At St. James's, July 8. The following Address was presented to Her Majesty by Mr. Castlairs, one of Her Majesty's Chaplains for the Kingdom of Scotland.

To the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty.
The humble Address of the united Presbyteries of the Shires of Ross and Sutherland, in the North of Scotland.

WE Your Majesty's loyal, dutiful, and obedient Subjects, the Ministers of the united Presbyteries of Ross and Sutherland, from a Sense of Duty embrace this Opportunity to congratulate Your Majesty's just Succession, and peaceable Accession to the Imperial Crown of this your most Kingdom of Scotland, withing sincerely, That God Almighty may be pleased to give Your Majesty Countenance in Her Administrations, Protection from all your Enemies, and that You will long Live, and reign to the Satisfaction of all your People.

Though Your Majesty succeeds in a most critical Juncture, and eminent and Heroical Prince as our late Sovereign King William, the Restorer of Arbitrary Government in this State, and the Restorer of the ancient Presbyterian Government of this Church so acceptable to us, who has left the Præsterial Churches, especially this of Scotland, in a heavy Heart, and weeping Eyes: Yet since in the Lord Jehovah there is everlastig Strength, and that he sees them who honour Him, therefore it is our earnest Prayer to God, that You may be strong in the Lord, and in the Power of His Right Arm. May Your Majesty therefore go on securing to those early Assurances You were pleased to give at your first Accession to the Crown, to seek His Glory, in the Care of His Church, and the Comfort of His People.

We assure Your Majesty, That if either our Prayers to Heaven, or Devotion and Example of Loyalty among your People, can be of any use, we'll make it our Business to do our utmost how sensible we are, That not only humane Con-

siderations, but much more, the most sacred and inviolable Laws, the Laws of God, oblige us to be, may it please Your Majesty, Your Majesty's most faithful, most obedient, and most humble Subjects.

Naples, June 20. N. S. The Gallies of this Kingdom are returned from Final, having attended the King of Spain in his Passage thither. The Government here have given Orders for proceeding against the Prince of Trebisaccia, who is imprisoned in-Castelluovo, who it is said, that the principal Evidence against him is only a Letter he wrote to the Marquis del Vasto, which was intercepted: However the seizing of him, and of several other Persons of Quality, upon account of the Conspiracy, that is said to have been lately discovered, has caused a great Alarm among the Favourers of the House of Austria, who are most of them retired to Abruzzo, where their Party is so strong, that they think themselves out of Danger. The frequent Disputes between the French and Spanish Soldiers in Garrison here have of late occasioned such Disorders, that the Government has found it necessary to publish an Order forbidding any one to draw his Sword in any Quarrel, on pain of 2 years Confinement to the Gallies. Cardinal Barberini, the Pope's Legate, intends in 3 or 4 days to go on board the Gallies that brought him hither, in order to return to Nettuno.

Rome, June 24. An Express arrived here last week from the Pope's Nuncio in Palma, to acquaint him with the Posture of Affairs in that Kingdom, and to desire further Instructions whereby to regulate his Conduct in this Conjunction, which have accordingly been sent him by another Express. The Imperial Ambassador received a Courier from Vienna the 19th Instant, which is supposed to have brought some Dispatches of Moment, for he sent a Letter the next morning to Cardinal Paolucci, the Pope's Secretary of State, who immediately went up with it to the Pope, and he thereupon sent for Cardinal Sacripanti, and was a long time in Conference with these two Cardinals: There is a Report, but how well grounded is not yet known, That the Subject of it was a Treaty between the Infant of Portugal and one of the Arch Dutchesses. Prince Borghese, Ambassador Extraordinary from the King of Spain, is preparing for his Publick Entry, which is appointed to be the 5th of next Month.

Rensburgh, July 6. The King of Denmark came some days ago from Copenhagen to Fredericksbad, and arrived here this Day; and intends in 4 or 5 days to visit the Towns of Glucksbad and Tzeboz. It is said, that about 7000 Men are ordered to march hither from Norway.
