Reme, November 25. The Work begun by Pope Innocent XII. for carrying fresh Water from the Mountain of Tolff's, by the means of an Aqueduct 22 Miles long, to Civita Vecchia, is at length finished, by the Care of Cardinal Pansilio, who had the Direction of that Work. The Difference between Cardinal Grimini and the Spanish Ambassador growing every day wider, to that the Consequence seemed very dangerous, the Pope, to prevent any Inconveniencies, cau-fed feveral Guards of Soldiers to be posted about the Town, particularly one of 300 Men near the Ambastador's House, who complaining of it to the Secretary of State, was answered, That it could not be taken off while he kept such a number of Men in Arms near him, as endangered the Publick Pence: He thereupon offered to dismiss them, if the Cardinal would do the like which the latter baring conferred. do the like, which the latter having confented to ; that Point being once gained, the Matter in dispute between them was soon adjusted by the Mediation of the Venetian Ambassador, to the great Satisfaction of this Court, which this Affair had made very uneafie. Some days ago, at the opening of the Gates of this City, above 150 Neapolitans offered to come in; The Dispute we have just now mentioned was not ended at that time, so it was thought these Men might be sent for by one of the contending Parties; and their number besides giving good grounds of Suspicion that they came upon some ill De-sign, they were denied entrance; And Orders were given, that for the future the Gates should be shut at Sunfer, and not opened till Sunrife; and that great Care should be taken to examine all Persons coming in. It is much discoursed here, that the Pope, after his Journey to Loretta. will proceed to Savey, and that the French King will come thither, in order to have an Interview

Genoua, November 25. The Galleys of this State returned into this Port the 17th Instant, The Galleys of this having attended the King of Spain as far as Fa-do. The Prince of Vaulemont, who came hither with him, immediately after his Departure returned to his Government of Milin; but the Duke of Mantus continues here. The Flushing Capers which cruize in these Seas, have within this week brought two rich French Prizes, whereof one is valued at 70000 Crowns, into Leghorn, and a third into this Port. By Letters from Carbonara of the 12th Inflant we have an Account, That Prince Eugene arrived there the night before with his Army, having prevented the Delign of the Duke of Vindofne, who, when he decamped from Luzzara, marched in great hast towards Mirandola, and other Places where the Germans intended to take their Winter Quarters, with intent to ravage the Country, and make it impossible for them to subsist there: But Prince Eugene got there before him. and the two Armies were once to near, that a Battel must have ensued, if the Duke of Vendosme had not desisted from his Enterprise, and

retired rowards Guafalls, from whence he fent his Army into Winter Quarters, which had greatly suffered by this long and precipitate Murch, at a time when both the Weather and the Ways were extreamly bad. Prince Eugene visited Mirandela and Final, which Places he ordered should be fortified, and gave the necessary Directions for fecuring the other Towns, where he defigned his Troops should quarter, and then took his head Quarters at Carbonara, intending to continue there this Winter:
Cologne, December 15. The States of this

Archbishoprick met here the 6th Instant, and a Subfidy was demanded of them for the Subfi-flence of the Troops which the Chapter has taken into Pay, and for other necessary Expences, which they have taken into Confideration, and have given their Approbation of the Resolution of the Chapter, to take upon them the Administration of the Government, as if the Archbishoprick was vacant, in pursuance of a Letter which the Emperor has writ to them to that purpose. The Elector of Cologne has also writ to Chapter, forbidding them to meddle with the Government; but little Notice is taken of it. We have an Account, That the French have feized the Dutchy of Lorrain, the Count de Tallard having marched to Nancy with the Troops under his Command, and forced the Gates of that City, into which he has put a Garison of 6000 Men. The Duke of Lorrain happened to be abroad a Hunting: It is faid, he is now retired with the Dutchess to Luneville. The Troops of Heffe have taken Post in the Hunsfrag below Tracebach, which Place they have in a manner block'd up. Three Regiments of Hussars have taken Quarters along the Moselle. The Marquis of Blainville was expected yesterday at Triers with 5000 Fremb Forces, which are to remain in Gariton there.

Falmouth, December 12. Two Dutch Privateers came in here the 8th Instant, with each a French Prize, one a Ship of about 150 Tuns and 12 Guns, richly laden with Sugar, Indigo, Coco, &c. from the West-Indies, and the other a Banker laden with Fish. Her Majesty's Ship the Rye is now passing before this Harbour, with several

Ships under her Convoy, bound up the North Chanel to Ireland, Cheffer, and Levergool.

Plimenth, December 13. On the 9th Instant came in here the John and Abigail of London, Thomas Thompson Master, bound home from Montserrat. The same day sailed the Blosson Galley, Robert Williams Master, for Venice; as also the Mary Galley, William Young Master, and the Margaret, Benjamin Fisher Master, both of London, and bound for Leghorn; but the last is since returned hither, by reason of the contrary Winds. On the 11th came into this Port the St. Anthony of Oporto, bound home from Topsham.

The Scarborough of Lon-Cowes. December 13. don, Joshua Roydhouse Master, bound for the Streights; and the Thomas and Elizabeth, John Fell Master, came in here the 11th Instant from the Downes, from whence came in also yesterday the Betty, John Luke Master, bound for Guinea.

Briftol, Dec. 14. Yesterday arrived here the Hope of this Port, Ric. Davies Master, from Newfoundland, but last from Topsham; the James from Stamford, and the Joseph Sloop, from Cork.
