Vienns, Nov. 15. N.S. This division the Feast of St. Leopold, whose Name the Emperor bears, was observed here as usual, with great Solemnity, and there was an Optra, with other Rejoycings, at Court. The King and Queen of the Romans are at present at Praeg, in Bibemia, from whence they are expected here in a short time.

Bellin, November 21. Letters from Warfand fiv, Monsteur Du Heron, the French Envoy, had been seized there by a Party of Dragoons as he was abroad in his Coach, and was carry'd out of Town, but it was not known whither; The reason why he has met with this usage, is supposed to be, that he had neglected the repated Orders both of the King and the Sehate, That he should depart from thence, and that he talked with too much freedom of the that he talked with too much freedom of the Proceedings of that Court, particularly upon the occasion of their fending a Body of Troops into the Emperor's Service. Francfort, Nov. 23. Prince Lewis of Baden is now at Ellingen, fettling the Repartition of the Winter Quarters for his Forces, which are already fe-parated, and are cantoned in feveral places within our Lines near the Rhine. The French Army is also gone into Winter Quarters in Afface. General Thungen being indisposed, went some days ago to Baden, to ule the Water there. The French continue to fortifie the finall Town of Newbourg, on this fide of the Rhine, where they keep a numerous Garrison; We hear that a Party of 800 Hustari making an Excursion lately that way, fell upon 500 of that Garrison, who were foraging with a Guard of 400 Men, and defeated them, killing above 200 of the Enemy, and taking Prifoners above 100, among whom are a Lieutenant Colonel, 4 Captains, and as many Lieutenants. The Landgrave of Hesse Cassell has been to confer with the Elector of Triers at Collente, from whence he is now come to Braubach; He has sent to Pieces of Cannon to Rhimfeld, and the Landgrave of Hesse Darmstad, has tent them 4: and a Regiments of the Forces of Inventores. and 4 Regiments of the Forces of Lunenbourg are marching thither to reinforce that Garrison, so that we look upon that place to be fecure at prefent from the Attempts of the French, whole Defigns on that fide have also been disappointed by the long Defence of the Castle of Traerback, and the March of the Paslatine Forces from the Upper, and the Hessian from the Lower-Rhine, towards the Miscele. faid that a Negociation has been carried on for bringing over the Elector of Bavaria from the French Interest, but there is little appearance of Succets, his Demands being very unreasonable; as among other things, That the Circles of Suabia and Franconia thould reimburse him the Expenses he has been at on account of the present War; That the House of Ansiria should engage to allow him a Pension of 3coco Fiorins during his Life, in lieu of a like Pension which was promised him by Spain; That the Marquitate of Burgau, and the County of Ortenbaura near Lintz, he given up to him; be-Ortenbourg, near Lintz, be given up to him; befides feveral other places he lays claim to, as having formerly depended on the Durchy of Bavaria and the Upper Palarinare.
