Whitehall, Sept. 9. Letters from Lisbon of the 25th of August, O. S. bring us the following Particulars concerning our Fleet; That on the 9th of August as they passed the Cape St. Vincent, and being come to Lagos Bay, the Admiral fent alhore for Refreshments only, (without coming to an Anchor) which were fent immediately to him. On the 15th our Forces, under the Command of his Grace the Duke of Ormand, landed between a Place called La Rosa and Port St. Mary's, the Spaniards from Cadiz oppoling them, but after a great many of their Men were killed, and the Governor of La Rosa was mortally wounded, they were routed and run away, and the Fort thereupon furrendred. On the 16th they mar-ched to a Place called the Connelar, passing behind the Fort Santa Catalina and Port St. Mary's, and took the Caffles there, where the Spanish and French Men of War lay, so that those Ships seemed to be at our Mercy. That day they came to Port St. Mary's, where there was no appearance of Refistance; and the Express who brought the Letters affirms, that in his fight they took Possession of that Port. By an Express from Lages on the 22d we had Advice, that there was heard at that Place, although 42 Leagues distant from Cadie, a great noise of aring of great Guns without intermission. There are Reports of the Surrender of Cadiz, which although not altogether certain, yet from the Measures taken we have reason to expect News of good Success.
