## TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 1st October, 1948, at 1 p.m. for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Act, 1939, to the amount of £180,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000 or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 4th October, 1948, to Saturday, the 9th October, 1948, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday 12 noon) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz:—

TEMPORARY (RECONSTRUCTION) REGULATIONS FOR FILLING VACANCIES FOR MECHANICAL AND ELECTRICAL ENGINEERS. (DEPARTMENTAL CLASS) IN THE MINISTRY OF SUPPLY

1 Men and women may compete under these Regulations

2 Every candidate must have been born on or before 1st January, 1919

3 No person is eligible for employment in the Ministry of Supply who is not a natural-born British subject and born within the United Kingdom or in one of the self-governing Dominions of parents also born within the United Kingdom or in one of the self-governing Dominions

No departure from this rule will be made without the special permission of the Minister of Supply, and then only in exceptional cases and in favour of candidates who are British subjects and who also satisfy one of the following conditions:—

(a) If natural-born British subjects, they must either

(i) have at least one parent who is or was at death a British subject, or

(ii) have resided in His Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment;

(b) If naturalized British subjects, they must have resided in His Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment

(c) If not qualified under (a) or (b) of this paragraph they must satisfy the Commissioners that they are so closely connected with His Majesty's dominions either by ancestry, upbringing or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in their favour

4 Every candidate must be a trained mechanical and/or electrical engineer and will be required to state on his application form, full details of engineering experience gained in the course of or after training

Normally he or she must either have obtained or be eligible for corporate membership of one of the Institutions of Civil, Mechanical or Electrical Engineers or Associate Fellowship of the Royal Aeronautical Society. For the purpose of these Regulations eligibility for Corporate Membership (or Associate Fellowship of the R Ae S) will be considered to include the following requirements —

(a) All engineering apprenticeship or pupillage including a minimum period of two years in the workshops of a reputable establishment, and

(b) (i) an engineering degree of a British University, or

(ii) a Higher National Certificate in mechanical or electrical engineering with the necessary endorsements, or

(iii) have passed examinations recognised by the above named professional Institutions as granting exemption from the whole of the Associate Membership examinations or from the Associate Fellowship examination of the R Ae S.

It will be a condition of recruitment that confirmation of appointments will be dependent upon the candidate securing Corporate Membership of either one of the aforementioned professional engineering institutions or Associate Fellowship of the R.Ae S. before the completion of his or her period of probationary service

5 Every candidate must satisfy the Commissioners as to his or her health and character

6 No person who is undergoing a course of study with the aid of a grant from public funds shall be eligible to compete before the completion of the course, unless he or she has previously obtained permission to do so from the authority which administers the grant

7 Every candidate must apply on the appropriate form within the time and in the manner of which notice is given by the Commissioners

8 The Commissioners reserve the right to make a selection for interview from those candidates who on their Application Forms and the resulting enquiries are found to be eligible. The selected candidates will be summoned to appear before a Selection Board appointed by the Commissioners; they may also be required to attend for a Preliminary informal interview. The Selection Board will recommend for appointment those candidates who appear to them to possess the most appropriate qualifications, having regard to the nature of the vacancies available.

9 Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate central education authority (e.g., the Ministry of Education, the Scottish Education Department, the Ministry of Education for Northern Ireland) has been notified to the Commissioners.

10 Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through Members of Parliament or other influential persons, except as referees to be named by them in their Application Form will disqualify them for appointment. The Interviewing Board will disregard recommendations from persons who are not personally acquainted with the candidate's work, whether at school, at the University, in the Forces, or otherwise

11 Every candidate shall pay a fee of £1 before the issue of a certificate of qualification for appointment

12 Candidates for Civil Service appointments are reminded that the Government have decided that no-one may be employed in the Civil Service in connection with work the nature of which is vital to the security of the State if he is believed to be

(1) either a member of the Communist Party or of a Fascist organisation; or

(2) associated with either the Communist Party or Fascist organisation in such a way as to raise legitimate doubts about his reliability

The Commissioners are not, as such, concerned with security enquiries which are the responsibility of the Minister in charge of the Department concerned and they cannot enter into correspondence with candidates on this matter or answer any questions. But they consider it advisable to warn all candidates that certain Departments and certain posts in other Departments will not be open to persons who are thought to fall within the above category.

*The Winchester—Preston Trunk Road (Knutsford Road and Other Junctions Improvements) Order, 1948*
