"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England actions in automorphism of the Union of Rose

We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend William Bishop of Manchester (in witness whereof he has signed the Scheme), for effecting the union of the benefice of Little Bolton, Saint John and the benefice of Bolton-le-Moors, All Saints, both situate in the diocese of Manchester.

"I. Union of Benefices.—The benefice of Little Bolton, Saint John and the benefice of Bolton-le-Moors, All Saints shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Little Bolton, Saint John, with Bolton-le-Moors, All Saints', but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

"2. Taking effect of union.—Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect.

"3. Patronage.—After the union has taken effect

3. Patronage.—After the union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective patrons shall present or nominate to the united benefice from time to time shall be as follows, that is to say, in every series of three successive turns of is to say, in every series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the united benefice after the union the first turn shall belong to Your Majesty (as patron alternatively with the Bishop of Manchester of the benefice of Little Bolton Saint John), the second turn shall belong to the patrons of the benefice Bolton-le-Moors, All Saints and the third turn shall belong to the Bishop of Manchester.

"4. Clerical or other assistance.—(1) Upon the union taking effect a curate shall be employed by the incumbent to assist him in performing the duties of the united benefice, but in the event of the services of a whole-time curate not being available the in-cumbent shall employ such other clerical or such lay assistance as the Bishop shall from time to time

(2) There shall be appropriated as a fund towards (2) There shall be appropriated as a fund towards the cost of providing such assistance as aforesaid a part of the endowments of the united benefice; namely, an annual sum of £250 being part of a larger annual sum at present payable by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to the incumbent for the time being of the said benefice of Little Botton, Saint John and the said fund shall be paid by us to the diocesan board of finance of the diocese as

trustees to apply the same accordingly."

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, and the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 to 1930, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

"And whereas we have prepared this Scheme accordingly after consultation with the Diocesan Board of Finance of the Diocese of Worcester who have

offered no objection thereto:

"And whereas the said William Bishop of Worcester has approved the Scheme and in testimony of such approval has appended his signature to the

Scheme:

"And whereas the Right Honourable Clement Richard Attlee, First Lord of Your Majesty's Treasury, acting on behalf of Your Majesty, has signified to us his consent to the preparation and submission of the Scheme to Your Majesty in Council:

"And whereas the endowments and property belonging to the See of Worcester or held in the state thereof are described and referred

"Now therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners recommend and propose that upon and from the 1st day of April, 1948, all the endowments securities and other property described and referred to in the said Schedule and all other,

if any, the endowments belonging to or held in trust for the said Bishopric shall vest in us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners pursuant to the said Measure and that we shall be entitled absolutely to the benefit rents and profit thereof upon

"And we further recommend and propose that we shall pay to the Bishop for the time being of the See by equal quarterly instalments in respect of the quarters ended on the First day of April, the 1st day of July, the 1st day of October and the 1st day of January in every year the first such instalment to be the full quarter's payment due for the quarter ended on the 1st day of July, 1948, an annual stipend comprising the sum of £2.200 and also such sum, not exceeding £600 in any one year, as we shall sum, not exceeding foo in any one year, as we shall have been duly satisfied has been expended by him in connection with the travelling required in and for the carrying out of his official duties and obligations
