## OPENING OF PARLIAMENT.

Peersesses who wish to receive an invitation on the occasion of the forthcoming Opening of Parliament by His Majesty the King on Tuesday, October 26th, 1948, should send a written application to the Secretary to the Lord Great Chamberlain, House of Lords, before October 9th, 1948. The invitations will be restricted to Peersesses whose husbands are Members of the House of Lords at the present time. A ballot will be held and invitations will be issued on or before October 16th.

Peers' Eldest Sons desiring seats in the Peers' Eldest Sons' Box are requested to make a written application to the Secretary to the Lord Great Chamberlain before October 16th when tickets will be issued to those who have obtained a seat by ballot.

A limited number of tickets will be available for relatives and friends of Members of both Houses of Parliament who desire to witness the procession in the Royal Gallery. Applications by Peers for these tickets should reach the Secretary to the Lord Great Chamberlain by October 9th.

Parking facilities will be provided for the Opening of Parliament. All those who desire to take advantage of these facilities are requested to submit an application for a car label, with their request for invitations, to enable them to park their cars at the respective car parks. Peers attending by car, unaccompanied by Peersesses or guests, should also obtain a car label from the Secretary to the Lord Great Chamberlain.

The doors will be opened at 9.30 a.m. and will be closed at 10.30 a.m.

### Dress.

His Majesty the KING will wear Parliamentary robes and the Crown. The dress for Peers will be robes over morning or service dress. Those Peers not in possession of robes may wear morning or service dress.

Her Majesty the QUEEN and her Ladies-in-Waiting will wear evening dress with tiaras. It will not be obligatory for any Peersesses or other Ladies to be so dressed.

Peers: Robes over morning or service dress, or morning or service dress.

Other Gentlemen: Morning or service dress.

**TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.**

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 8th October, 1948, at 1 p.m. for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Act, 1939, to the amount of £190,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000 or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 11th October, 1948, to Saturday, the 16th October, 1948, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which

the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday 12 noon) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.
