LAND DRAINAGE ACT, 1930.

Caernarvonshire Rivers (including the River Conway) Catchment Board.

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him under Section 4 (3) of the Land Drainage Act, 1930, has made an Order confirming a scheme submitted to him by the Caernarvonshire Rivers (including the River Conway) Catchment Board under Section 4 (1) (a) of the Act, for the transfer to the Catchment Board of all such rights, powers, duties, obligations and liabilities (including liabilities incurred in connection with works) of the Pwllheli Allottees and the Surveyor howsoever arising over or in connection with such parts of the Afon Erch and its tributary the Afon Ddu in the County of Caernarvon as are shown as main river on the map prepared by the Minister under Section 5 of the Land Drainage Act, 1930.

By Part III of the Second Schedule to the said Act, it is provided that if any person aggrieved by an Order desires to question its validity on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Act, or that any requirement of the Act has not been complied with, he may, within six weeks after the publication of this notice, make an application for the purpose to the High Court, and if any such application is duly made, the Court, if satisfied that the Order is not within the powers of the Act, or that the interests of the applicant have been substantially prejudiced by any requirements of the Act not having been complied with, may quash the Order either generally or in so far as it affects the applicant.
