HE 19th Instant, the Duke of Ven-dofine went to Castelvetro, where the Forces which lately passed the Po at with them to Corre-Maggiore; The 20th he encaped at San-Secondo, on the River Taro near Cafil Maggiore, whither our Bridge of Boats was brought down from Cremona, which was made ready the 21st. The King of Spain came sway that day from Cremona, and arrived the 22d resident and from a common, and affive the 22d of Cafal-Maggiore, where he found the rest of the forces that were ordered to join the Army from the Camp of Rivalia. That day we received an Account, That Prince Engene had withdrawn the Forces which were not at a large that the Camp his Forces which were posted along the River Lanes, and has caused his Bridge of Boats over that River to be broken down, and that he was encamped with the best part of his Army near the River Grossels; whereupon the Duke of Vendifine pailed over the River Tiro with a Body of Horse and Dragoons, and marched to Colorno, to secure the Stone Bridge there over the River Parms. The rest of the Army followed in two Columns, one of which was to ford over the Tire, and the other was to pass over a Bridge of Boats we had made on that River: Butscarce 7 Battalions had passed over, when the River swelled so high, by reason of a great Rain that fell the night before, that it carried away our Bridge; however by the next day two other Bridges of Boats were prepared, over which the rest of those Forces marched, and they came up to our Camp; and then the Duke of Vendofine went to Cafal-Maggiore, and directed the Forces which were there to pass over the Po, and they came and encamped at Sacco, within Miles of Colorno. The King of Spain remains at Cafal-Maggiore with the Gendarmerie, which attends him as a Guard, the Carabiniers, 2 Regenents of Spanish Horse, and the Brigade of Marines. To morrow the Army will march in three Columns, and will pass over the Parma upon the Stone Bridge above-mentioned, and upon 2 Bridges of Boats which we have larely made, and will encamp at Sorbolo, on the River Lines, whither the King of Spain intends to come that day from Cafal-Maggiore. Last night a Party of about 50 Granadiers made a feint Attack upon the Cicadel, in order to entice the French to destroy some of their own Mines, which had this Effect, that upon the Approach of our Men, the French who were upon the Counterscarp retired and let fire to two Mines, but our Granadiers, instead of pursuing the Enemy, returned to their Trenches. Hamburgh, August 4. From the Camp of the Allier at Peer, Aug. 7. On Sating the 5th Instant the Army marched from Petit-Brugel, and encamped in this Place, having the River Deminell on our Right, Erlicum on our Lett, and Peer in our Front, where most of the Generals have taken their Cuarters. The Enemy have likewise removed their Camp from Hassel, and nave now their head Cuarters at Bringen, not far from Diest, on the Demer, having a small Rivulet before them, Our Army will continue here some days, while the necellary Preparations are making for some Siege, which his Excellency the Earl of Markovigh is to cover with the main Army. In the meant time our Forces will be employed in dimanting Peer and Brey, two small walled Yowns that have been of great use to the Enemy, in securing their Convoys. We shall likewise a track West, another walled sown lying between this Place and Yens, where they have had a considerable Garsson all this Summer, but have now quitted the Town, and lett only 100 Men to desend the Castle.
