WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 2nd day of February, 1949, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for changing the name of the parish of Saint Philip, Aldrington, in the diocese of Chichester and for altering the boundaries of that parish and of the parishes of Bishop Hannington Memorial Church, Hove; The Good Shepherd, Preston, Brighton; Hangleton; and West Blatchington, all in the same diocese.

"Whereas by an Order in Council published in the London Gazette of the 7th July, 1911, there was assigned to the church of Saint Philip, Aldrington, situate in the parish of Aldrington in the said diocese of Chichester, a District Chapelry by the name of 'Saint Philip, Aldrington,' and the said District Chapelry is now a Parish:

"And whereas the said parish of Saint Philip, Aldrington, is situate wholly within the Municipal Borough of Hove and the name of Saint Philip, Aldrington, is no longer suitable:

"And whereas we are satisfied that it is desirable that the boundaries of the said parishes should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the Right Reverend George, Bishop of Chichester, consents to the proposed arrangements (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme):

"Now, therefore, we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme first, the name of the said parish of Saint Philip, Aldrington, shall be altered to 'The Parish of Saint Philip, Hove,' and secondly, the boundaries of that parish and of the said parishes of Bishop Hannington Memorial Church, Hove; The Good Shepherd, Preston, Brighton; Hangleton; and West Blatchington, shall be altered in the manner described in the Schedule and delineated on the map annexed to this Scheme.

"THE SCHEDULE.

"1. The territory (shown by the pink colour on the map) to be annexed to the parish of Bishop Hannington Memorial Church, Hove.

All that portion of the parish of Saint Philip, Hove, which lies to the north-east of the middle of Portland Road.

"2. The territory (coloured green on the map) to be annexed to the parish of Hangleton.

All that portion of the parish of Bishop Hannington Memorial Church, Hove, which lies to the north of the middle of Hangleton Road.

"3. The territory (coloured brown on the map) to be annexed to the parish of West Blatchington.

All that portion of the parish of The Good Shepherd, Preston, Brighton, which is bounded on the north-west by the parish of West Blatchington, on the south-west by the parish of Bishop Hannington Memorial Church, Hove and by the parish of Saint Agnes, Hove and on the north-east by an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Agnes, Hove from the parish of The Good Shepherd, Preston, Brighton, in

the middle of the junction of the Drove-way and Goldstone Crescent and continuing thence north-westwards along the middle of Goldstone Crescent to the boundary which divides the parish of The Good Shepherd, Preston, Brighton, from the parish of West Blatchington."

And whereas the provisions of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners for England have duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the Ninth day of February, 1949, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Church Commissioners for England, have prepared and now lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme pursuant to the Episcopal Endowments and Stipends Measure, 1943, for vesting in us, the said Church Commissioners, all endowments and other property belonging to or held in trust for, the Bishopric of Blackburn or the Bishop thereof and for securing to the said Bishop the reduced stipend deemed to us appropriate:

"Whereas the Right Reverend Wilfred Bishop of Blackburn has requested us, the said Church Commissioners, to prepare a Scheme with respect to the See:

"And whereas we have prepared this Scheme accordingly after consultation with the Diocesan Board of Finance of the Diocese of Blackburn who have offered no objection thereto:

"And whereas the said Wilfred Bishop of Blackburn has approved the Scheme and in testimony of such approval has appended his signature to the Scheme:

"And whereas the Right Honourable Clement Richard Attlee, First Lord of Your Majesty's Treasury, acting on behalf of Your Majesty, has signified to us his consent to the preparation and submission of the Scheme to Your Majesty in Council:

"And whereas the endowments and property belonging to the See of Blackburn or held in trust therefor or for the Bishop thereof are described and referred to in the Schedule hereunder written:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Church Commissioners recommend and propose that upon and from the first day of January, One thousand nine hundred and forty nine, all the endowments securities and other property described and referred to in the said Schedule and all other if any the endowments belonging to or held in trust for the said Bishopric shall vest in us the said Church Commissioners pursuant to the said Measure and that we shall be entitled absolutely to the benefit rents and profit thereof upon and from that date.

"And we further recommend and propose that we shall pay to the Bishop for the time being of the See by equal quarterly instalments in respect of the quarters ended on the Thirty first day of March the Thirtieth day of June the Thirtieth day of September and the Thirty first day of December in every year the first such instalment to be the full quarter's payment due for the quarter ended on the Thirty first day of March, One thousand nine hundred and forty nine, an annual stipend comprising the sum of £2,000 and also such sum, not exceeding £400 in any one year, as we shall have been duly satisfied has been expended by him in connection with the travelling required in and for the carrying out of his official duties and obligations as Bishop.
