NOTICE OF SUBMISSION OF PRELIMINARY DRAFT OF REGULATIONS ENTITLED THE NATIONAL INSURANCE (MARRIED WOMEN) REGULATIONS, 1948

In accordance with Section 77 of the National Insurance Act, 1946, the National Insurance Advisory Committee give notice that they have received from the Minister of National Insurance for consideration and report thereon the preliminary draft of regulations entitled the National Insurance (Married Women) Regulations, 1948

A short explanatory note on these regulations is appended to this notice

The Committee will take into consideration any objections made by or on behalf of persons affected by these regulations. EXPLANATORY NOTE

These Regulations modify the National Insurance Act, 1946, in its application to persons who are or have been married women. The main provisions relate to elections by married women for the purpose of remaining in or being excepted from insurance (regulations 2 to 4), the circumstances in which a married woman who does not or cannot pay contributions shall be entitled thereafter to pay contributions as a non-employed person (regulations 5 and 6), the crediting of contributions for the purposes of unemployment benefit, sickness benefit or maternity allowance (regulations 8 and 9), the determining of the basis on which the disqualifications for unemployment benefit contained in section 13 (2) of the above-mentioned Act shall be applied to married women (regulation 10), an additional condition for the receipt by a married woman of an increase of benefit for a child (regulation 11); and the circumstances in which, where a married woman commences again to pay contributions under that Act, those contributions shall be taken into account for the purposes of benefit (regulations 2 (3), 3 (3), 4 (3) and 6 (1)). The remaining provisions of the regulations are of a consequential character
