

professional practice, or in Government or municipal service; or

(b) the office of any other surveyor, estate agent, or land agent which in the opinion of the Commissioners and the Department gives an adequate experience.

Time spent on agricultural subjects at a University or approved Agricultural College and followed by the obtaining of a degree or diploma may count up to two out of the required four years

5. Candidates must satisfy the Commissioners as to their health and character.

6. No person who is undergoing a course of study with the aid of a grant from public funds shall be eligible to compete under these Regulations before the completion of the course, unless he or she has previously obtained permission to do so from the authority which administers the grant

7. Every candidate must apply on the appropriate form within the time and in the manner of which notice is given by the Commissioners.

8. Those candidates who appear from their application forms to have the best qualifications may be summoned to a preliminary informal interview and will be summoned to an interview before a Selection Board in Edinburgh which will recommend to the Commissioners for appointment the candidates who appear to them to be most suitable. The Selection Board will recommend candidates for appointment as Second Class or Third Class Valuers according to their qualifications, age, and experience. The Selection Board may also recommend that a certain number of candidates shall be classed as reserve candidates and considered by the Commissioners for appointment in conjunction with the results of a later Board. The Selection Board shall have power to give such preference to candidates born on or after 2nd August, 1910, as the Commissioners consider appropriate. Subject to this preference the Board will take into consideration the candidates' record of experience and education, any recommendations that they may receive from persons named by the candidates as having direct knowledge of their work in the past, and the personal qualities of the candidates as shown at the interview; and on their estimation of the above evidence they will frame their recommendations. The decision of the Commissioners will be final.

9. Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate central education authority (e.g., the Ministry of Education, the Scottish Education Department, the Ministry of Education for Northern Ireland) has been notified to the Commissioners.

10. Every successful candidate will be required to pay a fee of £1 before the issue of a certificate of qualification for appointment.

11. Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through Members of Parliament or other influential persons, except as referees to be named by them in their application form, will disqualify them for appointment. The Selection Board will disregard recommendations from persons who are not personally acquainted with the candidate's work, whether at school, in the Forces, or otherwise.

(APPLICATION FOR AN ORDER UNDER SECTION 1 OF THE GAS UNDERTAKINGS ACT, 1929)

Byelaws as to trading in Streets by Licensed Street Traders
