The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of H.M. Treasury, the following amendment has been made in the Regulations for the Recruitment from University Graduates to the Executive Class (and Corresponding Departmental Classes) and the Information Officer Class of the Home Civil Service and to Grade 5 Posts in Branch B of the Foreign Service dated the 20th September, 1949, and published in the London Gazette of the same date, viz. :—

Regulation 10 amended to read "A fee of 15s. is payable by all candidates. This must be sent in with the application form and is not returnable in any circumstances."

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice, under Clause 13 of the General Regulations respecting appointment to His Majesty's Civil Establishments under the Order in Council of 22nd July, 1920, that where fees are not prescribed by separate notice or in regulations published in the "London Gazette", they have prescribed, with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of the Treasury, the following scale of fees to be paid by candidates, with effect from 21st October, 1949.

In the case of competitions for which fees are not prescribed by separate notice or in regulations published in the "London Gazette", this revised scale of fees will apply only if the competition is announced on or after 21st October, 1949.

The notice respecting payment of fees published in the issue of the "London Gazette" of the 7th May, 1948, as amended by notice in the issue of the "London Gazette" of the 29th October, 1948, is hereby cancelled.

The notice published in the issue of the "London Gazette" of the 6th September, 1946, in so far as it affected fees for particular situations or classes of situations previously notified in the "London Gazette" is also hereby cancelled, and such fees will be revised in accordance with the scale prescribed in Appendix A below unless notification of a revised fee for the situation or class of situations has been made by notice in the "London Gazette" since the 6th September, 1946. Fees for particular situations or classes of situations notified in the "London Gazette" since the 6th September, 1946, will be revised in accordance with the scale prescribed in Appendix B below. The provisions of this paragraph will apply until a new fee for the particular situation or class of situations is prescribed by notice in the "London Gazette".

(1) The amount of the annual salary attainable, within the meaning of this notice, will be determined by the Civil Service Commissioners and the Head of the Department; subject to reference, in doubtful cases, to the Lords Commissioners of the Treasury.

(2) When a person holding a situation in any Department is presented to the Civil Service Commissioners with a view to his appointment to some other situation in the same department, he will not be required to pay any further fee, unless he is required to undergo a further test in regard to knowledge and ability and, in that case, he will not be required to pay any greater fee than the difference between the fee which is leviable in respect of his new appointment and the fee which, according to the above scale, is appropriate to the situation which he already holds; in the case of a situation filled by a limited competition no reduction will be made if

the fee leviable in respect of the new appointment is 5s. or less. This provision will not apply in the case of a situation filled by open competition, whether by written examination or interview.

(3) Persons holding established situations in Public Departments, who are presented for Certificates of Qualification, on being transferred to another Department will be exempt from the payment of a fee in respect of the issue of such Certificates of Qualification, unless they are required to undergo further test in regard to knowledge and ability.

(4) Candidates for unestablished situations will not be required to pay more than half of the fees prescribed by the above scale, provided that the fee shall in no case be less than two shillings and sixpence. If subsequently presented for established situations in the same Department they will be required to pay a further fee completing the amount payable according to the above scale for the established post. Persons who have served in one unestablished situation after paying the prescribed fee will not be required to pay any further fee on examination for another unestablished situation of the same character.
