They write from Winfam of the 10th Inftant, that the King of Smeden's Army had made a halt 24 Leagues beyond that Place, in expectation of the coming up of their Forces from Poweren, which were advanced within 14 Leagues of them; that the King of Poland had got together most of his Saxon and Polish Forces near Cracow, and that the Nobility of Poland were assembling in several Places, in order to join him with more Troops.

From the Camp of the Allies at Over-Assel, July 24. The 15th Instant, his Excellency the Earl of Marlborough, with the other Generals, went over the Maese at Grave, to view the Camp marked out for our Army near that Place; and having dined with Licutenant-General Figed. Governor of Grave, they thought fit in their return to mark out our present Camp on this side the Maese, whither the Army came the next day, and lies with the Lest at a Village called Wichem, and the Right at another called Homen, about two Leagues and half from the Enemy's Camp, which is yet at Genney, where they have intrenched themselves. We laid two Bridges of Boats over the Maese upon our Right, and posted a good Guard of Foot and Dragoons on the other lide, who were ordered to cast up some Works at the head of the Bridges for their Security. The 18th, the Left Wing of the Army foraged near the Villages of Great Lynde, and Little Lynde, on the other lide of the Maese, with a Guard of 15co Foot and 500 Horse, under the Command of Major-General Raman. The 19th, the Right Wing foraged in the same Place with the like Guard, under the Command of Major-General Lanley; and the Bridges aloresal being somewhat out of order, so that all the Foragers could not then go over, such of the Army as had not foraged those two days, did it the 20th under a Guard of the same Strength with the tormer, commanded by the Rt.
