Hamburgh, Dec. 15. N. S. The Count de Guldenlew, who has the chief Command of the Danish Forces which are employed in the Emperor's Service in Italy, arrived here from thence yesterday, in his way to Copenhagn. We hear Mon-fieur Du Heron, the French Envoy, is brought with a Guard from Thoorn to Koningstein, to be conveyed from thence to the Frontiers of the French King's Dominions, where he will be fet at liberty. The King of Poland has appointed the Baron of Schrylenberg to command the Troops which he has lately put into the Emperor's Service; to whom, as it is reported, he offers two Regiments more. They write from Theorn, That the Cardinal Primate was shortly expected in that Place, where his Presence would be very necessary in the Great Council of the Polish Nobility which is assembled there, to consider of the present Posture of their Affairs, and of the best Means to restore the Passer in Peace in those Parts; And that the Weywode of Massovia, who is the first of the Deputies appointed to attend the King of Sweden in the Name of the Republick, with Offers of their Mediation, and several Deputies from the Lesse-Mediation, and feveral Deputies from the Leffe-Poland, were also coming to Theory, in order to affift at that Assembly. Letters from Warfame bring Advice, That a Body of Six thousand of the Swedish Troops was arrived in the neighbourhood of that Place, and that the King of Sweden in Person was following with the rest of his Army; and it is said he invends to pur-fue his first Design. of taking Winter Ousters fue his first Delign, of taking Winter Quarters in Profix. The Hards Galley, a Privateer, is also come in here from cruizing, which has lately taken and fencinco Plimouth a Swedijh Ship laden with Counterband Goods, and bound for

Bristel. Dec. 19. The Exchange Galley belonging to this Port, Nicholas Burroughs Maiter, arrived here yesterday morning from Nevus, having been 6 weeks and 4 days in his Passage. He gives an Account, That about the latter end of October last, Colonel Codrington, Governor of Her Majesty's Leeward Islands, received Advice by a Sloop which came from Jamaica, That Commadore Wherstone, on Board Her Majesty's Ship the Canterbury, with two other Men of War and a Fireship, had taken on the South side of Hispaniola, near the Island of Ash, a Spanish Galeon, richly laden, and had carried her to Jamaica. The Master adds, That Vice-Admiral Bembow had taken and destroyed 26 of the Enemy's Ships, and had ruined several of their Settlements in those Parts; The Privateers fitted out by the English in the Leeward Mands were sail'd to the Spanish Continent; The French had fitted out several Privateers at Martinico, which had taken 14 Prizes.

Conves, Dec. 19. Yesterday a Privateer of Flushing, of 18 Guns, brought in hither a Prize called the Dinant of Dunkirk, of 24 Guns and 6 Patereroes, of about 200 Tuns Burthen richly laden, and bound home from Marselles, which he took off Morlaix, after a short Dispute, wherein the Captain of the French Ship was
