

Spain. That the 14th, the French and Spanish Forces which were drawn together near that Town, passed over the Po and encamped at Castiverra, 2 miles from Cremona, from whence they would continue their march the 17th to Casal-Maggiore. The Bridge of Boats at Cremona was ordered to be brought down thither, and the best part of the French Army was to assemble together near that Place, whither the King of Spain intended to go the 21st. In the mean time the Prince of Vaudemont commanded the Forces left in the Camp of Rivalta in order to observe the Germans; who on their side had sent a strong Body of Horse and Foot towards Colomo, between the Rivers Parma and Lenza, to observe the Motions of our Army.

Hague, August 1. N. S. The King of Prussia went from this Place, the 26th past to Amsterdam, from whence he continued his Journey to Brandenburg the 29th, intending to pass by Utrecht, and to lie that Night at Zeist. The Earl Rivers, and Monsieur Overkirk General of the Dutch Horse, who lately came hither from England, are gone to the Army of the Allies in Brabant. Monsieur Hermikirk, late Ambassador from this State to the French Court, died here the 25th past.

Falmouth, July 29. Yesterday the Britannia of Fushing, a Privateer of 26 Guns, brought into this Port a French Prize of about 120 Tuns and 8 Guns belonging to Bourdeaux, bound home with Sugar, Indigo, &c. from Martinico, and the same day another Dutch Privateer likewise brought in a French Prize of about 100 Tuns, bound home from the West-Indies. Four Merchant Ships are just now come in here from the Barbadoes.

Hampton-Court, July 23. This day Robert Yurd Esq; was, by Her Majesty's Command, sworn Clerk of Her Majesty's most Honourable Privy-Council, in Extraordinary.

Whitehall, July 25. This day an Express arrived here from on board Her Majesty's Fleet commanded by Sir George Ross, who left them on the 23d Instant, early in the Morning under Sail, off of the Deansman's-Head, with a fair Wind.
