"Whereas we, the Church Commissioners, are satisfied that the spiritual interests of the area defined in the subjoined Schedule and delineated on defined in the subjoined Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed would be best served by constituting it a new parish: "And whereas we are satisfied that a suitable endowment therefor will be provided: "And whereas there is no consecrated church within the area and the Church of All Saints therein here here approved by us as guitable to be the parish

has been approved by us as suitable to be the parish church of the new parish: "Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Joseph Wellington, Bishop of Truro (in testimony whereof has set his hand and affixed his episcopal seal to this scheme), we, the said Church Commissioners do humbly recommend and propose

as follows, that is to say: 1. Constitution (a) as from the licence thereto of a minister the area defined in the subjoined schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed shall be a separate district for spiritual purposes until the consecration of the Church of All Saints therein situated and (b) as from the date of the consecration of the said church the area shall become a new parish and (c) the name of the district (or parish as the case may be) shall be 'The District (or Parish) of All Saints, Carbis Bay.' 2.
