Westminster, Dec. 23.

**T**His Day Her Majesty came to the House of Peers, and being seated on the Throne in Her Royal Robes, with the usual Solemnity, Sir David Mitchell Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, by Her Majesty's Command, went to the House of Commons, to require their Attendance in the House of Peers, whither they came accordingly; and then Her Majesty was pleased to give the Royal Assent to

An Act for Granting to Her Majesty a Land-Tax, for carrying on the War against France and Spain.

And to Two Private Acts.

Great-Britain, Dec. 11. N. S. Three Regiments of the Emperor's Forces marched lately through this Place towards the Moselle, to joyn the Forces of the Elector Palatine, and those of Lunenburg and Hesse-Cassel, which are drawing nearer towards Frankfort, in order to streighten the Garrison of that Place; and we hear that is already done in such manner, that the French dare not send out any Parties from thence, the few that have ventured of late to go abroad being fallen into the hands of the Confederate Forces, so that most of them were killed or taken Prisoners. The Landgrave of Hesse-Cassel has put a Garrison of 1500 Men into Rheinfelds, and they are fortifying that Place with all possible diligence, for which purpose the County about it is obliged to furnish a great number of Palisadoes, and other necessaries; Care is also taken to provide the magazines there with a numerous Artillery, and sufficient quantity of Ammunition and Provisions, for its Defence. The Parties of the Imperial Forces quartered in these Parts makeursions into the Bishoprick of Metz, with very good Success.

Hadelberg, December 12. The Margrave of Bareith is at present at Nuremberg, drawing together a Body of the Forces of the Circle of Franconia, and several Imperial Regiments, which were going to Winter Quarters, have received Orders to join them, in order, as is supposed, to make some Attempt against the Elector of Bavaria. We hear, that Elector demands 50000 Guilders, by way of Contribution, from the City of Augsburg: In the mean time his Forces be-

gin to complain for want of their Pay, which is said to be occasioned by the failure of some Remittances of Money that were expected from France, which makes the Court of Bavaria very uneasy. It is said, the Emperor will considerably augment his Army on the Rhine next Summer, by taking into his Service the Forces of several Princes of the Empire, besides what further Assistance may be expected from the several Circles of the Empire, in pursuance of the Resolutions of the Imperial Diet. The French Forces which were quartered about Sabern are removed nearer to Strasburg; They have quitted Reischaffen, a small Town, whereof they had possessed themselves, not far from Haguenau; But they still keep strong Garrisons in this last Place, and at Bisweiler, for the better Security of their Winter Quarters.

Hamburgh, Dec. 15. N. S. The Count de Guldenlew, who has the chief Command of the Danish Forces which are employed in the Emperor's Service in Italy, arrived here from thence yesterday, in his way to Copenhagen. We hear Monsieur Du Heron, the French Envoy, is brought with a Guard from Thoon to Koningsstein, to be conveyed from thence to the Frontiers of the French King's Dominions, where he will be set at liberty. The King of Poland has appointed the Baron of Schrylenberg to command the Troops which he has lately put into the Emperor's Service; to whom, as it is reported, he offers two Regiments more. They write from Thoon, That the Cardinal Primate was shortly expected in that Place, where his Presence would be very necessary in the Great Council of the Polish Nobility which is assembled there, to consider of the present Posture of their Affairs, and of the best Means to restore the Peace in those Parts; And that the Weywode of Massovia, who is the first of the Deputies appointed to attend the King of Sweden in the Name of the Republick, with Officers of their Mediation, and several Deputies from the Lesser Poland, were also coming to Thoon, in order to assist at that Assembly. Letters from Warsaw bring Advice, That a Body of Six thousand of the Swedish Troops was arrived in the neighbourhood of that Place, and that the King of Sweden in Person was following with the rest of his Army; and it is said he intends to pursue his first Design, of taking Winter Quarters in Prussia. We have an Account from Cowland, that the Signer Ogizark, who has been some time with his Troops in Quarters of Refreshment in that Country, is marched back into Samogitia.

*Falmouth, Dec. 19.* This day arrived here the *Tiger* of London, *William Harris* Master, being come in 12 weeks from the Coast of *Guinea*, with a Rich Cargo of Gold Dust, Elephant's Teeth, &c. The *Hardy* Galley, a Privateer, is also come in here from cruising, which has lately taken and sent into *Plimouth* a Swedish Ship laden with Counterband Goods, and bound for *France*.

*Bristol, Dec. 19.* The Exchange Galley belonging to this Port, *Nicholas Barroughs* Master, arrived here yesterday morning from *Nevis*, having been 6 weeks and 2 days in his Passage. He gives an Account, That about the latter end of *October* last, Colonel *Codrington*, Governor of Her Majesty's Leeward Islands, received Advice by a Sloop which came from *Jamaica*, That *Commadore Whetstone*, on Board Her Majesty's Ship the *Canterbury*, with two other Men of War and a Fire-ship, had taken on the South side of *Hispaniola*, near the Island of *Ash*, a Spanish Galeon, richly laden, and had carried her to *Jamaica*. The Master adds, That Vice-Admiral *Bombow* had taken and destroyed 26 of the Enemy's Ships, and had ruined several of their Settlements in those Parts; The Privateers fitted out by the *English* in the Leeward Islands were sail'd to the *Spanish* Continent; The *French* had fitted out several Privateers at *Martinico*, which had taken 14 Prizes.

*Carves, Dec. 19.* Yesterday a Privateer of *Flushing*, of 18 Guns, brought in hither a Prize called the *Dinant* of *Dunkirk*, of 24 Guns and 6 Patereroes, of about 200 Tuns Burthen, richly laden, and bound home from *Marseilles*, which he took off *Morlaix*, after a short Dispute, wherein the Captain of the *French* Ship was killed.

*St. James's, Dec. 23.* Her Majesty has been pleas'd to appoint the Rt. Hon. *Hugh Lord Cholmondely* to be Lord Lieutenant of the Counties of *Denbigh, Montgomery, Flint, Merioneth, Carnarvan, and Anglesea*.

Her Majesty has likewise been pleas'd to appoint the Rt. Hon. *James Earl of Derby* to be Lord Lieutenant of the County of *Lancaster*.

Her Majesty has also appointed the Rt. Hon. *Scroope Earl of Bridgewater* to be Lord Lieutenant of the County of *Bucks*.
