RECRUITMENT OF YOUNG MEN WHO HAVE COMPLETED A PERIOD OF COMPULSORY NATIONAL SERVICE FOR THE EXECUTIVE CLASS (AND CORRESPONDING DEPARTMENTAL CLASSES) OF THE HOME CIVIL THE HOME CIVIL SERVICE AND FOR EXECUTIVE POSTS IN BRANCH B OF THE FOREIGN SERVICE.

1. Age. Candidates must have been born on or after 2nd September, 1927.

Vationality. Candidates must be British sub-They must also satisfy one of the following 2. Nationality. iects. conditions:

(a) If natural-born British subjects, they must either

(i) have at least one parent who is or was at

death a British subject; or

(ii) have resided in His Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment;

• (b) If naturalized British subjects, they must have resided in His Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment;

(c) If not qualified under (a) or (b) of this paragraph they must satisfy the Commissioners that they are so closely connected with His Majesty's dominions either by ancestry, upbringing or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in their features. favour.

3. Education. No precise educational qualifica-tions are prescribed, but candidates will be expected to have attained the standard of education of persons who have had whole time systematic education up to the age of at least 17 years.

4. Service. Candidates must have completed before the first day of the examination a period of compulsory national service under the National Service Acts; and they may not compete in more than two examinations under these Regulations after the completion of such service.

5. Health and Character. Successful candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners as to their health and character.

6. Examination. The candidates will undergo a written examination consisting of papers in English and Arithmetic, three General Papers and a test of General Intelligence.

Of the candidates who obtain the highest marks in the written examination a certain number, to be fixed by the Commissioners, will be summoned to an interview at which the Interviewing Board will award each candidate a mark for his record and personal qualities.
