Pendennis, July 26.

THis last week came into this Port a vessel of 200 Tuns from Norway laden with Masts and bound for Liverpool, as also two French Vessels with Glafs.

On Friday morning a Fleet of ships passed in view of this place to the Westwards, which we suppose to be that under the Command of Sir Thomas Allen intended for the Streights.

Mosco, June 23. Sir Peter Wich, His Majesty of Great Britains Envoye to this Court has been lately admitted to his Audience by the Emperour, who used but little State, as being in mourning for his Empress, whose loss he still is very sensible of; in testimony thereof, every week he makes a visit to her Tomb.

The Muscovites seem very jealous both of the Poles and Tartars. *Narouzhin* is at *Smolensko*, observing the affairs of Poland, and is hoped has by this concluded a peace with that Kingdom.

The Tartars are in small bodies ranging about *Ukraina*, inasmuch as there is no safety left for passengers through the Country.

On Sunday last died the Emperours third Son, which has much encreased the sadness of this Court.

Stockholm, July 7. This day his Excellency the Earl of Carlise, Ambassador from His Majesty of Great Britain, went to a Nobleman's house about a miles distance from this Town, with all his Train and Attendants in Order to his publick Entry, whither were sent to him the Masters of the Ceremonies, with one of the Admirals, and all the Kings and Queens Barges, who conducting him, he was in his passage saluted by the Great Guns from several Sconces as also by Six great men of War which were placed in the way on purpose for this solemnity, the Admirals giving him 8 Guns, and the rest 4 apiece; at the place of Landing, which was under the Kings Castle or Palace, His Excellency was received and complimented at the Quay by two Senators, viz. Count *Nils Brahe*, sometimes Ambassador in England, and the Baron *Guldenstern*, and by them and the Masters of the Ceremonies received into one of the Kings Coaches, which with a great Train of others of the Nobility, all of them with Six Horses apiece attended him thorough the streets of the City, on both sides whereof were ranged the Barges in Arms, (which was an Extraordinary Honour, not to be drawn into precedent for the future, as being somewhat inconsistent with an Order made in the last Diet or Parliament) together with His Majesties Guards of Horse and Foot, and was lodged in a stately and richly furnished new Palace belonging to General *Wrangle*: Friday next is appointed for his Excellencies publick Audience.

Venice, July 20. On Sunday last set sail from hence the Convoy under the Command of the Duke de la *Mirandola*, with above 2000 choice Italian Foot, a considerable summe of Moneys, and great quantities of Ammunition; another Convoy is fitting up, and may within few days be ready to follow, upon whom are to be embarked 500 men which heretofore for the same service, and the Count de *Fortis*'s Regiment of 900 men; which is lately arrived upon our Frontiers, and may in little time be expected here, 1200 more being also to follow out of Germany upon the same account.

Though we have no Letters directly from *Candia*, yet we have a consent report, that the Duke de *Beaufort* has

landed a considerable body of men at the besieged Town; and that the Visier hath withdrawn his forces wholly from the *Sabionera*, with a more united force to stand upon his Guard, and to form his attempts upon the more weakened side of *St. Andre*; as also that the Popes and Malthe Gallies, with those of France, were altogether at *Zante* on the 24th of the last month; intending to put to sea with all imaginable diligence in obedience to the Duke de *Beaufort*'s Orders which met them there.

By the way of *Oiranto* we are advised, that the besieged in *Candia* had by their Cannons, broken one of the Enemies Pieces and dismounted another, and were hard at work within the *St. Andre* for the making good their Retrenchment.

The Senate is now upon an Election of some honourable person to be sent into Poland with Compliments of Congratulation to the new King, and tis believed the choice will fall upon the Procurator *Morofini*.

On Tuesday last the Popes Nuncio attended the Colledge, letting them know, that whereas there was due to him the sum of 20 thousand Ducats arising from the 400 000 which the Publick has already received for the sale of the Religious houses lately suppressed, he was willing, out of his zeal for their service in the preservation of *Candia*, to make the Republick a present of the said sum, for which they returned him their Compliments and Thanks.

Hague, August 1. Secretary *Cœvert* has lately presented to the States two Memorials in the name of the Count de *Benthem*, with a Letter from the Count himself, earnestly pressing them for the return of his Lady and Children, and exprolulating for justice denied him; to which the States are ordering a return to be made, urging, that they could not be well charged with injustice, since he had not made any addresses for justice, nor alledged any Crime against his Lady, but assuring him they would endeavor to persuade her to a return, upon condition, he would give security for their liberty in point of Religion, and that the Children should not be pressed in that particular, till they arrived at 18 years of age.

The States having taken into their consideration the many evils which seem to hang over and threaten this Republick, have ordered that a publick day of Fast and Humiliation shall be observed in all places of the United Provinces on the 21 of August New stile next ensuing.

The Admiralties having considered the great disturbance of their Trade in the Mediterranean and other places by reason of the many Turkish ships which are continually plying from the coasts of *Barbary*, have made their addresses to the States upon this point, humbly desiring, a Squadron of their ships may be speedily fitted up to clear the sea from those Corsairs, the whole matter whereof, is referred to the consideration of several Commissioners.

Hague, August 5. The Province of Holland has proposed the inconveniencies of having two Marshalls of the Camp, looking on it as an innovation contrary to the custom of former times, desiring that one of them may be laid aside, but whether that of Marshal *Wurts* or Prince *Maurice of Nassau*, may admit of some dispute.

The Treaty of Accord with the Crown of Portugal being fully concluded and signed by both parties, the Portugall Ambassador may in little time take his leave in Order to his return home, and some person be employed for payment of what is thereby adjudged due to the States.

The East India Company are informed, that their East India ships were upon the Coasts, viz. four from *Ceylon*,
