

Hague, Aug. 3. N. S. Our freshest Accounts from the Confederate Army commanded by the Earl of Marlborough, say, they are encamped between Fier and Brux. The Duke of Burgundy's Army has repassed the Dijle at Dijle, and is encamped not far from that Town, where it has been joined by the Marquis of Balmoral, and the Prince de Tilly, with the Forces under their Command, but is yet inferior to ours in number. General Hertee has orders to march with the Confederate Forces which he at Kassel, Maastricht, and other Places on the Lower Rhine; it is said, at the long Detachment of the Garrison of Maastricht is to join them, and that they will undertake the Siege of Venlo, or some other Place on the Maas, for which purpose a very considerable Train of Artillery, with a formidable quantity of Ammunition, Bullets, &c. was sent that very long days ago from Dijle; And that General Colborn is to have the entire Direction of the Siege. The Estates General have lately made a Promotion of several General Officers. Sir David Milsted is frequently in Conference with the Deputies of the Admiralty.
