"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted inter alia that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by an Order in Council dated the 19th day of *August*, 1871, sanction was given to the introduction of the rating of Band Boy in the Royal Navy:

"And whereas by an Order in Council dated the 20th day of *May*, 1903, provision was made for the entry of Band ratings, including Band Boys, into the Royal Marines:

"And whereas we are of opinion that the title 'Band Boy' does not now reflect the standard of musical training which the rating receives:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the alteration of the title from 'Band Boy' to 'Boy Musician':

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have been informed of this alteration."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

Thomas Bishop of Carlisle (in witness whereof he has signed this Scheme), have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting the union of the benefice of Silloth, Saint Paul, and the benefice of Silloth, Christ Church, both situate in the diocese of Carlisle.

"SCHEME.

"1. *Union of Benefices and Parishes.* The said benefice of Silloth, Saint Paul, and the said benefice of Silloth, Christ Church, shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Silloth, Christ Church with Saint Paul,' and the parishes of the said benefices shall also be united into one parish for ecclesiastical purposes.

"2. *Taking effect of union.* Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the Reverend George Martin Hill Ridgway if he is then incumbent of the said benefice of Silloth, Christ Church, shall, with his consent (testified by his signature hereto) be the first incumbent of the united benefice.

"3. *Parish Church.* The parish church of the parish of Christ Church, Silloth, shall be the parish church of the united parish.

"4. *Registers.* The marriage registers in duplicate current at the church of Saint Paul, Silloth, shall be sent by the incumbent of the united benefice to the Registrar General to be closed officially.

"5. *Parsonage House.* (a) The parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Silloth, Christ Church, shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice.

(b) So soon as conveniently may be after the union has taken effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Silloth, Saint Paul, and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us, the said Church Commissioners, at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient, and the net proceeds of such sale shall be held and invested by us for the benefit of the united benefice.

"6. *Patronage.* After the union has taken effect, in every series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to the united benefice the patrons of the benefice of Silloth, Christ Church, shall have the first and second turns and the patron of the benefice of Silloth, Saint Paul shall have the third turn."

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, and the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 to 1930, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that it shall be and become effectual in Law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette.

(e) that on the first day of April next after the date on which notice is given by the Minister to the Council that the new road is opened for the purposes of through traffic the Council will become the highway authority for the new road.
