Hermanstad in Transylvania, May 28. N. S.

HIS Excellency the Lord Paget, late Ambassador from the Crown of England to the Grand Signior, parted the 21st inst, from *Adrianople*, where the Grand Signior does at present keep his Court, having been entertained there above 3 Months at that Prince's Expence, with all the Demonstrations that could possibly be given of Respect for the *English* Nation, and of Gratitude for the good Offices of the Mediation of that Crown in the Treaty of *Carlowitz*. His Excellency's Expences were also defrayed along the Road, an Aga of the Grand Vizier, 2 Chiauses, and 6 Janizaries having been sent with him as far as *Boucharat*, the Residence of the Prince of *Walachia*, who had Orders from the Port to furnish his Excellency with all manner of Conveniencies for his Journey through that Country, which he performed in a very obliging manner, causing his Excellency to be accompanied through his Territories by one of the Chief Lords of his Court, and to be attended by a Guard of 60 Cossacks on Horseback, and entertaining him very splendidly during his stay at *Boucharat*. His Excellency, at his Entrance into the Territories of *Transylvania*, was met by Count *Miketh*, deputed for that purpose by the whole Province, accompanied by 50 Gentlemen, who took care to provide all that his Excellency or his Retinue had occasion for, and his Excellency was attended by a Guard of 100 Dragoons. When his Excellency came to any of their Towns or Castles, he was saluted by 3 Discharges of the Great Guns, and met out of Town and complimented by the Commanding Officers at the head of a Detachment of their Garrisons, and by the Magistrates, accompanied by part of the Burghers on Horseback, the rest being drawn up in the Streets through which he passed to the House prepared for his Reception. The day before my Lord Ambassador's Arrival here, Count *Rabutin*, Commander in chief of the Emperor's Forces in *Transylvania*, came in a Post Chaise 5 Leagues from this City to compliment him, and having accompanied his Excellency to his Quarters, returned hither, and the next day he met his Excellency a League out of Town at the head of 300 Dragoons, as the Burgomasters did likewise, being accompanied by 300 of the Burghers on Horseback, and the same Honours were paid his Excellency here as had been paid him in other Towns. His Excellency and his Retinue have been entertained these three days by Count *Rabutin*, and a Ball is prepared for his Excellency's Diversion, which is to be performed this evening. In a day or two his Excellency will proceed on his Journey.

Cracow, June 28. A good part of the King of *Poland's* Saxon Forces are arrived, and when the

rest, which are shortly expected, are come up, it is said they will amount to about 20000 Men, who are to be joined by those of the Crown, and, as some say, by a Body of *Lithuanian* Gentlemen under the Command of the *Sieur Oginsky*. The King designs to command this Army in Person, and to march towards *Warsaw* in the beginning of the next Month, about which time it is thought his Forces may be got together. We hear, several Palatinats of the *Greater Poland* have in their Provincial Diets declared their Resolution of standing by the King of *Poland*.

Warsaw, June 30. The *Swedish* Forces which were quartered in and about this Place, are all marched towards *Cracow*, the King of *Sweden* himself being at their Head. The King of *Poland*, according to our last Accounts from thence, had got together there the best part of his Saxon Forces; he had sent 20000 Dollars to pay part of the Arrears due to the Army of the Crown which is marching to join him, as is also the *Sieur Oginsky* with a considerable Body of Men. It is said, the Cardinal Primate intends to go from his House at *Lowitz* to *Dantzick*.

Frankfort, July 9. Count *Lewesteyn*, the Emperor's Envoy, went from hence the 7th Instant to *Wetheim*, to wait for the King of the *Romans* coming, who is expected there to morrow, and will forthwith proceed to the Imperial Camp before *Landau*. Our Advices from thence say, they push on the Siege of that Town very vigorously, plying it continually from 3 Batteries, one of 35, another of 25, and the 3d of 15 Pieces of Cannon, besides the Batteries of Mortars; The *French* Garrison is weak, and very much fatigued by being continually upon Duty. The Imperial Army has of late been considerably increased by the Arrival of several Regiments of the Forces of the Emperor and of the Circles, and divers Regiments more are shortly expected from *Bohemia*, which take their way through the Elector of *Bavaria's* Territories.

Hamburgh, July 11. The King of *Denmark* is still at *Reisburgh*, reviewing the Forces quartered in that Place and the Neighbourhood, after which he intends to do the like at *Gluckstadt*, *Itzehoe*, and other Towns in *Holftein*, and then to return to *Copenhagen*. The *Swedish* Forces which lay in *Pomeran* continue their March towards *Poland* with all possible Expedition, in order to join the King of *Sweden's* Army, which is by this time advanced a good way towards *Cracow*.

Falmouth, July 7. Two *French* Prizes, one a Privateer of 10 Guns and 60 Men, belonging to *St. Malo*, the other a Merchant Ship of *Diepe* laden with Salt for *Newfoundland*, were sent in hither the 7th Instant by 2 *Dutch* Capers.

Bristol, July 11. The *Mechuen* Frigate of this Place arrived here the 5th Instant from *Jamaica*.

Jamaica, having been 9 weeks in her Passage, and the *Salmon* from *Colrayn* in *Ireland*. This day arrived in our Port the *Expectation*, *Philip Stone* Master, being come in 5 weeks from *Nevis*, who in her Passage met with a Privateer of 8 Guns, and fought her, and got clear of her, and soon after had sight of another Privateer, but avoided her.

Plymouth, July 12. The *John and Mary* of *Boston* came in here the 10th Instant from *Jamaica*: And this day came in the *Mary Galley* from the *Cannies*, and brought with her a *French Prize* of about 130 Tuns laden with *Fish* from *Newfoundland*; the *Sidney*, *Lewis Whidnil* Master from the *East Indies*; the *Chester Frigate*, *William Haley* Master, from *Antegoa*; and the *John and Sarah*, *John Fowey* Master, from *Boston*, all bound for *London*; with some other homeward-bound Merchant Ships.

Coxes, July 13. Yesterday came in here a *Dutch Caper* called the *Phoenix of Fushing*, *John Angler* Master, who brought in with him a *French Merchant Ship* called the *Marine of Handfleter*, *Peter Groat* Master, of about 100 Tuns, 12 Guns, 4 *Pateraroes*, and 30 Men, laden with *Sugar*, *Cotton*, and *Ginger*, which he took in her Passage home from *St. Domingo*.

Dea's, July 13. The *Alexander* and the *Betty Galley* both from *Antegoa*, the *Jeseph and Mary* from *Guinea*, the *Britannia* from *New-England*, and the *Anthony Galley* from *Montserrat*, came into the *Downes* yesterday and this day.

London, July 13. At a Session of the Court of Admiralty held this day at the Old Baily, pursuant to their last Adjournment, Captain *Francis Lawrence* was tried upon the Indictment of *High Treason* preferred against him for commanding a Privateer in the *French Service*, of which he was found guilty. *Thomas Boys* was tried upon two Indictments of *Piracy*, and found guilty thereof. *Robert Acres* and *John Snaps* were tried and convicted of *Felony*, for wilfully burning the *Cloudesty Galley*: and the Trials being over, the Court proceeded to pass Sentence of *Death* upon *Samuel Burges*, *John Ireland*, *Thomas Hitchman*, *Thomas Boys*, *Michael Hicks*, *Arnoud Viel*, *Richard Roper*, *John Barner*, *Robert Engliffe*, and *Thomas Bagly*, who had been convicted of *Piracy*; and upon Captain *Francis Lawrence* as is usual in Cases of *High Treason*. After which the Court adjourned to the 17th of *November* next.

London, July 14. There are Letters from *Jamaica* of the 1st of the last Month which give an Account, That the Squadron of Her Majesty's Ships commanded by Vice-Admiral *Bombow* was then very healthy, and most of them were cruising off of that Island. The *Plate Fleet* was not then failed from *Vera Cruz*.
