- "3. Parish Church. The parish church of the parish of Christ Church, Silloth, shall be the parish church of the united parish.
- "4. Registers. The marriage registers in duplicate current at the church of Saint Paul, Silloth, shall be sent by the incumbent of the united benefice to the Registrar General to be closed officially.
- "5. Parsonage House. (a) The parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Silloth, Christ Church, shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice.
- (b) So soon as conveniently may be after the (b) So soon as conveniently may be after the union has taken effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Silloth, Saint Paul, and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us, the said Church Commissioners, at such time or times and in such manner and the same are to use that same arresting and in all respects as to us shall seem expedient, and the net proceeds of such sale shall be held and invested by us for the benefit of the united benefice.
- "6. Patronage. After the union has taken effect, in every series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to the united benefice the patrons of the benefice of Silloth, Christ Church, shall have the first and second turns and the patron of the benefice of Silloth, Saint Paul shall have the third turn."
