(RECONSTRUCTION AREA NO. 3) DECLARATORY
ORDER, 1949.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Minister of Town and Country Planning in pursuance of the powers vested in him by Section 1 of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1944, on the 21st day of September, 1949, made an Order declaring the land situate at Kingston upon Hull and described in the Schedule hereto, which land is shown on the map referred to in the Order, to be subject to compulsory purchase for the purposes of dealing satisfactorily with extensive war damage by laying out afresh and redeveloping the area as a whole.

A copy of the Order and of the Map have been deposited at Room 39, Town Clerk's Department, Guildhall, Kingston upon Hull and will be open for inspection by all persons interested without payment of fee between the hours of 10 a.m. and 5 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays and between the hours of 10 a.m. and noon on Saturdays.

SCHEDULE.

An area bounded in part by Cleveland Street. Thence westwards along Eagle Terrace and Lime Street then behind properties fronting Lime Street. Thence eastwards along Jenning Street to its junction with Cleveland Street and New Cleveland Street. Thence eastwards along St. Mark Street for a distance of approximately 170 feet. Thence northwards immediately to the east of properties fronting Cleveland Street crossing Church Row and Sitwell Street then to the rear of the properties on the south side of Cheapside. Thence eastwards to the eastern boundary of the properties fronting Cheapside, thence northwards to Cheapside. Thence westwards to Providence Place. Thence in a northerly direction along Providence Place. Thence westwards to Cleveland Street where the description began, excluding all operational land occupied by Statutory Undertakings as delineated on the map.

An area bounded in part by Hodgson Street. Thence southwards along Lime Street to its junction with Spyvee Street. Thence eastwards along Spyvee Street to its junction with New Cleveland Street. Thence northwards along New Cleveland Street to its junction with Hodgson Street where the descrip-

tion began, excluding all operational land occupied by Statutory Undertakings as delineated on the map. Dated the 11th day of October, 1949.

BRITISH ELECTRICITY AUTHORITY.

ELECTRIC LIGHTING ACT, 1909.

NOTICE is hereby given that an application has been made by the British Electricity Authority to the Minister of Fuel and Power for his consent under Section 2 of the Electric Lighting Act, 1909, as amended by the Electricity Act, 1947, to the construction of a new Generating Station on a site of about 700 acres at Drakelow in the Rural District of Repton, near Burton-upon-Trent, designed for an ultimate capacity of 540,000 kW., to comprise initially:—

A. The installation of:—

(a) Two turbo-alternator sets each of 60,000 kW. capacity, complete with the necessary ancillary plant, and

(b) Two boiler units each having an evaporative capacity of 515,000 lbs. of steam per hour, complete with the necessary ancillary plant.

B. The construction of one reinforced concrete cooling tower, the necessary buildings and civil engineering works.

This new station forms part of the British Electricity Authority's reconstruction programme. Plans showing the layout have been deposited for public inspection at the Offices of the Clerk of the Repton Rural District Council, The Poplars, Rolleston Road, Burton-upon-Trent.

If any owners or lessees of property situate within 300 yards of the site above referred to wish to state objections to the application, they must do so by registered letter addressed to the Secretary, Ministry of Fuel and Power, Electricity Division, Cromwell House, Millbank, S.W.1, within thirty days from the date hereof, and a copy of the objection must be addressed to me.
