Harts' Grounds, Pelham's Lands and North Forty Foot Bank shall also be united into one parish for ecclesiastical purposes

"2 *Taking effect of union* Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the said unions shall forthwith take effect and the Reverend Ralph Olsen if he is then incumbent of the said benefice of Holland Fen shall, with his consent (testified by his signature hereto), be the first incumbent of the united benefice
