Pendennis, July 26.

His laft week came into this Port a veilel of 200 Tuns from Norway laden with Mafts and bound for *Leverpool*, as allo two French Veffels with Glass.

On Friday morning a Fleet of fhips passed in view of this place to the Wellwards, which we suppose to be that under the Command of Sir Iliomas Allen intended for the Spreights.

Moleo, Fune 23. Sir<sup>1</sup>Peter Wick, His Maiefly of Great Britains Envoye to this Court has been lately admitted to kis Audience by the Emperour, who used but little State, as being in mourning for his Emprels, whole loss the fill is very fentible of ; in teltimony thereof, every week he makes a vifue to her Tomb.

The Muscovites seem very jez'ous both of the Poles and Tartars. Natzoizkin is at Smolenske, observing the affairs of Poland, and is hoped has by this concluded a peace with that Kingdom.

The Tartars are in Imall bodies ranging about *Hkrania*, infomuch as there is no fafety left for palleigers through the Countrey.

• On Sunday last died the Emperours third Son, which has much encreased the fadness of this Court.

Stockholm, July 7. This day his Excellency the Earl of Carlife, Amballador from His Majefty of Great Britain, Went to a Noblemans house about a miles distance from this Town, with all his Train and Attendants in Order to his publick Entry, whicher were fent to him the Mafters of the Ceremonies, with one of the Admirals, and all the Kings and Queens Barges, who conducting him, he was in his pallage faluted by the Great Guns from feveral Sconces as allo by Six great men of War which were placed in the way on purpose for this solemnity , the Almira' giving him 8 Guns, and the reft 4 apiece ; at the p'ace of Landing, which Was under the Kings Caffle or Pallace, His Excellency was received and complimented at the thoat by two Senators, vig. Count Miss Brahe, fometimes Ambaffador in England, and the Baron Guldonftern, and by them and the Mafters of the Ceremonies received into one of the Kings Coaches, which with a great Train of others of the Nobility, all of them with Six Hotfes apiece attended him thorough the ffreets of the City, on both fides whereof were ranged the Bargers in Arms, (which was an Extraordinary Honour, not to be drawn into prelident for the futu. e, as being fomewhat inconfistent with an Order made in the last Diet or Parliament) together with His Mijelties Guards of Horfe and Foors and was lodged in a flately and richly furnishe new Pallsce belonging to General Wrangle : Friday n.xt is appointed for his Excellencies publick Audience.

Vinice, July 20. On Sunday last let fail from hence the Convoy under the Command of the Duke de la Mirandala, with above 2000 choice Italian Foot, a confiderable fimme of Moneys, and great quantities of Ammunition; abother Covoy is fitting up, and may within few days be ready to follow, upon whom are to be embatked 500 men which lie ready for the fame fervice, and the Count de Portla's Regiment of 900 men; which is lately arrived upon our Frontle's, and may in little time be expected upon our being allot to follow out of Germany upon the fare account.

Though we have no Letters directly from Candia, yet we have a confiltent reports that the Duke, de Besufort has landed a confiderable body of men at the befieged Town; and that the Vifier hath withdrawn his forces who'ly from the Sabienera; with a more united force to fland upon his Guard, and to form his attempts upon the more weakned fide of St. Andre 3 as allo that the Popes and Maltha Gadlies, with thole of France, were altogether at Zanze on the 24th of the laft moneth; intending to put to lea with all imaginable diligence in obelience to the Duke de Beauforts Orders which met them there.

By the way of Oiranto we are adviced, that the befoged in Candia had by their Cannon, broken one of the Enemies Pieces and *simounied* another, and were hard at work within the St. Andre for the making good their Retrenchment.

The Senate is now upon an Election of some honourable perfort to be sent into Paland with Compliments of Congratulation to the new King, and tis believed the choice will fall upon the Procurator Morofini.

On Tucíday last the Popes Nuncis attended the Colledge, letting them know, that whereas there was due to him the fum of 20 thouland Ducats arifing from the 400 000 which the Publick has already received for the fale of the Religious houses lately fuppreft, he was willing, out of his zealfor their fervice in the prefervation of *Candia*, to make the Republick a prefers of the faid fum, for which they returned him their Compliments and Thanks.

Hague, August 1. Secretary Coevert has lately prefented to the States two Memorials in the name of the Count de Benthem, with a Letter from the Count himfelf, earneitly prefling them for the return of his Lady and Children, and expoltulating for justice denyed him's to which the States are ordering a return to be made, utging, that they could not be well charged with injustice, fince he had not made any addresses for justice, nor alledged any Crime against his Lady, but affuring him they would endeavor to pertivade her to a return, upon condition, he would give fecutity for their liberty in point of Religion, and that the Children should not be prefled in that particular, till they arrived at 18 years of age.

The States having taken into their confideration the many evils which feem to hang over and threaten this Republick, have orderd that a publick day of Faft and Humiliation shall be observed in all places of the *United Provin*esson the 21 of August New Stile next enfucing.

The Admiralties having confidered the great diffurbance of their Trade in the Mediterranean and other places by realon of the many Turkish ships which are continually plying from the coalts of Barbary, have made their addresses to the Sates upon this point, humbly defiring, a squadron of their ships may be speedily futed up to clear the leas from those Cortairs, the whole matter where of, is referred to the confideration of several Commitsioners.

Hague, Augast 5. The Province of Hollarid has propoled the inconveniencies of having two Mareshals of the Camp, looking on it as an innovation contrary to the eufrome of former times, defiring that one of them may be laid afide, but whither that of Marshal Wurts or Prince Maurice of Mussian, may admit of lome dispute.

The Trea y of Accord with the Grown of Portugal being fully concluded and figne i by both parties, the Portugal Ambifiadon may in little time take his leave in Order to his return home, and some person be emploied for pay 4 ment of what is thereby adjudged due to the States.
