By an order dated the 19th day of March, 1948, the Minister of Health has declared that, on and after the 12th day of April, 1948, the following provisions of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907 shall be in force in the County Borough of Rochdale, namely—

Section 17 (Power to vary position or direction and to fix beginning and end of new streets)

Section 120 of the Rochdale Improvement Act, 1872, is repealed, except in so far as it relates to the naming of streets.

NOTICE OF APPLICATION FOR A DECLARATORY ORDER.

City of Manchester Area of Extensive War Damage No 5 (Water Street Area)

NOTICE is hereby given that the Lord Mayor, Aldermen and Citizens of the City of Manchester, acting by the Council of the said City, in pursuance of their powers under Section 1 of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1944, on the third day of March, 1948, have applied to the Minister of Town and Country Planning for an Order under the said Section declaring that the land situate in the vicinity of Water Street, Manchester, and described in the Schedule hereto, which land is shown on the map accompanying the application, shall be subject to compulsory purchase for the purpose of dealing satisfactorily with extensive war damage in that area by the laying out afresh and redevelopment as a whole of the area, and that the application is about to be considered by the Minister.

A copy of the application and of the map referred to, and of the other documents relating to the application have been deposited at the Housing, Town Planning etc. Office (Room 323), Town Clerk's Department, Town Hall, Manchester, and will be open for inspection by all persons interested without payment of fee between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on Monday to Friday, and 9 a.m. and 12 (noon) on Saturday.

Any objection to the application must be made in writing stating the grounds of the objection, and addressed to the Minister of Town and Country Planning, 32, St. James's Square, London, S.W. 1, before the tenth day of May, 1948.

The Minister is not, in all cases, required to arrange for objections to be heard by a person appointed by him for that purpose. It is important, therefore, that an objection should include a full statement in writing of the grounds on which the objection is made as the objector may have no further opportunity to make such a statement.
