Unfortunately a few weeks after this incident Bobbett himself sustained a fatal injury at the Colliery.

His position was such that his back was never more than six inches from a live rail, contact with which by either man might have proved fatal to both. The man's struggles continued throughout most of the period of fifteen minutes that Mr. Bradley was with him and while the train was being passed overhead he bit Mr. Bradley on the right forefinger. The man later died in hospital from his injuries.
