The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz.:—

TEMPORARY (RECONSTRUCTION) REGULATIONS FOR FILLING VACANCIES FOR ASSISTANT ELECTRICAL ENGINEERS AND ELECTRICAL ENGINEERS IN THE ELECTRICAL ENGINEERING DEPARTMENT OF THE ADMIRALTY.

1. Men only may compete under these regulations.

2. Every Assistant Electrical Engineer candidate must have been born on or after 2nd August, 1905, and on or before 1st August, 1924. Every Electrical Engineer candidate must have been born on or before 1st August, 1919. The Commissioners have not specified an upper age limit for Electrical Engineer vacancies. In general, however, Government Departments require a reasonable period of service from persons newly appointed to the Civil Service; and accordingly the Commissioners reserve the right to give weight to this factor in considering candidates for posts of Electrical Engineers who are over 50 years of age.

3. No person is eligible for employment in the Admiralty who is not a natural-born British subject and born within the United Kingdom or in one of the self-governing Dominions of parents also born within the United Kingdom or in one of the self-governing Dominions.
