Lisbon, Octob. 16. N. S.

Hree days ago arrived here a Tartane fieighted by the Alcayde of Tangier to carry 14 English Captives, who are fet ashore here, and delivered to Paul Methuen Esq; Her Majesty of Great Britain's Envoy Extra-

ordinary at this Court.

Rome, Sept. 30. Last week we received an Account, That the French had surprised a little Fort in the Frarese, and had burnt 4 Barks laden with Salt for the use of the City of Ferrara, which were going up the Po, suspecting that they were designed for the Imperial Army, upon which a Congregation of State was held, and the Pope has fince ordered about 4000 Men to be fent into that Country for its greater Security. Letters from Noples of the 28th Instant fay, that Sentence of Death had been published there against the Marquis del Vasto, Don Malizio Carasti, and the Dake of Telesa, who sometime ago retired from thence into Germany, being in the Emperor's Inverest: That 2 French Regiments of Foot were ordered from that place to Milan, and a Companies of Spaniards to Barcelona; And that the Gailys of Naples were gone to cruize on the Coast of Istria.

Venice, Office, 13. Letters from the Imperial Army of the 8th Instant say, That both Armies were still in the same Posts. The King of Spain left the French Comp the 2d Instant, in order to return to Madrid, having before his departure made the Duke de Vendesme a Grandee of Spain, and Knight of the Order of

Rubberne, Octob. 16. On the 12th Inflant a Country actived here from Vienna, with the Emperor's Approbation of the kefolutions taken by the Diet on the 15th and 5th of the laft Mouth against France and Bavaria, which for actival Lamberg, his drift Commissioner, has accordingly ratified. He delivered to the Diet at the lametime Copies of the Emperor's Letter to the Election of Bavaria, and if another to the Affordated Cincles, promising them his Ulittance in case that Elector did not death from distincting the Feace of the Empire; as also a Letter from the King of the Romans, thanking the Fiest for their speedy and vigorous Resolutions in the Affair of Ulin, and offering to affift them, though with the Hezard of his Person; and enclosing several Letters from the Court of Bavaria to France, which had been intercepted, whereby the Elector's Engagements are plainly discovered, particularly by one, wherein the Maissial de Catinat is desired to tend 30 Battalions and 40 Squadrons to his Affishance, as had been promised by France. The 15th another Counter came from Vienna, with the Declaration of War in the Name of the Empire, and the Emperor's advocatoria, against France and Sp. in, all which Papers will forthwish be made publick. Cologne, Ostob. 24. The Elector of Cologne was expected at Luxembourgh the 20th Instant, and it is faid he intends to proceed from thence to Frances Count Tallard, with his Detachment, is marched towards Triers to join a Bod; of French Forces encamped near that Place, who have lately feized the Towns of Sarbourg and Andernach, and feem to have a Defign upon Traerbach. The Elector Palatine returned to Duffeldorp the 17th Instant, faid the Bishop of Raab is gone thither to confer with him. The Dutch, Forces which came lately into our Neighbourhood, under the Command of Major-General Hompesch, muched the 15th Instant to Breul, where they continue encamped, and a Detachment of 1000 Horse was fent out from thence this morning towards Bon. We hear, the Imperialists and the French have lately had an Engagement near Haningen, wherein the former obtained a compleat Victory over the Enemy, though with the Lofs of many of

the Enemy, though with the Loss of many of their Men.

Hamburgh, Ostob. 24. Letters from Cracow give an Account, That the King of Sweden has had a Wall from his Horke, and broke his Leg, but that he was past all Danger, and in a fair way of Receivery. The Scheferary of the Embally appointed to offer the Mediation of the Republick of Poland to that Prince, in order to adjust Marters between him and their King, was returned towards Warfaw, but without any positive Answer. In the mean time there have happened several Skinnishes between the Swedish Treops and those of Oginsky, which last have usually had the Advantage; and it is said, 30 squadrens of Polith Herse are term to the Frontiers of Lithuania, with intent to oblige the Swedish Fronces quartered in that Durchy to retire from thence. The King of Poland, acc rding to our last Accounts from Wariaw, was shill there; soco of his Saxon Foor are marched into the Polith Prossing destained Passage through the King of Prussia's Tecritories. Letters from Berlin say, that King has received a Letter from the Emperor, concerning the Proceedings of the Elector of Bavaria; to which he has returned an Academy to miling. That he would readily enter into any Meatines that should be thought proper for bringing over that Elector to the Common Cause, or putting him out of a Condition to oppose it. A Treaty is lately concluded between the Emperor and his Putsitan Majesty, for his entering into the Grand Alliance, whereby he also engages to continue in the Emperor's Service the Soo Men of his Troops that are at prefer employed therein. They write from Coppenhagen, that the Emperor's Resident there has agreed with the Minuters at that Court for 1500 Foot and 1000 Horse to be taken in the Emperor's Pay.
