RECRUITMENT UNDER NORMAL REGULATIONS OF VETERINARY INSPECTORS, RESEARCH OFFICERS AND ASSISTANT VETERINARY INVESTIGATION OFFICERS

IN THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES. 1. Age. Candidates must be at least 23 and under 32 years of age on 1st January, 1949. But a candidate

32 years of age on is January, 1949. But a candidate who has served or is serving on a regular (including a regular short service) engagement in H.M., Forces may for this purpose deduct the period of such service from his actual age. 2. Sex and Marriage.—(i) Both men and women may compete under these Regulations. (ii) Married women who have formerly been established Civil Service and have formerly been

established Civil Servants and have drawn marriage gratuity (other than those who are widows or divorced or who are separated from their husbands, or whose husbands suffer without hope of recovery from total physical or mental incapacity) will not be eligible unless they undertake to refund on appointment the marriage gratuity paid.

3. Nationality.—Candidates must be British sub-cts. They must also satisfy one of the following iects. conditions:

(a) If natural born British subjects, they must either

(i) have at least one parent who is, or was at death, a British subject; or
(ii) have resided in His Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their approximant appointment.

(b) If naturalised British subjects, they must have resided in His Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the

been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment. (c) If not qualified under (a) or (b) of this para-graph, they must satisfy the Commissioners that they are so closely connected with His Majesty's dominions either by ancestry, upbringing, or resi-dence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in their favour.

exception may properly be made in their favour. 4. Qualification.—(a) Candidates for appointment as Veterinary Inspector must have graduated as Members of the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons and have had at least one year's practical experience in some recognised branch of the veterinary profession after graduation. (b) Candidates for appointment as Research Officer or Assistant Veterinary Investigation Officer should normally be Members of the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons but in exceptional cases this gualification may be dispensed with in view of the special requirements of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries and the special qualifications of a candidate. Preference will be given to those candi-dates who have had post-graduate experience in laboratory research work or in some other recognised branch of the Veterinary Profession. 5. Health and Character.—Successful candidates

6. Competition.—The Commissioners may summon to appear before a Selection Board all who are found to be prima facie eligible, or may if they are for to be prima facie eligible, or may, if they see fit, summon only those whose qualifications and ex-perience are considered to be most suitable. The Selection Board will take into consideration the candidates' record of experience and education, any recommendation from persons named by the candirecommendation from persons named by the candi-dates as having direct knowledge of their work, and the personal qualities of the candidates as shown at, the interview : and on their estimation of all the, above facts they will frame their recommendations. The decision of the Commissioners, will be final.

7. Candidates trained as Teachers.—Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate central education authority (e.g. the Ministry of Education, the Scottish Educa-tion Department, the Ministry of Education for Northern Ireland) has been notified to the Commissioners Commissioners.
