At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 24th day of February, 1948.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

Whereas there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 2nd day of February, 1948 (P.M. 581/48), in the words following, viz:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council

"And whereas by Orders in Council bearing dates 13th October, 1922, 16th December, 1925, 28th February, 1941, and 30th April, 1942, sanction was given, *inter alia*, to certain scales of pensions and gratuities to Native Petty Officers and Men other than Europeans (whether or not British subjects), who consequent on wounds, hurts or disability, are invalided from Your Majesty's Naval Service, and to the grant, at our discretion of certain scales of compensation in respect of the death of such Native ratings

"And whereas we are of opinion that these scales of compensation require amendment in certain respects:

"We beg humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction from the 21st July, 1944, the substitution of the Schedule hereto annexed, for the Schedule annexed to Your Majesty's Order in Council of 30th April, 1942.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.

## "SCHEDULE

"Except where otherwise stated, the provisions of this Schedule to apply in the case of all Native Ratings of the Royal Navy who are discharged from the Naval Service on or after 21st July, 1944.

"The provisions of Section 'A' and 'B' to be subject to review after the end of the present emergency

### "SECTION 'A'

"Disablement Pensions and Gratuities Allowable for attributable invaliding.

"(a) (i) In cases other than those specified at (b) below, where the degree of disablement is assessed at 20 per cent, and upwards, the option of either: Pension which may be awarded either temporarily or permanently according to the circumstances of the case; or the basis of a maximum scale of 20s.

a week for Petty Officers, 18s 9d a week for Leading Ratings, and 17s 6d a week for Lower Ratings for total disablement (100 per cent.); lower degrees of disablement carrying proportionately reduced rates, or

Gratuity on the scale laid down in the Ministry of Pensions' War Pensions (Chinese Seamen, etc.) Scheme, 1944, or any Order replacing or amending that Scheme. No award will be made in respect of the subsequent death of a Native rating who receives a gratuity under this option

(ii) If the degree of disablement be assessed at less than 20 per cent, a gratuity appropriate to the degree of disability, but not exceeding £50

(1.1) The rates of disablement compensation to be subject to the conditions specified in Order in Council of the 6th February, 1922, and in substitution of those laid down for Native ratings in Order in Council of 13th October, 1922

"(b) As from 3rd July, 1945, where the rating is a native of Ceylon, and was a member of the Royal Naval Aircraft Ceylonese Training Establishment, or was a Ceylonese Radio Mechanic, or was locally entered in the Royal Navy as a Cook or Steward for shore service in Ceylon, compensation may be granted on the scale and subject to the conditions laid down for corresponding Ceylonese Military personnel, provided the rating was discharged from the Naval Service on or after 3rd September, 1939.

### "SECTION 'B'

"Pension and Gratuities to dependants of ratings whose death is attributable to Naval Service.

"(a) Where the rating was a native of the Dominion of India or Pakistan, or of the Princes' States, or of Goa, or was employed or engaged on terms and conditions which are customary, or are similar to those customary, in the case of such natives the widow eligible children or dependants as defined in the Scheme referred to in sub-paragraph (i) below, may be given the option of compensation—

(i) at the rates laid down in the Ministry of Pensions' War Pensions (Indian Seamen, etc.) Scheme, 1944, or any Order replacing or amending that Scheme; or

(ii) as if the deceased rating were a person to whom paragraph (c) below applied

"(b) As from 3rd July, 1945, where the rating was a native of Ceylon and was a member of the Royal Naval Aircraft Ceylonese Training Establishment, or was a Ceylonese Radio Mechanic, or was locally entered in the Royal Navy as a Cook or Steward for shore service in Ceylon, compensation may be granted at the rate and under the conditions provided for dependants of corresponding Ceylonese Military personnel

"(c) Where the rating was a person to whom neither of the foregoing paragraphs of this Section applies, compensation may be granted to his widow

or dependant as laid down in the Ministry of Pensions' War Pensions (Chinese Seamen, etc.) Scheme, 1944, or any Order replacing or amending that Scheme, on the basis of the following classification—

Chief Petty Officers and Petty Officers—

Class II.

Leading Ratings and A B's and equivalent ratings—

Class III

"(d) The provisions of the Order in Council of the 16th December, 1925, shall continue to apply in any case where no compensation would be payable under the foregoing provisions of this Section, or where the compensation payable under those provisions would be less beneficial than the compensation payable under that Order in Council.

The pensions and gratuities under paragraphs (a), (c) and (d) of this Section to be subject to the conditions laid down in the Order in Council dated 7th November, 1924, and to be payable in all cases of death due to the Service, whether due to a war injury (as defined in the Ministry of Pensions' Schemes) or otherwise.

#### " SECTION ' C '.

##### " *Gratuities for Long Service and Non-Attributable Invaliding.*

###### " 1. Long Service.

A gratuity at the rate of 15s a year for each complete year of qualifying service, together with a rank addition of £1 and 10s for each year as Petty Officer and Leading Rate respectively, the total award to be conditional upon completion of 22 years' satisfactory service as for Naval ratings generally.

###### " 2. Non-Attributable Invaliding.

Subject to a minimum period of 6 years' service being rendered, a gratuity on a scale similar to the above, except that the rank addition of £1 and 10s a year may be allowed only for each complete year of satisfactory service in excess of 14 years rendered in the capacity of Petty Officer and/or Leading rate.

The rates of compensation to apply to all Native Ratings other than Europeans (British subjects or otherwise) and to be subject to the conditions laid down in Order in Council dated 21st March, 1924.

#### " SECTION ' D '.

##### " *Gratuities for Minor Injuries for which Hurt Certificates are granted.*

"Gratuities may also be granted on discharge at our discretion in respect of slight permanent injury due to the Service, for which a Hurt Certificate was granted, when discharge is totally unconnected with the injury, and any other compensation awarded is based on length of service only."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 22nd day of January, 1948, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for constituting a new parish to be taken out of the parish of Bromley in the county of Kent and diocese of Rochester.

#### " SCHEME.

"Whereas we, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, are satisfied that the spiritual interests of the area defined in the subjoined Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed would be best served by constituting it a new parish"

"And whereas we are satisfied that a suitable endowment therefor will be provided:

"And whereas there is within the said area a consecrated church known as Saint Mark, which has been approved by us as suitable to be the parish church of the new parish:

"And whereas the patronage of the said church of Saint Mark belongs to the incumbent for the time being of the benefice of Bromley and the patronage of the new parish will accordingly belong to the said incumbent:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Christopher, Bishop of Rochester (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and affixed his episcopal seal to this Scheme) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, do humbly recommend and propose as follows, that is to say:—

#### " 1. Constitution

(a) As from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council confirming this Scheme, the area defined in the subjoined Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed shall be a new parish.

(b) The Church of Saint Mark aforesaid shall be the parish church of the parish

(c) The name of the parish shall be 'The Parish of Saint Mark, Bromley'.

#### " 2. Archdeaconry and rural deanery.

The parish shall be in the archdeaconry of Rochester and in the rural deanery of Bromley.

#### " THE SCHEDULE.

"The area comprising:—

All that portion of the parish of Bromley which is bounded upon part of the north by the parish of Saint George, Bickley; upon the south east and east by the parish of Saint Luke, Bromley Common; upon the south by the parish of Hayes; upon the west and south west by the parish of Saint Mary of Nazareth, West Wickham, and the parish of Saint Barnabas, Beckenham; upon the north west by the parish of Saint Mary, Shortlands, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the remaining part of the north by an imaginary line commencing at a point in the middle of the main line of the Southern Railway where such railway crosses the boundary which divides the said parish of Saint Mary, Shortlands, from the said parish of Bromley and extending thence eastwards along the middle of the said railway to its junction with the boundary which divides the said parish of Bromley from the said parish of Saint George, Bickley"

And whereas the provisions of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Rochester.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme, for altering the boundaries of the parish of Woodchurch, of the parish of Saint Saviour, Oxton, and of the parish of Saint Stephen, Prenton, all situate in the diocese of Chester.

"Whereas we are satisfied that it is desirable that the boundaries of the said parishes should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned

"And whereas the Bishop of the diocese consents to the proposed arrangements (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme):

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any

Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme the boundaries of the said parish of Woodchurch, of the said parish of Saint Saviour, Oxton, and of the said parish of Saint Stephen, Prenton, shall be altered in the manner described in the First and Second Parts of the Schedule and delineated on the map annexed to this Scheme

"The Schedule to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"First Part."

"The territory (shown by the pink colour on the map) to be annexed to the said parish of Saint Saviour, Oxton:

All that portion of the said parish of Woodchurch bounded upon the north west and part of the north east by the parish of Bidston upon the remaining part of the north east and upon the south east by the said parish of Saint Saviour, Oxton, and upon the remaining side, that is to say upon the south west by an imaginary line commencing at a point in the centre of the Wrexham and Bidston branch of the British Railways (Eastern Region) where it crosses the boundary which divides the said parish of Saint Saviour, Oxton, from the said parish of Woodchurch and extending thence north westwards along the middle of the said branch railway to its junction with the boundary which divides the said parish of Woodchurch from the said parish of Bidston.

"Second Part."

"The territory to be annexed to the said parish of Saint Stephen, Prenton:

(a) All that portion (shown by the green colour on the map) of the said parish of Woodchurch bounded upon the north by the said parish of Saint Saviour, Oxton, upon the east by the said parish of Saint Stephen, Prenton, upon the south by the parish of Bebington and upon the remaining side, that is to say upon the west by an imaginary line commencing at a point in the centre of the Wrexham and Bidston branch of the British Railways (Eastern Region) on the boundary which divides the said parish of Bebington from the said parish of Woodchurch and extending thence north westwards along the middle of the said branch railway to its junction with the boundary which divides the said parish of Woodchurch from the said parish of Saint Saviour, Oxton.

(b) All that portion (shown by the brown colour on the map) of the said parish of Saint Saviour, Oxton, bounded upon the south east, the south and the west by the said parish of Saint Stephen, Prenton, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the north west by an imaginary line commencing on the boundary which divides the said parish of Saint Stephen, Prenton, from the said parish of Saint Saviour, Oxton, at a point in the middle of Woodchurch Road where that road is crossed by Storeton Road and extending thence north eastwards along the middle of Woodchurch Road to the boundary which divides the said parish of Saint Saviour, Oxton, from the said parish of Saint Stephen, Prenton."

And whereas the provisions of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme; and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Bishop (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose, that as from the date on which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette, and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the parish or cure of Northolt shall be transferred from the said archdeaconry of Hampstead and the rural deanery of Harrow to the said archdeaconry of Middlesex and the rural deanery of Ealing and the said parish or cure shall be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of the rural dean of the rural deanery and of the archdeacon of the archdeaconry to which it is hereby transferred and shall not belong to or be a part of any other rural deanery or archdeaconry, nor be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of any other rural dean or of any other archdeacon."

And whereas the provisions of the said Acts relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

"SCHEME

"Whereas under an Order of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria in Council dated the 27th day of July, 1863, and published in the London Gazette on the following day, a consolidated chapelry was assigned to the consecrated church of Saint John, situate in the parish of Saint Mary, Battersea, in the said county of Surrey and at that time in the diocese of Winchester, under the name of 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint John, Battersea':

"And whereas the said consolidated chapelry has since become a parish under the same name and is now in the diocese of Southwark:

"And whereas it has been represented to us, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, and it appears to us that the name of the said parish should be altered as hereinafter recommended and proposed:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, with the consent of the Right Reverend Bertram, Bishop of Southwark (in testimony whereof he has hereunto set his hand) and with the consent

of the parochial church council of the said parish (in testimony whereof this Scheme is signed by the Chairman of and two other members present at a meeting of the same council duly convened for the purpose of giving such consent) humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty in Council that as from the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme the name of the said parish shall be altered to 'The Parish of Saint Paul, Battersea'."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cyril, Archbishop of York (in witness whereof he has signed the Scheme), for effecting the union of the benefice of Thirsk and the benefice of South Kilvington both situate in the diocese of York.

"SCHEME.

"1 *Union of Benefices* The benefice of Thirsk and the benefice of South Kilvington shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Thirsk with South Kilvington', but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

"2 *Taking effect of union.* Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the Reverend Harry Broughton if he is then Incumbent of the said benefice of Thirsk shall with his consent (testified by his signature hereto), be the first incumbent of the united benefice

"3 *Parsonage House.* Upon the union taking effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Thirsk shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice

"4. *Clerical or other assistance.* (1) Upon the union taking effect a curate shall be employed by the incumbent to assist him in performing the duties of the united benefice and such curate shall, unless the Archbishop of York otherwise from time to time permits, reside within the parish of Thirsk, but in the event of the services of a whole-time curate not being available, the incumbent shall employ such other clerical or such lay assistance as the Archbishop shall from time to time direct

(2) There shall be appropriated as a fund towards the cost of providing such assistance as aforesaid—

(i) upon the union taking effect, a part of the endowments of the united benefice, namely, so much of the moneys appropriated by Queen Anne's Bounty to the benefice of South Kilvington pursuant to the Tithe Act, 1936, as will produce £275 per annum, and

(ii) upon the union taking effect or upon the cesser of the pension of £148 per annum now charged upon the revenues of the benefice of South Kilvington in favour of the Reverend Benjamin Ward Wood (whichever date shall be the later) a further part of the said endowments, namely, so much of the said moneys as will produce £25 per annum,

and the said fund shall be paid by Queen Anne's Bounty to the diocesan board of finance of the diocese as trustees to apply the same accordingly."

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, and the Union of

Benefices Rules, 1926 to 1930, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty by and with the advice of His said Council is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that it shall be and become effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette.

"SCHEME

"1 Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the parish of Saint Peter, Ipswich, and the parish of Saint Mary at the Quay, Ipswich, shall forthwith be permanently united together and form one parish for ecclesiastical purposes.

"2 The Parish church of the parish of Saint Peter, Ipswich, shall be the parish church of the united parish.

"3 Upon the union taking effect the marriage registers in duplicate current at the church of Saint Mary at the Quay, Ipswich, shall be sent by the incumbent of the united benefice to the Registrar General to be closed officially.

"4 Upon the union taking effect the church of Saint Mary at the Quay, Ipswich, shall, subject to the provisions of the said Measures, be appropriated for any educational or charitable purpose or purposes in connection with the Church of England having in view the spiritual, intellectual, moral or social welfare of the parishioners of the united parish of Saint Peter with Saint Mary at the Quay, Ipswich, and others or either exclusively or in conjunction with any such purpose as aforesaid for use or occupation by any diocesan body or organisation or otherwise for the furtherance of the work of the Church of England or the administration of its affairs, and such appropriation shall be subject to such conditions, regulations and provisions as the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich shall by Deed made pursuant to the 24th Section of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, declare and appoint."
