

Commander or Surgeon Lieutenant-Commander (D), at the discretion of the Admiralty provided he

(a) has attained seven years' seniority as a confirmed Surgeon Lieutenant or Surgeon Lieutenant (D),

(b) has completed 2 years' sea service (Surgeon Lieutenants only)

(c) is recommended for advancement.

*Surgeon Commander, Surgeon Commander (D) and above.*

Promotion to the rank of Surgeon Commander or Surgeon Commander (D), and above to be by selection.

"6. *Compulsory retirement for Age.*—  
Surgeon Vice Admiral (Medical Director-General) On ceasing to hold the appointment or on attaining the age of 65 if not superseded before.

*" Part II.*

*" Instructor Officers.*

"1. Officers to be entered in two grades but to be on a common seniority list. The grades to be distinguished as:—

(a) Instructor Officers (Dagger) to be selected from candidates possessing First or Second Class Honours Degrees, and

(b) Instructor Officers.

"2. Instructor Officers (Dagger) to be entered in the rank of Acting Instructor Lieutenant and to be confirmed in rank on completion of six months' preliminary training. On confirmation their seniority to be antedated to a date 2 years from date of entry. This antedate of seniority to count during the Officer's Short Service for the purpose of determining

(a) his seniority, and

(b) his eligibility for increases of pay and for no other purpose.

If a Short Service Officer is transferred to the Permanent List this antedate of seniority to count also for the purposes of promotion.

"3. Instructor Officers (without dagger) to be entered in the rank of Instructor Sub-Lieutenant and to be promoted to the rank of Instructor Lieutenant after one year's service.

"4. All Instructor Officers to be entered, initially, on a Short Service engagement for a period of 3, 4 or 5 years. Officers who leave the service at the end of the Short Service engagement or whose employment is terminated earlier as a result of invaliding for causes not due to their own default, or in other circumstances approved by the Admiralty, to be eligible for gratuities at such rates and under such conditions as may be laid down by Order in Council.

"5. *Emergency List.*—Officers leaving the service on completion of their Short Service engagement to be placed on an Emergency List and be liable for service in war or emergency during the subsequent four years.

"6. *Transfers to the Permanent List.*—Officers who so desire to be transferred to the Permanent List at Admiralty discretion.

*"7. Promotion.*—

*Instructor Lieutenant-Commander.*

An Instructor Lieutenant to be promoted to the rank of Instructor Lieutenant-Commander, at the discretion of the Admiralty, provided he

(a) has attained eight years' seniority as Instructor Lieutenant

(b) is recommended for promotion.

*Instructor Commander and above.*

Promotion to the rank of Instructor Commander and above to be by selection.

"8. *Compulsory retirement for Age.*—  
Instructor Captain ... .. At age 55.  
Instructor Commander ... .. At age 52.  
Instructor Lieutenant-Commander ... At age 48."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice

PRESENT

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 24th day of March, 1949, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for altering the boundaries of the parish of Saint John, Wembley, and of the parish of Greenford (or Great Greenford), hereinafter referred to as the parish of Greenford, both in the diocese of London, and for constituting parts of those parishes so altered together with a part of the parish of Saint Andrew, Sudbury, in the same diocese, a new parish:

"SCHEME

"Whereas, we the Church Commissioners are satisfied (1) that it is desirable that the boundaries of the parish of Saint John, Wembley and of the parish of Greenford should be altered in the manner described in Part I of the subjoined Schedule and as delineated on the map hereto annexed and (2) that the spiritual interests of the area defined in Part II of the said Schedule and delineated on the said map would be best served by constituting it a new parish and that a suitable endowment therefor will be provided:

"And whereas there is within the area described in Part II of the said Schedule a consecrated church known as the church of All Hallows, North Greenford, which has been approved by us, the said Church Commissioners, as suitable to be the parish church of the new parish and of which the patronage belongs to the Bishop of London by virtue of an agreement in writing dated the twenty-first day of December, 1948, and made pursuant to section 9 of the New Parishes Measure, 1943:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend William, Bishop of London (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and affixed his episcopal seal to this Scheme), we, the said Church Commissioners do humbly recommend and propose as follows, that is to say:—

"1. As from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council confirming this Scheme (a) the boundaries of the said parish of Saint John, Wembley and of the said parish of Greenford shall be altered in the manner described in Part I of the said Schedule and as delineated on the map annexed hereto and (b) the area defined in Part II of the said Schedule and delineated on the said map shall be a new parish.

"2. The Church of All Hallows, North Greenford aforesaid shall be the parish church of the parish.

"3. The name of the parish shall be 'The Parish of All Hallows, North Greenford'.

"4. The parish shall be in the Archdeaconry of Middlesex and in the rural deanery of Ealing.

"THE SCHEDULE

"Part I

"The territory (shown by the green colour on the map) to be annexed to the parish of Saint John, Wembley:—

"All that portion of the parish of Greenford which lies to the northeast of the Piccadilly railway line of the London Transport Executive and is contiguous to the said parish of Saint John, Wembley.

"Part II

"The area comprising:—

"All those contiguous portions of the parish of Greenford, the parish of Saint Andrew, Sudbury and the parish of Saint John, Wembley (shown by the pink, blue and brown colours respectively on the map) which taken together are bounded upon the southeast by the parish
