#### Civil Service Commission. 22nd November, 1949.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of H.M. Treasury, viz.:—

RECRUITMENT UNDER NORMAL REGULATIONS TO THE PATENT EXAMINER CLASS IN THE BOARD OF TRADE (PATENT OFFICE) AND THE ADMIRALTY AND PATENT OFFICER CLASS (MINISTRY OF SUPPLY).

1. Age.—Candidates must be at least 20 and under 25 years of age on 1st August, 1949. But—

(a) a candidate who has served or is serving on a regular (including a regular short-service) engagement in H.M. Forces may deduct the period of such service from his actual age;

(b) a candidate who has served or is serving voluntarily in H.M. Forces otherwise than on a regular or short-service engagement, or who has performed or is performing compulsory national service under the National Service Acts, may deduct the period of such service from his actual age, up to a maximum of two years;

(c) candidates who have served in any established post to which they were admitted with the Certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners, or who have served on established conditions except for sick leave and pension in a post to which such a certificate would normally apply, may deduct

from their actual age any time not exceeding two years which they have spent in such service before 1st August, 1949.

2. Sex and Marriage.—(i) Both men and women may compete under these Regulations.

(ii) Married women who have formerly been established Civil Servants and have drawn marriage gratuity (other than those who are widows or divorced, or who are separated from their husbands, or whose husbands suffer without hope of recovery from total physical or mental incapacity) will not be eligible unless they undertake to refund on appointment the marriage gratuity paid.

3. Nationality.—Candidates must be British subjects. They must also satisfy one of the following conditions:—

(a) If natural-born British subjects, they must either:

(i) have at least one parent who is or was at death a British subject; or

(ii) have resided in His Majesty's Dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(b) if naturalised British subjects, they must have resided in His Majesty's Dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(c) if not qualified under (a) or (b) of this paragraph they must satisfy the Commissioners that they are so closely connected with His Majesty's Dominions either by ancestry, upbringing or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in their favour.

Provided that a candidate will not be eligible for an appointment under the Ministry of Supply or the Admiralty unless he or she is a natural-born British subject and born within the United Kingdom or in one of the self-governing Dominions of parents also born within the United Kingdom or in one of the self-governing Dominions, except when the circumstances are such as to justify a departure from the general rule, in which case, provided the candidate satisfies the conditions prescribed by the preceding paragraphs, he or she may be admitted to appointment or competition by special permission of the Minister of Supply or the First Lord of the Admiralty, as the case may be.

4. Qualifications.—Each candidate must possess an honours degree in Physics, Chemistry, Electrical Engineering or Mechanical Engineering or an equivalent qualification.

A reading knowledge of one or more foreign languages will be an additional qualification.

5. Health and Character.—Successful candidates must satisfy the Commissioners as to their health and character.

6. Competition.—Those candidates who appear from their application forms to be eligible and to have the highest qualifications for appointment will be interviewed by a Selection Board, nominated by the Commissioners, on which the Board of Trade will be represented. The Selection Board will have before them the particulars of the candidates' careers and qualifications, and the reports of persons named by the candidates as having direct knowledge of their work and capabilities. The Selection Board will recommend to the Commissioners, in order of merit, those candidates whom they judge to be fitted for appointment. There will be four separate orders of merit, for chemists, physicists, electrical engineers and mechanical engineers. The candidates so selected will be summoned to an examination in English, and those who qualify in this examination will be offered appointments, in order of merit in which they were placed by the Selection Board, up to the number of vacancies available, and subject to their satisfying the Commissioners that they are eligible in all respects.

7. Candidates trained as Teachers.—Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate central education authority (e.g., the Ministry of Education, the Scottish Education Department, the Ministry of Education for Northern Ireland) has been notified to the Commissioners.
