Warfam, July 5. The 28th patts a motion was made in the Affembly at Kolos for the reading of the Patta Conventa, which were to be form to by the King, which was opposed for fome time by the three Brethren Zamaskij whice defined that a caule of theirs might be firth flated, in tefer rence to an Effate now in the possefficient of the Prince 5. of the name, Mother to the prefer King, who claims it, is inheriting to the late Prince Zamoski, to which the King upon his nomination was pleated to rehome all his interest and pretentions, but the majority of wolces overbearing them, they fell upon the Articles, putting off this caule till the Diet for the Coronaxion.

In the first point relating to the Occonomy of the Kings Effate, they inade little progress onely voted the Admini-Aration thereof so be commined so the Nobles, referring the whole affair, with that about the Sak to the following Diet.

The next point was, That the facteding Kings thould not confert two Charges upon one perfon, Salvis modernis poffefforibus, which was much prefied by Polobinski, who presended to the Charge of General of Lythuania now poffeffed by the Duke Mitchael Radzevil, who is alto Vice-Chancellor of the imme place, which began to be debated with much hest, the faid Polobinski being leconded by the-Family of the Pazzi, but the Arch-Bithop of Gnafae and the Bithops interpoling, leemed we provail with them for the time, that this businels thould be referred to the cifion of fame perfors unconstructs

This ended, they fill upon the debate of the allowance made to King Cafimir of 50 thousand Crowns, which spit ter fome opposition was concluded on, and ordered to be duly paid.

The 29.h, the Brethren Zamoski again demanded that juffice might be done them in their caule according to the Kings promile upon this Nonrination, and that they might be either preferrly keled in the Eftatescontended for, or, have a firme promile made them of Juth a fitte indements but a great Rain falling, difmilled the Allembly for that day.

On Manday July 1. The Director of the Attembly defiring to proceed upon the Patta Conventa; the Brethren Zamoski opposed it, plainly saying, they would confent to nothing, no not the Election of the King, till their cause was first determined; several Speeches were interportimadewith much Oratory, but the Camoski perceiving nothing would be done for the r, made a protestation of the Nullity of any thing that should pass and went out of the Al'embly: the Dier fell then to examine the Legality of this proteffation, which it good would dillolve ike faid Allembly, but concluded it faulty, as being not made in due time, and a motion was triade, that the Zaméski floud be declared Rebels, lithey per lifte in their proteffation a but iwas at left more mittily concluded that they floud be lent to onely to appear the next morning at Kelo to revoke their proteflation.

In the mean time, things grew to fome height between the Paqqi and the house of Radqivil, both parties rallying apral the force they could, and putting them in form of battle near Kolo, intomuch as 'twasfeared they, would charge one another, and with their fivords diffute the Generalflip of Lythmania, of which the King having intelligence, lent to them, tequiring them to defind from their violent putpofes, left they obliged him to fend his C incular. Whereupon the Pazzî finding themlelves much the weaker party, were forced to quit their pretentions, leaving to Dake Michael Radgevil the policifion of both his Charges; after which, th Dukes Brother. Duke Bogiflaus was allo declared Grand Mariball of Lythuania. Polobinfhi thus defeated of his purpole, the Chancellour Pazzi afligned him the Revenue of two Governments in his. Province for two years, towards his hetter lubliflence, and General Pazzi, in lieu of latisfaction of his own pretentions, had the Palatinare of Villa's conferred on him : but le 'ighly refensing what had paft, lent a ch 1 nge to Duke Radzevil to fight the hext day Twely e to Twelve, which had losfart proceed that the perions were named on each parrty, all of them of Quality and Honou , but the King with the Lords Spiritual interpoing, the Duke Michael Radgeult and General Pazzi wete reconcil'd before the King, and embrated one another.

On Wednelway July 3, The Zamoski not appearing, the Senators and Deputte, from the Palatinates could not proceed upon their Arcicles as they intended, where upon leveral of the Alembly made investives against the m, defining they might be declared T aytors and Enemies to their Countrey; moving that the Evench Ambastader might be difinish, whom they accused as the Author of all that had past to their diffurbance, but at last broke up the Astembly for that day without any refolution.

The nextday they refolved to proceed notwithlanding the protestation, but agreed not upon any one point that day ; but the Sieut Polanoshi the Leutenant-General of Poland having been refuicing Charge, which both the Arch-Bishop and the General had defired the King to give him, openly the wed his diffactisfaction, ceclaring his refolution to leave the service upon the first opportunity.

Genous, July to.
