At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 28th day of July, 1949.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 28th day of June, 1949 (P.M. 4892/49) in the words following, viz. :—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas under various Orders in Council, scales of retired pay and pension have been laid down for Officers, Warrant (now known as "Branch") Officers, Petty Officers, Non-Commissioned Officers and Men of Your Majesty's Royal Navy and Royal Marines; and for members of Queen Alexandra's Royal Naval Nursing Service:

"And whereas we are of opinion that revised service retired pay and pension regulations should be introduced:

"We beg humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to authorise us to award retired pay, pensions and gratuities at the rates and subject to the conditions specified in the Schedule annexed hereto.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified Their concurrence in these proposals.

" SCHEDULE

" SECTION I

" *Half-pay of Admirals of the Fleet*

"1. An Admiral of the Fleet will be eligible during periods subsequent to the 18th December 1945 for which he does not receive full pay, for half-pay at the rate of £1,800 a year.

" SECTION II

" *Service Retired Pay and Gratuities for Regular Naval and Marine Officers*

"2. The provisions in this Section relate to officers holding permanent regular commissions in the Royal Navy or Royal Marines, including officers of the Shore Wireless Service and officers transferred to the Royal Navy from the Royal Naval Reserve or the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve, and officers of the former Air Branch eligible for retired pay, who retire from the Active List on or after the 19th December 1945. They do not apply to officers holding temporary or short service commissions.

" *Service Retired Pay*

"3. Retirement for age or non-employment. An officer retiring on or after attaining the age limit fixed for service in his rank and Branch, or, it having been decided that further employment is not available for him, retired compulsorily before attaining that age limit, may be granted retired pay, provided that he has completed at least 20 years' qualifying service as defined in Clauses 25 to 27 below.

"4. The rate of retired pay will be based on the officer's rank for retired pay purposes, as defined in Clauses 21 to 23, and on the length of his reckonable service, as defined in Clause 28.

"5. If the officer's reckonable service is not less than the standard service period for his rank for retired pay purposes, he will be granted retired pay at the standard rate for that rank, as follows:—

"(1) Officers entered direct (except Chaplains) and officers promoted to the General List from the lower deck or from the Branch List.

"(a) Naval Officers.

"(2) Commissioned Officers (Branch List) and Officers promoted therefrom other than Branch Officers promoted direct to the General List—including Quartermaster Officers.

"(a) Naval Officers.

"(b) *Royal Marine Officers.*

Captain ...	22 years	£450 a year

"(3) *Paymasters and Barrackmasters, Royal Marines.* The maximum rate of retired pay for Lieutenant-Colonels, Royal Marines, appointed Paymasters and Barrackmasters before 2nd April, 1946, will be £750 a year, attainable by increments of £25 a year for each year of service in the rank of Lieutenant-Colonel in addition to the rate of retired pay for which they are eligible as Majors, Royal Marines. No such increment will be payable, however, in respect of service as Lieutenant-Colonel until seven years after the date of promotion to Major.

"6. Where the officer's reckonable service is less than the standard service period for his rank for retired pay purposes, the award of retired pay will be at the standard rate for that rank reduced by one deduction, according to the Table set out in Clause 7 below, for each year or part of a year of the deficiency.

"7. The scale of deductions will be:—

Rate of retired pay	Each Deduction
Above £1,000 a year ...	£50 a year
£1,000 and above £600 a year ...	£30 a year
£600 and above £400 a year ...	£20 a year
£400 and above £300 a year ...	£15 a year
£300 and above £200 a year ...	£10 a year
£200 a year and below ...	£5 a year

Deductions will be made successively until the number of deductions due to be made has been completed, and each deduction in turn will be of the amount appropriate to the rate remaining after the preceding deduction.

"8. Where, in the interests of the Service, an officer was granted a permanent regular commission at an age later than that of the normal entrant, and has in consequence of his late entry not completed 20 years' qualifying service at the time of his compulsory retirement for age or non-employment, retired pay as provided in Clauses 5 to 7 may nevertheless be granted at the discretion of the Admiralty, provided he has completed at least 15 years' qualifying service.

"9. *Retirement for non-promotion.* An officer who it is decided shall be compulsorily retired in the interests of the Service on the ground that he has been superseded for further promotion, may be granted retired pay as if he had retired for non-employment.

"10. *Voluntary retirement.* An officer with at least 20 years' qualifying service who is permitted to retire at his own request, may be granted retired pay computed as follows:—

"(a) If he is, at the time of retirement, within two years of the age limit fixed for service in his rank and Branch, his retired pay will be computed as if he had retired compulsorily for non-employment.

"(b) In other cases, his retired pay will be at the rate for which he would have been eligible had he continued to serve in his rank for retired pay purposes until compulsorily retired at the age limit for that rank, less one deduction on the scale set out in Clause 7 above for each year or part of a year, by which the difference between his age on retirement and the said age limit exceeds two years, with a further deduction of 10 per cent. from the amount so calculated.

"11. *Invaliding.* An officer who is invalided, with at least 10 years' qualifying service, will be granted retired pay as follows:—

"(a) If he has 20 or more years' qualifying service the award will be assessed as for compulsory retirement for non-employment under Clauses 3 to 7.

"(b) If his qualifying service is less than 20 years, his retired pay will be computed as follows:—

"(i) *General List Officers*—From the award for which he would have been eligible under sub-paragraph (a) had he completed 20 years' qualifying service and then retired in the rank of Lieutenant-Commander, Royal Navy, or Captain, Royal Marines, or his existing rank, if higher, a deduction will be made of twice the

amount laid down in Clause 7 for each year or part of a year by which his qualifying service falls short of 20 years.

"(ii) *Commissioned Officers (Branch List), and officers promoted therefrom other than Branch Officers promoted to the General List.*

Commissioned Officer—£150 a year for 10 years' reckonable service with an addition of £10 for each further complete year of service. A Branch Officer who has not 10 years' reckonable service will be entitled, if he has 12 years' actual service, to invaliding pension on the rating scale, with the special rank elements for service in the rank of Commissioned Officer (Branch List) or higher rank set forth in Section VIII, Clause 71.

Senior Commissioned Officer—£180 a year for 10 years' reckonable service with an addition of £12 for each further complete year of service.

Lieutenant and above—From the award for which he would have been eligible under sub-paragraph (a) above had he completed 20 years' qualifying service and then retired in his existing rank, a deduction will be made of twice the amount laid down in Clause 7 for each year or part of a year by which his qualifying service falls short of 20 years.

Where the circumstances leading to an officer's invaliding are due to the officer's own fault, or to causes within his control, the grant and amount of retired pay will be at the discretion of the Admiralty, but will not exceed the award for which he may be eligible under this Clause.

"12. *Retirements for incapacity, unsuitability or inefficiency not within the officer's control.* An officer who is retired for incapacity, unsuitability or for inefficiency, not due to causes within his own control, and having at least 20 years' qualifying service, may be granted retired pay as for a compulsory retirement on account of non-employment. An officer having between 15 and 20 years' qualifying service may be granted retired pay not exceeding the rate calculated on the scale for voluntary retirement, or the invaliding rate whichever is the lower.

"13. *Retirement for causes within the officer's control.* An officer who is retired for incapacity, unsuitability or inefficiency due to causes within his own control, but not amounting to misconduct, and having at least 20 years' qualifying service, may be granted an award of retired pay at such rate as the Admiralty may determine, but not in any event exceeding the retired pay rate which would have been admissible had he retired at his own request.

"14. *Retirement, etc., for misconduct.* (a) An officer who is retired for misconduct, with at least 20 years' qualifying service, may be granted retired pay at such rate as the Admiralty may determine, but not in any event exceeding 90 per cent. of the rate of retired pay which would have been admissible had he retired at his own request.

"(b) *Dismissal, etc.* An officer with at least 20 years' qualifying service who is dismissed the Service or dismissed with disgrace by sentence of Court Martial or whose name has been removed from the list of Officers or who has been deprived of retired pay following the removal of his name from the list of retired Officers or who has been allowed to resign his commission to avoid trial by Court Martial, may be granted a compassionate allowance at Admiralty discretion, but not in any event exceeding 90 per cent. of the rate of retired pay which would have been admissible had he retired at his own request.

"15. The Admiralty may, in the exercise of their discretion under Clauses 13 and 14 grant a gratuity, or compassionate gratuity, in place of retired pay or compassionate allowance.

"16. *Special rules relating to officers promoted from the lower deck.* The following special rules will apply in the case of an officer promoted to a permanent commission while serving on a normal regular engagement, and who serves continuously until retired:—

"(a) He may be granted retired pay on compulsory retirement for age or non-employment, assessed as in Clauses 3 to 7, notwithstanding that he may have less than 20 years' reckonable service, provided that he has at least 15 years' reckonable service and at least 22 years' service reckonable for the purpose of rating's pension calculated as in Clause 76.

"(b) He may be granted the service pension for which he would qualify under the rules applicable to ratings, such award being in place of any retired pay or other award under this Section.

"17. Chaplains will not be eligible for awards under the foregoing Clauses, except as provided in sub-paragraph (d) of this Clause.

Retired pay will be awarded if the chaplain has completed at least 20 years' qualifying service, or at least 15 years' qualifying service if compulsorily retired for age, or 10 years' qualifying service if invalidated.

Retired pay will be assessed as follows:—

"(a) In the case of compulsory retirement for age or non-employment, the retired pay rate will be based on the length of the chaplain's reckonable service, as follows:—

Length of reckonable service	Retired pay rate
22 years	£475 a year
23 years	£505 a year
24 years	£535 a year
25 years	£565 a year
26 years	£595 a year
27 years	£625 a year
28 years	£665 a year
29 years	£705 a year
30 years	£745 a year

If the chaplain has less than 22 years' reckonable service, the retired pay rate will be arrived at by one deduction from the rate of £475 a year, on the scale set out in Clause 7, for each year or part of a year by which the reckonable service falls short of 22 years.

"(b) A chaplain permitted to retire at his own request will be eligible for retired pay assessed as in sub-paragraph (a) above, but unless his retirement takes place within two years before the age limit fixed for service in his Branch, the retired pay rate will be reduced by 10 per cent.

"(c) A chaplain who is invalidated may be granted retired pay as follows:—

"(i) If he has 20 or more years' qualifying service, the award will be assessed as for compulsory retirement for non-employment under sub-paragraph (a) above.

"(ii) If his qualifying service is less than 20 years, his retired pay will be computed as follows:—

From the award for which he would have been eligible under sub-paragraph (i) had he completed 20 years' qualifying service and then retired, a deduction will be made of twice the amount laid down in Clause 7 for each year or part of a year by which his qualifying service falls short of 20 years.

"(d) A chaplain leaving the Service in the circumstances referred to in Clauses 12 to 15 above, may be granted an award on the basis of those Clauses.

"18. *The Chaplain of the Fleet.* The Chaplain of the Fleet may be granted retired pay as follows, provided he has completed the appropriate period of qualifying service, as set out in Clause 17 above:—

"(a) If he has completed 28 years' reckonable service and (unless invalidated) at least two years as Chaplain of the Fleet, £1,000 a year.

"(b) If he has less than 28 years' reckonable service, his retired pay rate will be arrived at by one deduction from the rate of £1,000 a year, on the scale set out in Clause 7, for each year or part of a year by which his reckonable service falls short of 28 years.

"(c) If he retires at his own request, his retired pay will be subject to a deduction of 10 per cent. unless he retires within two years before the age limit fixed for service as Chaplain of the Fleet.

"(d) If (not being invalidated from the Service) he serves as Chaplain of the Fleet for less than 2 years, he will be awarded retired pay calculated as in Clause 17 above.

"Service Gratuities

"19. An officer entered direct, or promoted direct to the General List from the lower deck or from the Branch List, may on retirement, if ineligible for service retired pay, be granted a gratuity as follows:—

"(a) On compulsory retirement for age or non-employment, or on retirement at his own request, with at least 10 years' qualifying service:—

For the first 10 years' qualifying service	£1,000
For each further year's qualifying service, an addition of	£150
Subject to a maximum gratuity of	£2,350

"The £150 addition will, however, be applicable only in respect of complete years of service given after the 6th March 1946. For each year of qualifying service in excess of 10 years which is so excluded, an addition of £100 may be allowed.

"(b) On invaliding, a gratuity at the rate of £100 for each complete year of qualifying service.

"(c) If retired on account of incapacity, unsuitability or inefficiency not due to causes within the officer's control:—

If with 10 or more years' qualifying service, a gratuity as in sub-paragraph (a) above.

If with less than 10 years' qualifying service, a gratuity at the discretion of the Admiralty, not exceeding the following:—

With less than 2 years' qualifying service	Nil.
With 2 years' qualifying service	£75
With 3 years' qualifying service	£150
With 4 years' qualifying service	£225
With 5 years' qualifying service	£300
With 6 years' qualifying service	£375
With 7 years' qualifying service	£450
With 8 years' qualifying service	£525
With 9 years' qualifying service	£600

"(d) If retired for incapacity, unsuitability or inefficiency or other cause within his own control, but not amounting to misconduct, with at least 10 years' qualifying service, a gratuity of such amount as the Admiralty may determine, but not in any event exceeding the amount which would have been admissible under sub-paragraph (a) above had the officer retired at his own request.

"(e) If retired for misconduct, or on termination of commission for any of the reasons set out in Clause 14 (b), with at least 10 years' qualifying service, a gratuity, or a compassionate gratuity, if the Admiralty so decide and of such amount as they may determine, but not in any event exceeding 90 per cent. of the award which would have been admissible had the officer retired at his own request.

"20. Branch Officers and officers promoted therefrom, other than Branch Officers promoted direct to the General List, if invalidated with less than 10 years' qualifying service and with insufficient service to qualify for a pension on the ratings' scale may be granted a gratuity at the rate of £75 a year for each complete year of qualifying service.

"Rank for Retired Pay purposes

"21. Subject to the following Clauses, the rank for retired pay purposes shall be the substantive rank held by the officer on his retirement, provided that, unless the officer is invalidated, the rank had been held on the Active List for the following minimum period:—

- (i) Admiral, General, Royal Marines 1 year
- (ii) All other officers (except as in (iii)) 2 years
- (iii) Commanders and Lieutenant-Commanders from the Branch List, and equivalent Royal Marine Officers ... 1 year.

If the substantive rank has been held for less than the period specified, the rank for retired pay purposes shall be the highest substantive rank which (with periods spent in higher substantive rank) satisfies the condition.

"22. Where a substantive rank was attained before 1st July 1946 any previous periods spent in equivalent or higher paid acting rank may be reckoned towards the period of service necessary in the substantive rank.

"23. Service as Acting Captain, Royal Navy up to 31st October 1952 inclusive, may be reckoned towards the requirement of six years' service as Captain irrespective of the date of substantive promotion.

"Additions to Retired Pay for Service in paid Acting Rank

"24. Where an officer has for a year or more held paid acting rank above his rank for retired pay purposes, he may be granted an addition to the retired pay for which he is otherwise eligible, calculated as follows:—

"(a) For each year (subject to a maximum of three) for which the paid acting rank was held, there may be added one-third of the difference between the retired pay for which the officer is eligible and the retired pay for which he would have been eligible had his rank for retired pay purposes been one rank above substantive rank.

"(b) Where substantive rank is not otherwise reckonable for retired pay, it may be reckoned as if it were paid acting rank for the purpose of an addition under (a) above.

The provisions of this Clause shall cease to have effect in respect of retirements after the 31st October 1952. An officer retiring subsequently will, however, be eligible to receive, as a reserved right, the retired pay which he might have been given had he retired on the 31st October 1952, for the same cause, based on his rank and service up to that date. For the purpose of this reserved right the substantive rank held on the 31st October 1952, may be regarded as the rank for retired pay purposes, even if it had not then been held for the period specified in Clause 21 above, as a necessary qualification for the retired pay of that rank, provided the appropriate period in the substantive rank is in fact subsequently completed.

"Qualifying Service for Service Retired Pay and Gratuities"

"25. The following periods may be included in assessing qualifying service for the purpose of the foregoing Clauses, subject to the conditions set out:—

"(a) Full pay commissioned service, including mobilised or embodied service, as an officer of the Royal Navy, the Royal Marines, the Army or the Royal Air Force, and (subject to Clause 29 (a)) of the former Armed Forces of India or Burma, or of the Armed Forces of the Commonwealth or a Colony.

"(b) Periods on full pay as an officer for the purpose of training, while a member of the Auxiliary and Reserve Forces, except broken periods each of less than six months' duration.

"(c) While a permanent regular Naval Officer, periods in appointments not remunerated from Naval Funds, in respect of which the conditions of Clause 27 are satisfied.

"(d) Periods before 1st August 1938 on unemployed pay, or on half-pay not following the sentence of a Court Martial or the expiration of full pay sick leave, will reckon as service in full up to a maximum of six months in any one period or two years in all.

Any such service not reckoning in full under the above rule will reckon as a third, subject to a maximum of six years' such service reckoning as two years.

"(e) Loss of seniority or time forfeited by sentence of Court Martial or Disciplinary Court will not involve loss of service for retired pay or gratuity.

"(f) *In full*: Service as Acting Sub-Lieutenant; Second Lieutenant, Royal Marines (not below the age of 20); Branch Officer and above.

(ii) *In half*: Service (not below the age of 18) as Midshipman or Cadet; Second Lieutenant, Royal Marines under the age of 20; and in ranks below Branch Officer.

"26. Service preceding a five year interval in service shall not be included unless specially allowed by the Admiralty and eligibility to reckon such previous service will normally be determined at the time of resumption of service. Where, during a break in service the officer has been a member of the Royal Naval Reserve, the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve, or other reserve of any of the Forces, undertaking or liable for periodical training, the period of such membership will not be considered an interval in service for the purpose of deciding whether the previous service is admissible.

"27. The appointments not remunerated from Naval Funds, referred to in Clause 25 (c) above, which may be allowed as qualifying service are those which it may be decided by the Admiralty can reasonably be regarded as part of a Naval Officer's career as such. They shall be appointments to which the officer brings his naval knowledge, and from which he acquires additional experience, and which have been officially offered to him as part of his Naval service.

"Reckonable Service for Retired Pay"

"28. The reckonable service for retired pay shall be so much of the officer's qualifying service as was given after attaining age 21 years provided that—

"(a) Where the officer served on the lower deck or in the ranks of the Royal Marines before he was commissioned, his qualifying service as a rating or an other rank, given before age 21, may be included, provided that the total service, so reckoned, is not greater than would have been reckonable had he been commissioned at age 21.

"(b) In the case of an officer who was granted his commission during the war of 1914-1918 and before the 12th November, 1918, commissioned service given before attaining age 21 may be included.

"Adjustments in respect of Previous Service for which a Non-Effective Award has been Received"

"29.—(a) In the case of previous service in respect of which the officer received a service gratuity, or in any case of previous service other than in the Royal Navy, the Royal Marines, the Army, or the Royal Air Force, it may be stipulated as a condition for allowing such service to reckon for retired pay, that the officer shall make a payment to Naval Funds, either in a lump sum or otherwise. In default of such payment as may have been stipulated, the previous service will not be allowed.

"(b) If an officer continues in receipt, during his Active List service, of retired pay or other analogous award payable in respect of previous service which may be allowed as qualifying service under Clause 25, the award under Sections I and II hereof shall be of such amount as the Admiralty may determine, and shall normally not exceed the difference between the award of which he is already in receipt and the award for which he would otherwise be eligible.

"Reserved Rights, etc."

"30. An officer who retired between the 19th December 1945 and the 6th March 1946, inclusive, shall be eligible to receive at his option either an award under this Section or the award admissible under the regulations which were in force on the 18th December 1945.

"31. An officer who held a permanent regular commission on the Active List on the 6th March 1946, will be eligible to receive, in place of the award admissible under this Section, the award for which he would have qualified under the regulations in force on the 18th December, 1945, had he continued until the date of his retirement in the substantive rank which he held on the 6th March 1946.

"32. The provision in Orders in Council dated the 28th September 1944 and 2nd April 1947, for the increase of certain pensions, will not apply to retired pay awarded under this Section. Awards under the regulations in force on the 18th December 1945, made by virtue of the reserved right conferred by Clauses 30 and 31 above, may, however, be increased under the provisions of those Orders in Council. An officer who has a reserved right under Clause 30 or Clause 31 may be required to make a final choice between the award admissible under this Section and the award for which he is eligible by virtue of his reserved right, including actual or potential eligibility for the increase of the latter under the Orders in Council referred to.

"SECTION III"

"Re-assessment of Retired Pay for War Service in the 1939-1945 War"

"33. An officer who retired on retired pay before the 19th December, 1945, and who gave service during the war which commenced on the 3rd September 1939 (whether before or after his retirement), may be allowed a re-assessment of his existing retired pay, in respect of such war service, subject to the following conditions:—

"(a) Only satisfactory full time paid naval, military or air force service given during the 1939-45 war, or equivalent service in the former Armed Forces of India or Burma, or in the Forces of the Commonwealth or a Colony, will be taken into account; a minimum of six months such service will be necessary.

"(b) The total qualifying service, consisting of the service before retirement, assessed under Clause 25, together with re-employed service, if any, as at (a) above, must be of such length as would confer an entitlement to retired pay under Section II. The previous service of a re-employed officer will be reckonable for this purpose notwithstanding that there may have been a break in service of more than five years immediately preceding the re-employment.

"34. The re-assessed retired pay will be the total of

"(a) the retired pay for which he was eligible on retirement under the regulations then in force, including any increase permissible under the Second Schedule of Order in Council dated the 28th September 1944 (as amended by Order in Council dated the 2nd April 1947), but not including any increase admissible under the First Schedule of the first named Order in Council or amendments thereto, and

"(b) the appropriate proportion calculated as in Clause 35 below of the difference between the rate at (a) above and the retired pay which would have been awardable had Section II been applicable, and had the officer continued to serve consecutively beyond the date of his retirement for a period equivalent to the length of his re-employment, in the ranks actually held, and then retired from the original cause.

"35. The proportion referred to in paragraph 34 (b) above will be the sum of the fractions set out below, subject to a maximum of six such fractions:—

For each year of re-employed service during the war, during which the officer drew an addition to his pay (his retired pay having been withdrawn) or drew pay equivalent to his retired pay plus an addition thereto. } One twelfth

For each year of Active List service during the war or of re-employed service during which the officer received no payment of, or in lieu of, retired pay } One sixth

In assessing the total number of fractions admissible, a period of over six months will be allowed as a year, and a period of under six months will be ignored. Where an officer has both Active List and re-employed service during the war, any portion of a year of Active List service will be carried over to count as re-employed service.

"36. An officer who was originally invalided from the Navy, and is eligible for re-assessment in respect of war service, may have the addition under paragraph 34 (b) calculated as for an invalid only if he was invalided at the termination of his war service. If he was released or reverted to unemployment otherwise than as an invalid, he will be regarded for this purpose as having been retired compulsorily, or, alternatively, his retired pay may be re-assessed as for an invalid in respect of his original service only.

An officer who originally retired from a cause other than invaliding but who was invalided from re-employment during the war, may have the addition under paragraph 34 (b) calculated as for an invalid.

"37. An officer who was originally retired or reverted from re-employment on account of misconduct, incapacity, unsuitability, or inefficiency, will be allowed only such revision of his retired pay in respect of war service as the Admiralty may think proper, having regard to the circumstances of his case.

"38. Re-assessed awards under this Section will have effect from the 19th December 1945, or from the day following the cessation of full pay re-employment, if later.

"39. Re-assessed awards under this Section will not be increased under the provisions of Orders in Council dated the 28th September 1944 and 2nd April 1947. An officer eligible for re-assessment may be required to make a final choice between his re-assessed award and his original award, the latter including actual or potential eligibility for an increase under the Orders in Council referred to.

"40. The Admiralty may fix a date after which service shall not be reckonable for the purpose of re-assessment of retired pay under this Section. A retired officer continuing in employment after the date so fixed will thereafter be dealt with under the regulations currently applicable to his case.

"SECTION IV

"Retired Pay and Gratuities for Regular Seamen and Marines Promoted to Temporary Warrants or Commissions in the 1939-1945 War.

"41. Seamen or marines promoted during the war which commenced on 3rd September, 1939, to temporary R.N. or R.M. warrants or commissions whilst serving on Continuous Service Engagements will be eligible on cessation of full pay on release or on relinquishing their temporary warrants or commissions for retired pay or gratuity on the following conditions.

"(a) On normal termination of service as a temporary Commissioned or Warrant Officer or if invalided for a disability not attributable to the Service;

After not less than 15 years' total service—
Retired Pay.

Awards made prior to the 19th December 1945 will be revised to the rates applicable thereafter with effect from that date.

If with less than 15 years' total service—

Gratuity of £50 for each completed year of service from age 18. Time as rating or in the ranks to count as single time, and time in commissioned or warrant rank (or as Sergeant Major, Royal Marines) as double time. (Time as officer not to count double for calculation of 15 years' service necessary to qualify for retired pay.)

"(b) If discharged for incapacity or misconduct.

Retired pay or gratuity at the rates laid down at (a) above according to the length of service given may be granted subject to such reduction as the Admiralty may decide.

"(c) If invalided for a disability attributable to the Service.

Retired pay as laid down at (a) above, subject to deductions of £5 a year for each complete year short of 15, plus disability addition on the scale for Permanent Officers, or if more favourable to the officer, than retired pay plus disability addition, disability retired pay on the scale for temporary warrant or commissioned officers, as laid down in the Naval War Pensions Regulations.

"42. Seamen or marines, to whom the provisions of Clause 41 apply, may be allowed, on confirmation as temporary warrant officer or higher rank, to receive payment of any additional Good Conduct Gratuity that they may have earned up to the date of their promotion to temporary Acting warrant or higher rank.

"43. Time Expired Continuous Service ratings who were granted Temporary R.N.V.R. Commissions during the war which commenced on 3rd September 1939 while continuing to serve on their extended first continuous service engagement will be eligible on cessation of full pay on release or relinquishing their temporary commission for retired pay or gratuity as follows:—

"(a) On normal termination of service, or if invalided for a disability not attributable to the Service—

After not less than 15 years' total service—
Retired Pay.

Rates payable before 19th December 1945

£60 a year plus £2 (Non-Mechanical Branch), or £2 10s. Od. (Mechanical Branch) for each complete year of total service as rating (from the age of 18) and officer; and £4 10s. Od. for each complete year of service as Temporary R.N.V.R. officer.

Rates payable with effect from 19th December 1945

£70 a year plus £2, up to the twentieth year of reckonable service (Non-Mechanical Branch) £2 10s. Od. thereafter; £2 10s. Od. throughout

(Mechanical Branch) for complete years of service as rating (from the age of 18) and officer; and £7 10s. 0d. for each complete year of service as Temporary R.N.V.R. officer.

Awards made prior to the 19th December 1945 will be revised to the new rates applicable thereafter with effect from that date.

If with less than 15 years' total service—

Gratuity of £50 for each completed year of service from age 18. Time as rating to count as single time, and time in commissioned rank as double time. (Time as officer not to count double for calculation of 15 years' total service necessary to qualify for retired pay.)

"(b) If discharged for incapacity or misconduct.

Retired pay or gratuity at the rates laid down at (a) above according to length of service given may be granted subject to reduction as the Admiralty may decide.

"(c) If invalided for a disability attributable to the Naval Service in commissioned rank during the war.

Retired pay as laid down at (a) above, subject to deductions of £5 a year for each complete year short of 15, plus disability addition on the scale for Permanent Officers, or if more favourable to the officer than retired pay plus disability addition, disability retired pay on the scale for temporary officers as laid down in the Naval War Pensions Regulations.

The foregoing provisions for retired pay or gratuity will not be applicable to ratings who took their discharge before the 3rd September 1939 or at the end of their first engagement.

"44. For the purposes of Clauses 41 and 43 'Total service' will include service as a seaman or marine from the age of 18 as well as service as an officer, and in so far as it refers to service as a seaman or marine will mean service that would ordinarily be reckonable for non-effective purposes under the general rules for the counting of such service.

"45. The provisions in Orders in Council dated the 28th September 1944 and 2nd April 1947 for the increase of certain pensions apply to the rates of retired pay payable before 19th December 1945 in Clauses 41 and 43, but the provisions of those Orders in Council do not apply to the rates of retired pay payable with effect from 19th December 1945 in Clauses 41 and 43. An officer shall be eligible to receive at his option an award under either scale. He will, however, be required to make a final choice between the award admissible after 19th December 1945 and the award admissible before that date, the latter including actual or potential eligibility for an increase under the Orders in Council referred to in this Clause.

"46. Pensionary and other benefits for Pensioner ratings and Royal Fleet Reservists, Classes B and D, promoted to temporary warrant officer or to temporary commissioned rank.

Seaman or marine pensioners, and Royal Fleet Reservists, Classes B and D, promoted during the war which commenced on 3rd September 1939 to temporary warrant or commissioned rank will not be eligible for retired pay or retiring gratuity. Subject to the provisions of Clause 47, however, pensioner ratings while holding the rank of temporary warrant officer or above may continue in receipt of their pensions.

Promoted pensioners and Royal Fleet Reservists will be eligible for a bonus of 2s. a day in addition to full pay and allowances as may be laid down for permanent officers of the same Branch; such addition, however, to cease to be payable from the 1st April 1948, except that existing holders on that date will retain it on a "mark-time" basis. Time served in temporary warrant or higher rank from 3rd September 1939, will count for the purposes of re-assessment of pension under the conditions laid down in Section X.

"47. Promoted pensioner ratings who, instead of being placed on the retired list under the general arrangements for their release from war service were granted extensions of service for varying periods differing according to their age and branch, to have the option of either:—

"(a) giving up payment of pension during further service from the pension quarter ended 30th June 1948, thereafter counting further service for full increments of pension on the rating scale, with the special rank additions appropriate to service in Warrant or Commissioned Warrant rank; or

"(b) continuing to serve on the basis of pay plus pension, with entitlement to re-assessment in due course under Section X in respect of service up to 31st December 1951. For service beyond that date, they will, unless any other general arrangement governing peace-time re-employment is by then made to the contrary, be required to give up payment of pension and continue as at (a).

"48. Royal Fleet Reservists, Classes B and D, promoted to temporary warrant or commissioned rank to be discharged from the Royal Fleet Reserve on promotion but service in temporary warrant or commissioned rank will count as qualifying time for all purposes of R.F.R. gratuity. These officers will not be eligible on relinquishing their temporary warrants or commissions for the retired pay or gratuity provided for active service ratings similarly promoted, and except as provided for in Clause 49, their service in temporary warrant or commissioned rank will carry no entitlement to retired pay, pension or retiring gratuity based on service.

"49. Promoted Royal Fleet Reservists who on termination of their temporary warrants or commissions have rendered 22 or more years satisfactory service excluding Boys' and R.F.R. time may, for the purpose of qualifying for long service pension, be regarded as having served as ratings or marine other ranks throughout the period of their war service, reckoning the period of temporary warrant or commissioned service for appropriate rank additions on the ratings' pension scale. The award of pension in such circumstances will be conditional on the refund of any R.F.R. gratuity which they may have been paid.

"50. The dependants of seamen or marines promoted to temporary warrant or commissioned rank will be ineligible for the "ordinary" pensions and allowances provided for the widows and children of permanent officers whose deaths are not attributable to Naval service.

"SECTION V

"Gratuities in respect of Short Service Commissions

"51. An officer granted a short service commission in the Royal Navy after the 19th December 1945, under terms which provide for the payment of a gratuity, may, on satisfactory completion of the full period of Active List service he has undertaken, be granted a gratuity as follows:—

"(a) Officers granted short service commissions up to 30th June 1947

- (i) Medical Officers—
on completion of 4 years' service—£750.
- (ii) Dental Officers—
on completion of 4 years' service—£625.
- (iii) Instructor Officers—
on completion of 3 years' service—
£337 10s. 0d.
on completion of 4 years' service—£450.
on completion of 5 years' service—
£562 10s. 0d.

"(b) Officers granted short service commissions after 30th June 1947

- (i) Medical Officers—
on completion of 4 years' service—£600.
- (ii) Dental Officers—
on completion of 4 years' service—£500.
- (iii) Instructor Officers—
on completion of 3 years' service—£300.
on completion of 4 years' service—£400.
on completion of 5 years' service—£500.
- (iv) Electrical Officers—
on completion of 5 years' service—£500.

"(c) Officers granted short service commissions in the Royal Navy for Aircrew duties (Pilot or Observer)

on completion of 8 years' service—£700.

"(d) Chaplains not granted permanent commissions who withdraw from the Royal Navy after 4 years' full pay service will be granted a gratuity of £300 on leaving.

"52. Should the officer fail to complete the full period of Active List service which he has undertaken, an award may nevertheless be made as follows:—

"(a) If his service is terminated on account of disability not due to causes within his own control, or for non-employment, or for incapacity, unsuitability or inefficiency not due to causes within his control, or if he is permitted voluntarily to

terminate his service within six months of the completion of the full period of Active List service he has undertaken, he may be granted a gratuity proportionate to the length of Active List service he had actually completed.

"(b) In other circumstances, no gratuity will in any event be payable unless he has completed at least one year's satisfactory service. If his service is thereafter terminated owing to disability due to causes within his own control, or to inefficiency or other cause within his own control but not amounting to misconduct, or if he is permitted voluntarily to terminate his service more than six months before the conclusion of the period he has undertaken, he may be allowed, at Admiralty discretion, such gratuity as may be determined, but not in any event exceeding three quarters of the amount proportionate to the length of his actual service on the Active List.

"(c) If his service is terminated on account of misconduct, the special payment of a compassionate gratuity shall be within the discretion of the Admiralty according to the circumstances of his case, but the award will not in any event exceed 90 per cent. of the gratuity which would have been admissible had he left voluntarily.

"53. No part of a short service gratuity will be payable to the officer's estate or otherwise in the event of his death before completion of the period of Active List service he had undertaken.

"54. If an officer serving on a short service commission continues on full pay beyond the period of Active List service which he had undertaken, payment of the gratuity may be deferred until the end of such further service. No additional gratuity will be payable in respect of that further service, unless special provision for such further payment is made.

"55. A short service commissioned officer who is granted a permanent regular commission will not be eligible for any gratuity in respect of his service on a short service commission, but his service on that commission may count towards an ultimate award of retired pay or gratuity as a permanent regular officer. If, after receipt of a gratuity in respect of short service an officer is granted a permanent regular commission his previous service will not be reckonable towards an ultimate award of retired pay or gratuity as a permanent regular officer, unless satisfactory arrangements are made for the refund of the Short Service Gratuity.

"56. In the case of officers granted short service commissions in the Educational Branch of the Royal Navy who have within a year previously been in contributory service under the Teachers (Superannuation) Acts, contributions to preserve entitlement under those Acts may be made from year to year during the currency of the short service commission, and the total amount so contributed shall be deducted from any gratuity payable on termination of service.

"SECTION VI

"Naval Compassionate Pensions

"57. Naval Compassionate pensions may be awarded, by selection from suitable candidates, to permanent regular officers who have retired or left the Service.

"58. In the selection of recipients regard shall be had to the following factors:—

- (a) Good Service.
- (b) Need, and
- (c) Misfortune, or other special factor (such as infirmity due to age).

"59. The receipt by an officer of retired pay or other award in respect of his service shall not be a bar to the grant of a naval compassionate pension in addition.

"60. A naval compassionate pension will be of such amount as may be decided in the particular case, but shall not normally exceed £100 a year. In very exceptional circumstances a pension of more than £100 a year, but in no case exceeding £200 a year, may be given.

"61. A compassionate pension may be withdrawn at any time if the conditions in respect of which it was granted cease to apply.

"62. The total provision for compassionate pensions under this Section will be fixed from time to time by the Admiralty in consultation with the Treasury. No award will be made with effect from a date earlier than the 1st April 1949.

"63. No further grant of Good Service Pensions or Naval Pensions, under the provisions of Orders

in Council bearing dates prior to 1st April 1949 will be made, but grants already made will continue subject to the conditions under which they were given.

"SECTION VII

"Retired Pay of Members of the Queen Alexandra's Royal Naval Nursing Service

"64. The provisions of Order in Council dated 3rd October 1935 (No. 86/C.E.) for the grant of revised scales of retired pay to members of Queen Alexandra's Royal Naval Nursing Service will be supplemented as follows.

"65. Additions to retired pay for acting rank. A member of Queen Alexandra's Royal Naval Nursing Service eligible for retired pay under Order in Council dated 3rd October 1935, who has, whilst serving on the Active List after 2nd September 1939, held paid acting rank higher than her substantive rank may be granted an addition to her retired pay with effect from the date of retirement as follows:—

Rank element for complete years served in paid acting rank—

Sisters, paid as acting Senior Sisters or above, £14 for the first year in paid acting rank, £13 a year for each of the second and third years, and £10 a year for each subsequent year up to a maximum of seven years in all,

Senior Sisters, paid as acting Matrons or above, £20 a year for each of the first three years in paid acting rank, and £10 a year for each subsequent year up to a maximum of seven years in all.

Matrons, paid acting Principal Matrons or above, £15 a year for each year in paid acting rank, in place of principal matron's rank element, subject to a maximum of £50.

The maximum retired pay laid down for the substantive rank will be increased by the amount of the rank element earned by higher paid acting rank. Years reckonable as above for rank element in respect of acting rank will be disregarded in assessing the rank element in respect of the substantive rank.

Subject to Clause 69, the addition under this Clause will be increasable under the provisions of Order in Council dated 28th September 1944, and amendments thereto, in the same way as the basic retired pay to which the addition is made.

"66. Provisional increase of retired pay. Pending revision of the retired pay terms for the Queen Alexandra's Royal Naval Nursing Service, a member retiring on or after the 19th December 1945, with an entitlement to retired pay will be eligible for an increase of 10 per cent. of the retired pay for which she is eligible under Order in Council dated 3rd October 1935, and, where applicable, under Clause 65 above.

"67. Re-assessment of retired pay in respect of war service. A member who retired on retired pay before the 19th December 1945, and who gave service during the war which began on the 3rd September 1939 (whether before or after her retirement) may be allowed a re-assessment of her existing retired pay in respect of such war service.

"Only satisfactory full time paid service in the Nursing Services given during the 1939-45 war, or equivalent service with the Forces of the Commonwealth, will be taken into account as war service for this purpose; a minimum of six months such service will be necessary.

"The re-assessed retired pay will be the total of:—

"(a) The retired pay for which she is at present eligible, including any addition admissible under Clause 65, but not including any increase admissible under Schedule I of Order in Council dated the 28th September 1944 (as amended by Order in Council dated the 2nd April 1947) and

"(b) the appropriate proportion, calculated as below, of the difference between the rate at (a) above, and the retired pay which would have been admissible (including the increase of 10 per cent. provided in Clause 66), had the war service been given on the Active List and the officer retired from the original cause after service in the ranks actually held.

"The proportion of the difference thus admissible will be the sum of the fractions set out below, subject to a maximum of six such fractions:—

For each year of re-employed service during the war, during which the member drew an addition to her pay (her retired pay having been withdrawn) or drew pay equivalent to her retired pay plus an addition thereto	} One twelfth.

For each year of Active List service during the war, or of re-employed service during which the member received no payment of, or in lieu of, retired pay } One sixth.

"In assessing the total number of fractions admissible, a period of over six months will be allowed as a year, and a period of under six months will be ignored. Where a member has both Active List and re-employed service during the war, any portion of a year of Active List service will be carried over to count as re-employed service.

"A member leaving on account of misconduct or inefficiency, whether on original retirement or from re-employment, will be allowed only such revision of retired pay in respect of war service as the Admiralty may think proper, having regard to the circumstances of her case.

"68. Re-assessed awards under Clause 67 will have effect from the 19th December 1945, or from the day following the cessation of full pay re-employment, if later.

"69. Retired pay increased under Clause 66 or re-assessed in respect of war service under Clause 67 will not be increaseable under the provisions of Orders in Council dated the 28th September 1944 and the 2nd April 1947. An officer may, however, elect to receive in place of her award as so increased or re-assessed, the award for which she would otherwise be eligible, carrying actual or potential eligibility for an increase under the Orders in Council referred to. She may be required to choose finally between these two alternatives.

"SECTION VIII

"R.N. Ratings and Royal Marines. Service Pensions

"70. The provisions of this Section relate (except where otherwise stated) to R.N. ratings and Royal Marines, who render pensionable service after the 18th December 1945, other than re-employed service pensioners, and those who elected and received pension while still serving. They do not apply to R.N. native ratings or to R.N. ratings or Royal Marines or other categories for which special provision is or may hereafter be made.

"71. Service pensions granted under this Section will consist of the sum of the elements for service and for rank, and will be assessed at the following rates:—

"73. A service pension assessed as in Clauses 71 and 72 may be granted to:—

"(a) A R.N. rating or Royal Marine released on the termination of his war service, or discharged otherwise than for misconduct or for inefficiency due to causes within his own control, if he has completed at least 22 years' reckonable service.

"(b) A Royal Marine who having re-engaged before 1st May 1947 to complete 21 years' service, and who is released or discharged on or after the termination of his re-engagement, if he has completed at least 21 years' reckonable service.

"(c) A R.N. rating or Royal Marine who is invalidated after having undertaken a re-engagement to complete 21 or 22 years' service (whether or not he has entered into his re-engagement prior to his discharge) or after having re-entered for a period which would complete 22 years' service, provided he has completed at least 12 years' reckonable service.

"(d) A Maltese R.N. rating who while serving on a non-continuous service engagement is invalidated and who has completed at least 12 years' reckonable service.

"74. A R.N. rating or Royal Marine who is discharged for inefficiency within his own control, and who has completed at least 22 years' reckonable service, may be granted such portion of the service pension assessed under Clauses 71 and 72 as the Admiralty may determine, having regard to the circumstances of the case.

"75. A R.N. rating or Royal Marine who is discharged for misconduct or with ignominy, and who has completed at least 22 years' reckonable service, may be granted such pension as the Admiralty may determine, having regard to the circumstances of the case, but not in any event exceeding 90 per cent. of the award which would have been admissible had he been discharged on other grounds.

"Reckonable Service.

"76. Reckonable service for the purpose both of determining entitlement to pension and of assessing the rates of pension will be as follows:—

"(a) Unforfeited full pay service given, otherwise than as a commissioned officer, after attaining the age of 18 years, in the Royal Navy, the Royal Marines, the Army or the Royal Air Force, or the former Armed Forces of India or Burma, or the Armed Forces of the British Commonwealth or Colonies.

"(b) Service as a commissioned officer which would reckon as qualifying service under Clause 25.

"(c) Periods on full pay for the purpose of training, while a member of the Auxiliary and Reserve Forces, except broken periods individually of less than six months' duration.

"(d) While a regular R.N. rating or Royal Marine, periods in appointments not remunerated from Navy Funds in respect of which the conditions of Clause 78 are satisfied.

"(e) At the Admiralty's discretion, up to a maximum of 28 days of service otherwise forfeited under Clause 80 but not including periods spent in desertion.

"77. Service preceding a five year interval in service will not be reckonable service unless specially so allowed by the Admiralty, and eligibility to reckon such previous service will normally be determined at the time of resumption of service. Where, however during a break in service, the man has been a member of a Reserve Force undertaking or liable for periodical training, the period of such membership will not be considered an interval of service for the purpose of this Clause.

"78. The appointments not remunerated from Navy Funds, referred to in Clause 76 (d) above, which may be allowed as reckonable service, are those which the Admiralty may decide can reasonably be regarded as part of the Naval rating's or Royal Marine's career as such. They will be appointments to which the Naval rating or Royal Marine brings his Naval or Royal Marine knowledge, and from which he acquires additional experience, and which have been officially offered to him as part of his Naval or Royal Marine service.

"79. In the case of previous service in respect of which the Naval rating or Royal Marine received a Service gratuity, and in any case of previous service other than in the Royal Navy, the Royal Marines, the Army, or the Royal Air Force, it may be stipulated as a condition for allowing such service as

reckonable service that the Naval rating or Royal Marine shall make a payment to Navy Funds, either in a lump sum or otherwise. In default of such payment as has been stipulated the previous service will not be reckonable service.

"80. The following periods of service shall not be reckonable service:—

"(i) periods of imprisonment or detention, whether awarded summarily or by sentence of a court martial, or confinement in cells;

"(ii) time forfeited through conviction by the civil power, or consequent upon an order under the Probation of Offenders Act;

"(iii) time spent in desertion, or in fraudulent enlistment if a Royal Marine, and (unless the service is restored by the Admiralty) any service preceding desertion or fraudulent enlistment;

"(iv) service rendered by any person who shall have been re-entered after having been dismissed from the Service with disgrace or with ignominy.

"81. In assessing rank element of pension, all paid rank will be taken into account.

"82. A naval rating or Royal Marine who was invalided from a normal regular engagement between 3rd September 1939 and the date of this Order-in-Council may be granted a service pension, assessed as in Clauses 71 and 72 above, and with effect from a date not earlier than the 19th December 1945, or the date of discharge, if later, provided that either he fulfils the conditions of Clause 73 (c) above, or he had given 12 years' continuous service immediately preceding his discharge as an invalid. An award under this Clause will be in place of any service pension for which the naval rating or Royal Marine is otherwise eligible.

"83. The provisions of Orders in Council of 28th September 1944 and 2nd April 1947 for the increase of certain pensions, will not apply to pensions awarded under the foregoing provision of this Section.

"84. *Reserved Rights.* A naval rating or Royal Marine who was serving on the 19th December 1945, and who had before that date undertaken an engagement or re-engagement to complete time for pension under the regulations then in force, may at his option be granted, in place of pension under the foregoing provisions, the pension for which he would have qualified under the regulations in force on the 18th December, 1945. Such a pension may be increased under the provisions of Orders-in-Council of 28th September 1944 and 2nd April 1947.

"85. A naval rating or Royal Marine to whom Clause 84 applies may at any time be required to make a final choice between the award admissible under Clauses 70 to 82 and the award admissible under Clause 84.

" SECTION IX

" *R.N. Ratings and Royal Marines Service Gratuities*

"86. The provisions of this Section relate (except where otherwise stated) to R.N. ratings and Royal Marines who enter or re-enter the Service on normal regular engagements after 18th December 1945 and are transferred to the Reserve, or discharged without entitlement to service pension. They do not apply to R.N. native ratings, or to R.N. ratings and Royal Marines of other categories for which special provision is or may hereafter be made.

"87. Subject to the following provisions, a R.N. rating or Royal Marine who has 10 or more years continuous reckonable service immediately preceding his discharge, or transfer to the Reserve, will be granted a service gratuity assessed as follows:—

After ten years such service	£50
For each year of such service in excess of 10 years, an addition of	£25
Subject to a maximum gratuity of	£200

"88. A naval rating or Royal Marine who is invalided from a regular engagement and who has more than five but less than 10 years continuous reckonable service immediately preceding his discharge, will be granted a service gratuity at the rate of £10 a year for each year in excess of 5 years. Service given before the age of 18 years may be included as if it were reckonable service for invaliding gratuity, subject, where such service is allowed to count, to a maximum gratuity of £50.

"89. Reckonable service will be the same as for service pensions under Clause 76. Periods which are forfeited under Clause 80 (except periods

which are forfeited by desertion and are not restored) will not be regarded as breaking the continuity of the service, but except as provided in Clause 76 (e), such periods will not be reckoned in determining entitlement to gratuity or its assessment.

"90. In the case of a naval rating or a Royal Marine who is discharged for inefficiency due to causes within his own control, or for misconduct, or with disgrace or with ignominy, the grant of a service gratuity, and its amount, will be discretionary, but when a naval rating or a Royal Marine is discharged for misconduct or with disgrace or with ignominy, a gratuity will not in any event be given unless the service which has been forfeited is restored.

"91. A service gratuity will not be admissible on re-engagement, or on appointment to a commission, or on discharge otherwise for the purpose of giving further full pay service in the Armed Forces.

"92. The Admiralty may stipulate in respect of any naval rating or Royal Marine, or any category of such personnel eligible for service gratuity under this Section, that the award of the gratuity be conditional on the naval rating or Royal Marine undertaking further service in the Royal Fleet Reserve or other Auxiliary Force, and if he refuses to undertake such service, then the gratuity, or such portion thereof as may be determined, will not be payable.

"93. If a naval rating or Royal Marine dies while serving, no gratuity will be payable under this Section.

"94. A naval rating or Royal Marine serving on a normal regular engagement on the 19th December 1945, will on transfer to the Reserve, or on discharge or release from full pay service, be eligible for gratuity under the above conditions but the amount of the gratuity will be calculated only on service given after the 18th December 1945 as follows:—

For each year of reckonable service in excess of 5 years	£10
For each year of reckonable service in excess of 10 years	£25
Subject to a maximum gratuity of	£200

"95. *Reserved Rights.* A naval rating or Royal Marine who was serving on a normal regular engagement on 19th December 1945, and who did not subsequently re-engage, who is discharged invalided without entitlement to service pension, may receive, if not eligible for a gratuity under Clause 94, or if so eligible in place of such gratuity, the gratuity for which he is eligible under Order-in-Council of 6th February 1922, Schedule I (Service Element) (b), or Schedule II (b), as amended by Order-in-Council of 9th March 1939.

"96. The payment of a gratuity under Order-in-Council of 6th February 1922, Schedule I (Service Element) (b) and Schedule II (b) is withdrawn with effect from 19th December 1945, except in the case of a Naval rating or Royal Marine who was serving on a normal regular engagement on that date.

" SECTION X

" *Re-assessment of R.N. Ratings and Royal Marines Service Pensions for Service in the 1939-45 War*

"97. R.N. ratings or Royal Marines pensioned before the 19th December 1945, and who gave service during the war which commenced on the 3rd September 1939 (whether before or after the grant of pension) may be allowed a re-assessment in respect of such war service, of their existing service pensions, subject to the following conditions:—

"(a) Only satisfactory full time paid active mobilised naval, military or air force service given during the 1939-45 war, or equivalent service in the former Armed Forces of India or Burma, or in the Armed Forces of the British Commonwealth or Colonies, will be taken into account, and a minimum of six months' such service will be necessary.

"(b) The total reckonable service consisting of the service before the grant of pension, assessed under Clause 76 et seq., together with subsequent service, if any, as at (a) above, must be of such length as would confer an entitlement to service pension under Section VIII. The previous service of a pensioner will be reckonable for the purpose of this Section notwithstanding that there may have been a break in service of more than five years immediately preceding the war service.

"98. The re-assessed pension will consist of the original pension with an addition equal to the difference between:—

"(a) The service pension for which the pensioner would have been eligible under Section VIII on the whole of his service, including service while a pensioner, and taking into account the ranks held during service while a pensioner, and

"(b) the service pension for which he would have been eligible on the whole of his service under the regulations on which he was pensioned, but so that any service while a pensioner shall be deemed to have been rendered with Very Good character, and given in the highest rank for which he originally earned rank element of pension, and all war service will be reckoned which reckons in the calculation at (a) above.

"99. In the case of Royal Naval and Royal Marine pensioners re-employed during the war, who were originally discharged invalided, but not again invalided from war service, and whose total service including war service is less than 22 years, or pensioners who wish to reckon their war service for civil superannuation awards and not for increase of Naval pension, or in any other case where it would be to the pensioner's advantage, re-assessment as provided in Clauses 97 and 98 may be granted, based on service prior to original pensioning only.

"100. Re-assessed awards as above will have effect from the 19th December 1945, or from the day following the cessation of full pay service, if later.

"101. The provisions of Orders-in-Council of 28th September 1944 and 2nd April 1947 will not apply to pensions which have been re-assessed under the foregoing provisions of this Section.

"102. A pensioner may elect to forego re-assessment under this Section in which case he will continue to be eligible for his former award, and any age increases attaching thereto, and will retain actual or potential eligibility for an increase under the provisions of Orders-in-Council of 28th September 1944 and 2nd April 1947, subject in each case to the relevant conditions.

"103. Should a pensioner elect to forego re-assessment of pension, a special supplement may be added to his original award. The supplement will be payable in respect of complete years of service given after the 2nd September 1939, and after the completion of 22 years' service, reckoned as for re-assessment purposes under this Section, and will be assessed as follows:—

For each complete year of such service 9d. a week

For each complete year of such service spent in the rank of Petty Officer (or equivalent rank) or above, an additional 3d. a week

The grant of this supplement will not preclude the grant of age additions or pensions increase on the original pension, but the supplement will not itself be increasable under Orders-in-Council of 28th September 1944 and 2nd April 1947.

"104. A pensioner to whom this Section applies may at any time be required to make a final choice between a re-assessed pension under Clauses 97 to 101, or the continuance of his former award under Clause 102 increased as may be under Clause 103.

"105. The Admiralty may fix a date, service after which will not be reckonable for the purpose of re-assessment, or of supplement of pension, under this Section. A pensioner continuing to serve after the date so fixed will thereafter be dealt with under the regulations currently applicable to his case.

"SECTION XI

"Supplemental Service of Naval Ratings and Royal Marines

"106. This Section relates to Naval Ratings and Royal Marines serving on regular engagements who have undertaken to complete a period of three years supplemental service under Order-in-Council No. 98 A.N. of 15th May 1946, and is in substitution of the gratuity provisions laid down in paragraphs (b) 3 and (b) 4 of that Order.

"107. Such a rating or Royal Marine will be regarded as having entered into his period of supplemental service on the day following that on which his engagement current at the time he signed his undertaking expires, or should he before that day

have executed a further regular engagement, or re-engagement, on the day following the expiry date of that further engagement or re-engagement.

"108. A naval rating or Royal Marine who completes his period of supplemental service will, on his discharge or transfer to the Reserve, be paid a gratuity of £75, being £25 in respect of each year of such service.

"109. A Naval rating or Royal Marine who is invalided or is compulsorily discharged or transferred to the Reserve, otherwise than for misconduct or inefficiency, during the course of his supplemental service, will receive a gratuity at the rate of £25 a year, proportionate to the length of the supplemental service he has completed.

"110. A Naval rating or Royal Marine who is discharged at his own request before completing the full period of his supplemental service but after the satisfactory completion of at least one year thereof, may be granted at discretion a gratuity at the rate of £25 for each complete year of supplemental service, plus for any remaining period of less than a year, £25 reduced by £3 for each month or part of a month by which the broken period falls short of a complete year.

"111. Where a Naval rating or Royal Marine is discharged on account of misconduct or inefficiency the gratuity in respect of supplemental service may be withheld or reduced, at the discretion of the Admiralty.

"112. A Naval rating or Royal Marine qualified for a service gratuity under Section IX will be eligible for that gratuity in addition to his gratuity for supplemental service, except that the period for which a gratuity for supplemental service is given shall be excluded in computing its amount. For the purpose of this exclusion the sum of £10 shall be regarded as accruing, by way of service gratuity, for each reckonable year from the sixth to the tenth inclusive. Service gratuity so calculated may be awarded to the normal maximum of £200, in addition to the gratuity in respect of supplemental service.

"113. A Naval rating or Royal Marine who on discharge or transfer to the Reserve after entering into his supplemental service is eligible for a service pension if his supplemental service is included, may elect to count such service for pension, in which case no gratuity will be payable. He must exercise the option in respect of the whole period of his supplemental service.

"114. A Naval rating or Royal Marine who has sufficient service to entitle him to service pension even if his supplemental service is excluded, may be granted with effect from his discharge, either:—

"(a) the pension for which he is eligible assessed on his service before the beginning of his supplemental service, together with the gratuity admissible in respect of his supplemental service, or

"(b) a pension assessed on his total service, including his supplemental service, in which case no gratuity will be payable.

"115. Service in respect of which a supplemental service gratuity has been received may, if a man re-enters for further Naval or Royal Marine service, become reckonable for pension purposes subject to Clause 79.

"116. If a Royal Naval rating or Royal Marine dies during supplemental service, no gratuity is payable.

"SECTION XII

"Gratuities for Extended Service Engagements

"117. This Section relates to Naval ratings and Royal Marines undertaking in the Royal Navy or Royal Marines Extended Service engagements under Order-in-Council No. 98 A. N. of 15th May 1946, and is in substitution of the gratuity provisions laid down in paragraphs (a) 3, (a) 4, (a) 5 and (a) 6 of that Order.

"(i) Type A. Extended Service engagements of three or four years.

"(ii) Type B. Extended Service engagements of one or two years.

"118. Such a Naval rating or Royal Marine will on termination of full pay service on the satisfactory completion of his Extended Service engagement receive a gratuity calculated as follows:—

Type A. £25 for each year of service on the Extended Service engagement.

Type B. £20 for each year of service on the Extended Service engagement.

" 119. If he is invalided or compulsorily discharged otherwise than for misconduct or inefficiency, before completing the full period of his Extended Service engagement, he will receive a gratuity proportionate to the period of his Extended Service engagement which he has in fact completed.

" 120. If he is discharged at his own request before completing the full period of his Extended Service engagement, he may, provided he has satisfactorily completed at least one year's service on that engagement, receive a gratuity calculated as follows:—

Type A. £25 for each complete year of service on his Extended Service engagement, plus for any remaining period of less than a year, £25 reduced by £3 for each month or part of a month by which the broken period falls short of a complete year.

Type B. £20 for each complete year of service on his Extended Service engagement, plus for any remaining period of less than a year, £20 reduced by £2 8s. 0d. for each month or part of a month by which the broken period falls short of a complete year.

" 121. If he is discharged on account of inefficiency or misconduct, the gratuity in respect of Extended Service may be withheld or reduced at the discretion of the Admiralty.

" 122. If during the course of his Extended Service engagement, he elects to transfer to a normal regular engagement, he will not be eligible for a gratuity in respect of the service on his Extended Service engagement but a special gratuity of £25 may be paid to him at the date on which he would have completed his Extended Service engagement, but for his transfer. His service on an Extended Service engagement will be reckonable towards service pension or gratuity, subject to the normal rules and the special gratuity will not be recoverable under Clause 79.

" 123. A Naval or Royal Marine service pensioner who has undertaken Extended Service in direct continuation of his war service may elect:—

"(a) To continue to serve on the basis of pay plus unre-assessed Old Code pension, with entitlement on discharge to re-assessment of Old Code pension under Section X in respect of service on his Extended Service engagement as well as his war service. No payment of gratuity under Clause 118 will be allowed; or

"(b) To give up payment of pension during his Extended service, with entitlement on discharge to re-assessment of Old Code pension under Section X, on both his war and his Extended Service up to the date on which payment of pension ceases, with full pension increments under Clauses 71 and 72, for subsequent service during which pension is not drawn. No payment of gratuity under Clause 118 will be allowed; or

"(c) To continue to serve on the basis of pay plus unre-assessed Old Code pension with entitlement on discharge to the appropriate gratuity under Clause 118, and to re-assessment of Old Code pension under Section X on service up to date of commencement of his Extended Service engagement.

" 124. A Naval or Royal Marine service pensioner who re-enters the Royal Navy or Royal Marines on an Extended Service engagement after a break in service, may elect:—

"(a) To cease to draw pension during his further service, with eligibility on discharge for full pension, including any re-assessment under Section X, in respect of his service up to the date of his original release from war service, plus full pension increments under Clauses 71 and 72 for service during which pension is not drawn. No gratuity under Clause 118 will be payable, or

"(b) To have his Old Code pension re-assessed under Section X in respect of his service up to the date of his original release from war service, and to draw such pension in addition to pay during his Extended Service engagement. Service on the Extended Service engagement will not entitle the pensioner to any increase of pension, or to any gratuity under Clause 118.

" 125. A Naval rating or Royal Marine who on discharge from an Extended Service engagement is

eligible for a service pension if his service on that engagement is included, may elect to count such service for pension, in which case no gratuity will be payable. He must exercise this option in respect of the whole period of his service on his Extended Service engagement.

" 126. A Naval rating or Royal Marine who, not being already a pensioner, has sufficient service to entitle him to a service pension even if his service on an Extended Service engagement is excluded, will receive with effect from his discharge either:—

"(a) The gratuity in respect of his Extended Service engagement, and a pension assessed on his service before his Extended Service engagement; or

"(b) A pension assessed on his service including his service on an Extended Service engagement, in which case no gratuity will be payable in respect of that engagement.

" 127. Service on an Extended Service engagement in respect of which a gratuity has been received may, if the man re-enlists, become reckonable for pension purposes, subject to Clause 79.

" 128. If a Naval rating or Royal Marine dies while serving on an Extended Service engagement, a gratuity under this Section will not be admissible.

" SECTION XIII

" *Future Emergency Re-employment of Service Pensioners*

" 129. This Section relates to:—

"(a) Naval and Royal Marine pensioners recalled for service, during a period of general recall.

"(b) Other service pensioners who give further service (otherwise than on normal or Extended Service engagements) during a period of general recall to service on account of an emergency, or who are specially re-employed on full pay in anticipation of an imminent general recall.

This Section does not apply to R.N. Native pensioners, or other categories for which special provision is or may hereafter be made.

" 130. This Section may be brought into operation for such pensioners on such occasions and for such periods as the Admiralty may, in consultation with the Lords Commissioners of the Treasury, determine.

" 131. A service pensioner will, during periods of further service to which these provisions apply, continue to receive his service pension subject to the conditions normally attaching thereto.

" 132. On discharge or release from such service a service pensioner may, provided his service has been satisfactory and of at least six months' duration, receive an addition to his pension of half the difference between:—

"(a) The pension for which his previous service qualified him, or would have qualified him, on the scale set out in Clauses 71 and 72, and

"(b) The pension for which he would be eligible under the scale set out in those Clauses if his further service were added to his previous service.

" 133. An addition under Clause 132 may be granted although the existing pension was assessed under the regulations in force before 19th December 1945, whether by virtue of Clause 84 or Clause 102 or otherwise, and whether or not a supplement under Clause 103 was included. The addition so granted will not be increased under Orders-in-Council of 28th September, 1944 and 2nd April, 1947.

" 134. If service pensioners are employed with the Armed Forces of the British Commonwealth or Colonies, this Section may be applied to them, as if their further service had been with the Royal Navy or the Royal Marines.

" SECTION XIV

" *Naval ratings or Royal Marines serving on regular engagements continuing in service during a future emergency*

" 135. The following Clause will be brought into operation on such occasions, being periods of general recall to service on account of emergency, as the Admiralty may, in consultation with the Lords Commissioners of H.M. Treasury, determine, and in respect of each such occasion may fix a date from which it will come into operation and after which it will cease to apply.

" 136. A Naval rating or Royal Marine serving on a normal regular engagement while this Clause is

in operation, who completes 22 years' service reckonable for pension under Section VIII, may be allowed, with effect from the date of completion of 22 years' service, to receive an immediate award of service pension, calculated on 22 years' service. If he elects to receive pension while serving, he will thereafter be regarded for pension purposes as a re-employed pensioner under Section XIII."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS it appears to the Minister of Fuel and Power that new denominations of standards for the measurement of electricity agreeing with the fundamental electrical units specified in Part I of the schedule to this Order are required for use for trade:

And Whereas the said Minister has caused the denominations set out in Part III of the said schedule to be made and duly verified, and the coils and instruments referred to in the said Part III are deposited at the National Physical Laboratory at Teddington in the county of Middlesex:

And Whereas by the verification aforesaid it is established that the denominations aforesaid agree with the fundamental units aforesaid within the limits of accuracy attainable in the use of the said denominations, being the limits specified in Part III of the said schedule:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Him by section six of the Weights and Measures Act, 1889 (52 & 53 Vict. c. 21), and of all other powers Him enabling, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The several denominations of standards set out in Part II of the schedule to this Order are hereby approved as Board of Trade standards for the measurement of electricity for the purposes of the Weights and Measures Acts, 1878 to 1936.

2. The Order in Council made the tenth day of January, nineteen hundred and ten (S.R. & O. 1910 (No. 72) p. 845), legalising denominations of standards for the measurement of electricity as Board of Trade standards is hereby revoked.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of October, nineteen hundred and forty-nine, and may be cited as the Weights and Measures (Electrical Standards) Order, 1949.

SCHEDULE.

PART I.

Fundamental Units.

The fundamental electrical units are the units agreed as such at an international conference on electrical units and standards held in London in October, 1908, (the magnitude thereof being determined on the electromagnetic system of measurement, with reference to the centimetre as the unit of length, the gram as the unit of mass and the second as the unit of time) and comprising:—

- (a) the ohm, the unit of electrical resistance, the value thereof being one thousand million in terms of the centimetre and the second;
- (b) the ampere, the unit of electrical current, the value thereof being one tenth in terms of the centimetre, the gram and the second;
- (c) the volt, the unit of electromotive force, the value thereof being one hundred million in terms of the centimetre, the gram and the second.

PART II.

Denominations of Standards.

1. Electrical resistance; a standard of electrical resistance denominated one ohm, agreeing in value within the limits of accuracy specified in Part III with that of the fundamental unit in Part I (a), and

being the resistance between the copper terminals of the instrument marked "Board of Trade Ohm Standard Verified 1894 and 1909" to the passage of an unvarying electrical current, when the coil of insulated wire forming part of the instrument aforesaid is in all parts at a temperature of fourteen decimal nine degrees centigrade.

2. Electrical current; a standard of electrical current denominated one ampere, agreeing in value within the limits aforesaid with that of the fundamental unit in Part I (b), and being the current which is passing in and through the coils of wire forming part of the instrument marked "Board of Trade Ampere Standard Verified 1894 and 1909" when, on reversing the current in the fixed coils, the change in the forces acting on the suspended coil in its sighted position is exactly balanced by the force exerted by gravity in Teddington upon the iridio-platinum weight marked "A." and forming part of the said instrument.

3. Electrical pressure; a standard of electrical pressure denominated one volt, agreeing in value within the limits aforesaid with that of the fundamental unit in Part I (c), and being one hundredth part of the pressure which, when applied between the terminals forming part of the instrument marked "Board of Trade Volt Standard Verified 1894 and 1909 and 1948", causes that rotation of the suspended portion of the instrument which is exactly measured by the coincidence of the sighting wire with the image of the fiducial mark A before and after the application of the pressure, and with that of the fiducial mark B during the application of the pressure, these images being produced by the suspended mirror and observed by means of the eye piece.

PART III.

Limits of Accuracy.

The limits of accuracy attainable in the use of the standards denominated in Part II are—

- (a) for the ohm, within one hundredth part of one per cent.;
- (b) for the ampere, within one tenth part of one per cent.;
- (c) for the volt, within one tenth part of one per cent.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 8th day of July, 1949, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Church Commissioners, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of a share of and in the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the church and cure (hereinafter called 'the said united benefice') of Granby with Elton on the Hill in the diocese of Southwell:

"Whereas we are satisfied that the right of patronage of and presentation to the said united benefice is at present exercisable alternatively by William Noël Parr of Friary Chambers, Friar Lane, Nottingham, Esquire; and by the Bishop of Southwell for the time being:

"And whereas the said William Noël Parr desires to transfer the alternate right of patronage exercisable by him as aforesaid to the Bishop of Southwell for the time being and is consenting to this Scheme (in testimony whereof he has executed the same).

"And whereas we are satisfied that the transfer will tend to make better provision for the cure of souls:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Frank Russell, Bishop of Southwell, (in testimony whereof he has executed this Scheme), we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this

Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the share exercisable by the said William Noël Parr of and in the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said united benefice shall be transferred to the said Frank Russell, Bishop of Southwell, and his successors in the same Bishopric and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in the said Frank Russell, Bishop of Southwell, and his successors in the same Bishopric to the intent that the whole of the said advowson shall and may from time to time be exercised by the Bishop of Southwell for the time being."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:
