## LONDON TRAFFIC ACT, 1924.

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Transport proposes, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by section 10 of the London Traffic Act, 1924, as amended by section 63 of the London Passenger Transport Act, 1933, to make Regulations to institute a one-way traffic working from north to south in Dartmouth Street and from south to north in Carteret Street, in the City of Westminster.

## MINISTRY OF TRANSPORT.

## TRUNK ROADS ACT, 1946.

The Minister of Transport hereby gives notice that he proposes to make an Order under section 4 of the Trunk Roads Act, 1946, the effect of which will be:—

(a) to provide for the construction by the Minister of a new road from a point on the road leading to Lilbourne from Three Ways Bridge in the County of Northampton approximately 100 yards from its junction with the Weedon-Atherstone-Brownhills Trunk Road in a southerly direction for a distance of approximately 100 yards to a point on the said Trunk Road approximately 50 yards west of the said junction;

(b) that section 4 of the Trunk Roads Act, 1936 (which modifies the Restriction of Ribbon Development Act, 1935, in its application to trunk roads) will apply to the new road on the date of the coming into operation of this Order as if it had become a trunk road on that date;

(c) that the Northamptonshire County Council will become the highway authority for the new road on the 1st day of April next after the date on which notice is given by the Minister to the Council that the new road is opened for through traffic.

Copies of the draft Order and the plan showing the line of the new road may be inspected by any person free of charge at all reasonable hours during a period of three months from 21st May, 1948, at the offices of the Ministry of Transport, Berkeley Square House, London, W.1, or at the offices of the Northamptonshire County Council County Hall, Northampton, or at the Northamptonshire County Council Office, Daventry, or at the offices of the Divisional Road Engineer, Cyprus Lodge, Magdala Road, Nottingham..

Any person may within the said period of three months from 21st May, 1948, object to the making of the Order by notice to the Minister addressed to Berkeley Square House, London, W.1.
