From the Imperial Head Quarters at Carbonara, November 21. N. S. On the 14th Instant, the Count de... came out of Mantua with a Body of 2000 Men, and having been joined by a Detachment from the French Army, marched to Borgoforte; he soon possessed himself of the Town, which was defended but by a few Soldiers, and Lieutenant-Colonel Malvezzi, who commanded there, retired into the Castle with the Garrison consisting of 250 Men; He had before received Orders to quit that Place, which was now of no farther use to us, since we had secured the Communication of our Posts on either side of the Po, by removing the Bridge of Boats we had over that River from Borgoforte to...; But the French had surrounded the Town before he could put these Orders in execution. Prince Eugene having received Advice of the Count de Telfe's March, ordered two Regiments of Imperial Foot, and 2000 of Horse, and a Battalion of Danish Troops, which lay on the other side the Po, to march from their Quarters, and rendezvous at Governolo, and Count Guido Lamberg was sent with this Body to endeavour to bring off our Garrison, but he finding it impracticable to attack so strong a Body as the Enemy was, contented

himself with securing the Cannon, and bringing away the Men we had left in the Island of Borgoforte, which the French had not yet attacked, and with sending privately to Lieutenant-Colonel Malvezzi, to let him know, That if he could any way get off, his Highness would favour his Retreat; but Answer was brought, That it was too late; and accordingly the Lieutenant-Colonel surrendered the 15th at Discretion. We hear, the Duke of Vendosme has altered his design of taking his Winter Quarters at Guastalla, and will winter at Mantua, where the French have at present 30 Battalions of Foot, and 2000 Horse, besides 6000 Men at Modena, as many at Carpi, and the like number at Guastalla, and some other Troops which are posted along the Oglio: It is also said, that Monsieur Albergotti is drawing together a Body of 5000 of the Enemy at San Martino in the Modenese, in order to make a Bridge there over the River Secchia.

Vienna, November 25. My Lord Paget, late Ambassador Extraordinary from the Crown of Great Britain at the Ottoman Port, had Audience on the 22d Instant of the King and Queen of the Romans at Gunterdorf, 9 German miles from hence, and the next day proceeded on his Journey to England by the way of Prague. Their Majesties came the same night to Corn-Nieubourg, about two miles from hence, and yesterday made their Entry into this City, having been met out of Town by the Emperor and Empress, the Arch Duke, and the 4 Arch Duchesses, attended by all the great Officers of the Court; They were saluted with a treble Discharge of our Cannon, and the Streets were lined by the Burghers in Arms: They went directly to the Cathedral Church of St. Stephen's, where Te-Deum was sung for their happy Return, and the King's successful Campaign; And afterwards proceeded to the Imperial Palace, where there was a great Entertainment; in the midst whereof, to compleat our Joy, a Courier arrived with Letters from Count Goes, the Imperial Envoy at the Hague; to the Emperor, giving an Account of the great and glorious Success of the Confederate Fleet and Land Forces at Vigo, which gave more Satisfaction than can well be expressed, nor can it be described how every one was pleased with the prospect of the happy Consequences which are expected from that important Blow; and from Her Majesty of Great Britain's Auspicious Reign.

Ratisbonne, November 30. The Electoral College is settling several Matters in relation to the Forces which the Imperial Diet has resolved shall be maintained by the Empire, for carrying on the War; and the Countries which the Circle of Burgundy consists of being in the hands of France and Spain, Endeavours will be used to persuade the other Circles to furnish the Quota that is rated, in order to the making the 120000 Men effective. The Elector of Bavaria is putting part of his Forces into Winter Quarters along the Danube; from Hingen to Ingoistad: It is said, he has left a Garrison of 5000 Men at Ulm; and that a strong Detachment of his Army is to march to Donauwerth, with intent, as is supposed, to make head against the 8000 Saxons, and the other Troops that are drawing together to make an Irruption into his Country. We have no certain Account where he is in Person, but it is reported that he is very ill of a Fever.

Frankfort, December 3. The Declaration of War, in the name of the Empire, against the French King and the Duke of Anjou, and their Adherents, and the Emperor's Advocatoria, were published here the 30th of the last Month; and the next day was observed as a publick Fast, to implore God's Blessing upon the Arms of the Emperor and his Allies. The War is also declared in the Imperial Army against the Elector of Bavaria, and effectual means will be taken to bring him to Reason; For this purpose several Imperial Regiments which lay about Philipsbourg, are ordered to march towards the Frontiers of Bavaria, as is also that of the young Duke of Hanover, which has been quartered here some days, and more Forces which are now quartered in the Emperor's Hereditary Countries, will be employed.
