From vice Camp of the Allies at Soutendael, October 2. Our Batteries began to play upon Stevenjwhert on Saturalay, and continued firing without intermittion till about 10 lait night, when the Belieged having abandoned the Counterfearp, and our Men being ready to mount the Breach, they bear a Parley, and deired to Capitulate; whereupon the Holtages being exchanged, the Articles of Capitulation were this day agreed upon, and the Garifon, confifting of about 400 Men, are to be conducted to Namur. We found in the Town near 300 Barrels of Powder, with all manner of Stores in proportion, and great quantities of Provisions; We have not loft one Officer, and not above 5 or 6 private Men, in the taking of the Place: Of the Enemy we recken 50 killed, belides the wounded. We expect every day to hear that the Batteries are finished before Raremonde, and do not question to be Masters of the Place in 4 or 5 days after they begin to thre. Moaileur Dopff is gone to Landau, to conter with the King of the Romans and Prince Lewis of Baden about the Security of the Upper Rhine, and the Measures to be taken to pur a stop to the carther Designs or the Elector of Bazuria.
