The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz —

SUPPLEMENTARY RECONSTRUCTION COMPETITION FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF SECOND AND THIRD CLASS VALUERS IN THE INLAND REVENUE VALUATION OFFICE IN SCOTLAND

1. Both men and women may compete under these Regulations

2. In order to be eligible, a candidate must have attained the age of 25 on or before the 1st January, 1948.

3 Candidates must be British subjects. They must also satisfy one of the following conditions.—

(a) If natural-born British subjects, they must either

(i) have at least one parent who is or was at death a British subject; or

(ii) have resided in His Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment,

(b) If naturalized British subjects, they must have resided in His Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(c) If not qualified under (a) or (b) of this paragraph they must satisfy the Commissioners that they are so closely connected with His Majesty's dominions either by ancestry, upbringing or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in their favour.

4 Candidates must have passed the Final Examination of the Royal Institution of Chartered Surveyors or of the Chartered Institute of Auctioneers and Estate Agents or of the Land Agents' Society or hold a University Degree (e.g BSc (Estate Management) London or B.A. (Estate Management) Cambridge) which gives exemption from the examinations of any one of these bodies. Candidates who have attained Corporate Membership of one of these bodies without examination may submit applications which will be considered by the Commissioners. Candidates who are sitting their final examination in March, 1948, may submit provisional applications on the understanding that they will be declared ineligible if they fail to pass the examination.

Candidates must have had at least four years professional experience in —

(a) the office of an F S I, F A I, F L A S., or member of the Faculty of Surveyors in Scotland in
