**A**N Expres arrived here yesterday from Antibes, with Advice of the King of Spain's being come thither from Genoua, in his way to this Place; whereupon his Servants and Coaches were immediately sent away to Catalonia, to meet him on those Frontiers. Orders are sent to Andalusia to fortify several Places on that Coast; And Directions are also given, that Provision be made for the Security of our Frontiers on the side of Portugal, the Warlike Preparations which that King is making, giving great jealousy to this Court.

Venice, December 1. The Senate has made choice of Signior *Andrea Cornaro* to have the chief Command of their Fleet, and of Signior *Bartolo Erizzo* to be Proveditore Extraordinary of their Territories beyond the *Mincio*. Signior *Justiniano*, who is appointed to be Bayle or Ambassador in Ordinary from this Republick to the *Ottoman Porte*, is on his Departure thither. The Imperial and the French Armies in *Lombardy* are making Lines, and fortifying several Places, in order to secure their Winter Quarters from the Attempts of each other. Prince *Eugene* has taken his Quarters at *Carbonara*, and has posted considerable Bodies of his Troops at *Mirondola* and *Finale de Modena*. The French have sent 3400 Horse and 1500 Foot to quarter in the *Parnesan*, and obliged the Inhabitants of that Country to furnish them with many Necessaries, which Imposition is much complained of, but the French being the strongest, the others are forced to submit. Letters from *Milan* say, that the Prince of *Vaudemont* was returned thither from *Genoua*, where he had taken Leave of the King of *Spain*, who has continued him for three years longer in the Government of the *Dutchy of Milan*, and considerably augmented his Pension. That Prince has sent the *Marquis de Rusta* to the *Cremonese*, with Orders to the Inhabitants of that *Dutchy*, to furnish a certain quantity of Corn, for the use of the French Forces, besides the heavy Taxes which they are obliged to pay towards carrying on the War, which occasions a great deal of murmuring.

Francfort, December 13. New Levies are making here to recruit the Forces which this City is obliged to furnish towards making up the Quota of the Circle of the *Upper Rhine*. The News which we lately received. That the

French have seized the Town of *Nancy*, notwithstanding the Promises which that King had made to the Duke of *Lorraine*, that he should be permitted to observe an exact Neutrality, and should receive no Disturbance from his Troops, would have been very surprizing, if there were not so many Instances that the French Court makes very little scruple of breaking their Treaties and other Engagements with that House. The Count *de Tallard*, who was employed in this Expedition, has left most of his Forces in and about *Nancy*, to which Place, it is said, the French intend to add new Fortifications, and to make it their chief Magazine of Warlike Stores, for the use of their Forces on this side: The Count *de Tallard* afterwards returned to *Metz* with the rest of his Troops, from whence he is since gone to the French Court, to receive further Directions. They write from *Spire*, that 4 Imperial Regiments of Horse, and two of Dragoons, are marched to the Palatinate, and will be posted towards the Rivers *Saar* and *Moselle*; and that two Regiments of Imperial Cuirassiers are marching towards the *Neckar*. Several Regiments of the Elector Palatine and the Landgrave of *Hesse Cassel's* Forces are quartered in the *Hornstrug*, where they have been joined by some Regiments of Imperial Horse.

Cologne, Dec. 15. N. S. The Emperors last Mandate against the Elector of *Cologne* has been published here, containing in substance, That his Imperial Majesty had hoped that the Elector would have hearkened to his Admonitions, and would, in obedience to his Imperial Mandates and Avocatoria, have departed from his unlawful Engagements with the Enemies of his Country; But the said Elector, (instead of returning to his Duty, and following the Example of the other Electors and Princes of the Empire, in complying with the Resolutions lately taken by the Imperial Diet at *Ratisbonne*;) having given fresh Instances of his evil Intentions, not only by declaring, That he would expose his Life and Goods rather than depart from his new Alliances, but also by delivering up to the Enemy the Towns and Countries which God, the Emperor, and the Empire had entrusted into his hands;

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hands; by quitting *Bon*, the Place of his usual Residence, and by departing out of his Electorate of *Cologne*, and Principality of *Liege*, and putting himself into the hands of the common Enemy, leaving the Administration of his Dominions to his pernicious Councillor *John Frederick Karrigh*. The Emperor therefore has thought fit to issue this Mandate against the said Elector, whereby he discharges his Subjects from their Allegiance to him, and puts the Administration of the Archbishoprick of *Cologne*, and its Dependencies, into the hands of the Chapter of that Cathedral, in like manner as if the See of the said Archbishoprick was vacant, forbidding the said Elector's Subjects to obey him, or assist him with Money or otherwise, on the Penalties mentioned in the Imperial Avocatoria, and in the Declaration of War, lately published in the name of the Empire, against the *French King*, the Duke of *Anjou*, and their Adherents.

The Chapter of *Cologne* has likewise published a Mandate, setting forth, That the Elector of *Cologne* has taken up Arms without the Consent of the Chapter, and delivered up his Territories to a Foreign Power, in contempt of the Admonitions and Commands of the Emperor, and of the Constitutions and Laws of the Empire, thereby making his Country the Seat of War, and bringing his People under the greatest Calamities: That the Regency of the Archbishoprick, during his Absence, belongs of Right to the Chapter, according to the hereditary Union, and other ancient Constitutions of the Empire, which the Elector himself has sworn to observe: That the Elector has, notwithstanding the said Union and Constitutions, left the Administration of the Government to his Minister *Karrigh*, by a Commission dated the 12th of *October* last; And that the Chapter not being able to bear any longer this manifest Violation of their Rights and Privileges, nor to suffer the Conduct of the said Elector, who acts in opposition to the fundamental Laws of the Empire, and in defiance of the Imperial Mandates and Avocatoria, does therefore hereby declare, That they are forced, to their great Sorrow, to take upon them the Regency of their forsaken Country, and enjoin all the Subjects of this Archbishoprick not to comply with any Orders that may come from *Bon*, in pursuance of the Commission above-men-

tioned, but to submit to the lawful Administration of them, the Chapter of the Archbishoprick of *Cologne*. The Revenues of this Archbishoprick are seized by Order of the Chapter, and will be employed in maintaining the Troops which they are obliged to keep on foot; and it is believed the States of this Country, who are now assembled here, will grant a Subsidy for raising more Forces. The Bishop of *Raab* was lately taken very ill on a sudden with a kind of an Apopleckick Fit, but is now pretty well recovered. We hear, the Elector of *Cologne's* Chancellor *Karrigh* is gone from *Bon*, to wait upon the Elector at *Dinant*. The Town of *Rhinberg* is so streightened by the Forces of the Allies that are quartered near it, that it is said the Garison begins to suffer for want of many Necessaries.

*Cowes*, December 23. This day came into our Road the *Dragon* of *London*, *John Bramble* Master, and the *Lion* of *Stockholm*, both bound for *Lisbon*.

*Yarmouth*, December 25. Her Majesty's Ship the *Margate* came into our Road the 22d Instant, with several Coisters, from *Hurwich*. The *Swan*, belonging to this Port, *John Cook* Master, sailed from hence this morning for *Leghorn*.
