IS Excellency the Lord Paget, late Ambailador from the Crown of England to the Grand Signior, parted the 21st past, from Advianople, where the Grand Signior does at present keep his Court, having been entertained there above 3 Months at that Prince's Expence, with all the Demonstrations that could possibly be given of Relpect for the English Nation, and of Gratitude for the good Offices of the Mediation of that Crown in the Trenty of Carlowicz. His Excellency's Expences were also defrayed along the Road, an Aga of the Grand Vizier, 2 Chi-auses, and 6 Janizaries having been sent with him as far as Boucharet, the Residence of the Prince of Walachia, who had Orders from the Port to furnish his Excellency with all manner of Conveniencies for his Journey through that Country, which he performed in a very obliging manner, causing his Excellency to be accompanied through his Territories by one of the Chief Lords of his Court, and to be attended by a Guard of 60 Cossacks on Horseback, and entertaining him very splendidly during his stay at Boucharet. His Excellency, at his Entrance into the Territories of Transplvania, was met by Count Miketh, deputed for that purpose by the whole Province, accompanied by 50 Gentlemen, who took care to provide all that his Excellency or his Retinue had occasion for, and his Excellency was attended by a Guard of 100 Dragoons When his Excellency came to any of their Towns or Castles, he was saluted by 3 Discharges of the Great Guns, and met out of Town and complimented by the Commanding Officers at the head of a Detachment of their Garrisons, and by the Magistrates, accompanied by part of the Burghers on Horseback, the rest being drawn up in the Streets through which he passed for his Reception. The day before my Lord Ambassador's Arrival here, Count Rabutin, Commander in chief of the Emperor's Forces in Transylvania, came in a Post Chaise 5 Leagues from this City to com-pliment him, and having accompanied his Excellency to his Quarters, returned hither, and the next day he met his Excellency a League out of Town at the head of 300 Dragoons, as the Burgomasters did likewise, being accompanied by 300 of the Burghers on Horseback, and the same Honours were paid his Excellency here as had been paid him in other Towns. His Excellency and his Desirate here and his Desirate here. lency and his Retinue have been entertained these three days by Count Rabucin, and a Ball is prepared for his Excellency's Diversion, which is to be performed this evening. In a day or two his Excellency will proceed on his Journey.
