Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through Members of Parliament or other influential persons, except as referees to be named by them in their Application Forms, will disqualify them for appointment. The Selection Board will disregard recommendations from persons who are not personally acquainted with the candidate's work, whether at school, at the University, or otherwise.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice, under Clause 13 of the General Regulations respecting appointments to His Majesty's Civil Establishments under the Order in Council of 22nd July, 1920, that with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of the Treasury, Note (2) appended to the Scale of Fees dated the 7th May, 1948, and

published in the London Gazette of the same date, has been amended to read as follows, viz. :—

"(2) When a person holding a situation in any Department is presented to the Civil Service Commissioners with a view to his appointment to some other situation in the same department, he will not be required to pay any further fee, unless he is required to undergo a further test in regard to knowledge and ability, and, in that case, he will not be required to pay any greater fee than the difference between the fee which is leviable in respect of his new appointment and the fee which, according to the above scale, is appropriate to the situation which he already holds; but in the case of a situation filled by a limited competition no reduction will be made if the fee leviable in respect of the new appointment is 5s. or less. This provision will not apply in the case of a situation filled by open competition, whether by written examination or interview."

MINISTRY OF FOOD

PUBLIC HEALTH (IMPORTED FOOD) REGULATIONS, 1937 AND 1948.

The Minister of Food gives notice, in pursuance of the above-named Regulations, that he hereby recognises the Official Certificate, of which particulars are given in the Schedule hereto, as showing (a) that the meat to which it relates was derived from animals inspected ante- and post-mortem and passed in accordance with criteria satisfactory to the Minister and (b) that all necessary precautions for prevention of danger to public health were taken in the dressing or preparing and packing of the meat.

The Certificate being in the form of a label, recognition will apply only if the label is securely affixed to the meat or to the package containing the meat and if the label has not in any other circumstances or on any other occasion been used as an Official Certificate.

MINISTRY OF TRANSPORT.

TRUNK ROADS ACT, 1946.

The Minister of Transport hereby gives notice that he proposes to make an Order under section 4 of the Trunk Roads Act, 1946, the effect of which will be:

(a) to provide for the construction by the Minister of a new road from a point on Campbell Road in the Borough of Caernarvon approximately 45 yards south-east of its junction with the Fish-guard — Aberystwyth — Dolgelley—Caernarvon—Bangor (Menai Suspension Bridge) Trunk Road for a distance of approximately 85 yards to a point on the said Trunk Road approximately 60 yards north-east of the said junction;

(b) to provide for the stopping up entirely of the existing junction between the said Trunk Road and Campbell Road aforesaid when the new road has been completed;

(c) that the Caernarvon Borough Council will become the highway authority for the new road on the first day of April next after the date on which notice is given by the Minister to the Council that the new road is opened for the purposes of through traffic.

Copies of the draft Order and the plan showing the line of the new road may be inspected by any person free of charge at all reasonable hours during a period of three months from 5th November, 1948, at the offices of the Ministry of Transport, Berkeley Square House, London, W.1, or at the offices of the Caernarvonshire County Council, Shirehall Street, Caernarvon, or at the offices of the Caernarvon Borough Council, Guild Hall, Caernarvon, or at the offices of the Divisional Road Engineer, Brighton House, Richmond Road, Rhyl, Flint.
