From the Camp of the Allies at Geldorp, July 30. We have advice, that the French having passed the Mucle about Venio, are come to Weers, which is within two Leagues of Hannet, so that our next march will be regulated, with regard to the Motions of the Enemy, who me hope to oblige to repass the Denzer, and then all the Country on this side of that River will be at our Discretion.
