#### NEW TOWNS ACT, 1946.

##### THE EASINGTON NEW TOWN (DESIGNATION) ORDER, 1948.

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Town and Country Planning in pursuance of the powers vested in him by Section 1 of the New Towns Act, 1946, on the 10th day of March, 1948, made an Order designating as the site of a proposed new town an area of land comprising approximately 2,350 acres situate in the Rural District of Easington in the County of Durham, which land is shown on the map annexed to the Order.

This area is the area which was shown on the map annexed to the Draft Easington New Town (Designation) Order, 1947, which was deposited for inspection at Little Eden Farm, Howlatch Lane, Horden, on the 10th day of November, 1947, and with respect to which a public local inquiry was held at the Offices of the Easington Rural District Council on the 27th day of January, 1948

In compliance with the provisions of paragraph 5 of the First Schedule to the Act, a copy of the Order and of the map have been deposited at Little Eden Farm, Howlatch Lane, Horden, County Durham, where they will be open for inspection at all reasonable hours; and at the Offices of the Easington Rural District Council, Easington, Co. Durham, where they will be open for inspection without payment of fee between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on weekdays except Saturdays, and between 9 a.m. and 12 noon on Saturdays. A copy of the Order and
