St. James's, June 19. This day the Baron de Spanheim, Ambassador Extraordinary from the King of Prussia, had Publick Audience of the Queen, being conducted by the Rt. Hon. the Earl of Winchelsea, Sir Charles Cottrell Master of the Ceremonies, and 6 Gentlemen of Her Majesty's Privy-Chamber, in one of Her Majesty's Coaches, followed by a Coach of his Royal Highness's Prince George of Denmark, the Ambassador's own Coaches, and many Coaches of the Nobility with 6 Horses each. At the Gate of the Palace, he was received by the Knight Marshal, and the Gentleman Porter. Her Majesty's Foot-Guards then upon Duty were drawn up in the Court, and the Officers Saluted his Excellency with their Hats as he passed by. He was conducted to the Council Chamber; and when Her Majesty was ready, he proceeded to his Audience, and was received at the Guard Chamber-Door by the Rt. Hon. the Marquis of Hertford Captain of the Yeomen of the Guard, and afterwards by his Grace the Duke of St. Albans at the Head of the Band of Gentlemen-Pensioners, and at the Door of the Room of Audience by the Rt. Hon. the Earl of Jersey Lord Chamberlain of Her Majesty's Household.

After which, his Excellency had Audience of his Royal Highness's Prince George of Denmark, being received at his Royal Highness's Bedchamber Door by the Rt. Hon. the Lord Delaware Groom of the Stole to his Royal Highness.

And the Audiences being over, the Ambassador was reconducted in the same manner to his own House.
